SYNOPSIS:

While conducting an investigation related to the arrest of Robert Smith () for commercial burglary, vandalism and possession of dangerous narcotics, Deputy D. Faiivae #0524 was exposed to a substance suspected to be Fentanyl. Deputy Faiivae lost consciousness and sustained an injury to his head during a fall. Deputy Faiivae was transported to Palomar Medical Center by paramedics from the San Marcos Fire Department and was treated for a head injury and possible Fentanyl (opioid) exposure.

Once transported, the scene was frozen pending a crime scene investigation by the San Marcos Street Narcotics and Gang unit.

ORIGIN:

On 7/3/2021, at approximately 1644 hours, while working patrol in the city of San Marcos, I responded to a call of "code cover" to assist Deputies S. Crane #0251 and D. Faiivae #0524 in the back parking lot of the San Marcos Mortuary at 435 N. Twin Oaks Valley Road. I responded from the San Marcos Station with lights and sirens, Event #E7224822.

BACKGROUND (given by Deputy S. Crane):

At approximately 1505 hours, Deputies S. Crane and D. Faiivae responded to a report of a trespass at the San Marcos Mortuary at 435 N. Twin Oaks Valley Road. Upon arrival, they contacted Robert Smith near a red Jeep Wrangler (CA/ Smith was ultimately arrested for possession of dangerous narcotics and vandalism. Smith was transported to Palomar Medical Center by San Marcos Fire Department paramedics for what appeared to be a seizure. Deputies Crane and Faiivae searched Smith's vehicle, incident to arrest, and located a plastic bag containing what appeared to be narcotics.

INVESTIGATION:

I arrived at approximately 1646 hours and located Deputies Crane, Faiivae and K. Nickey #3746. Deputies Crane and Nickey were administering first aid to Deputy Faiivae. Deputy Faiivae was in the recovery position on his left side, and Deputies Crane and Nickey had already administered two doses of the station issued 4mg Naloxone. Deputy Crane told me Deputy Faiivae had been exposed to Fentanyl and had fallen and hit his head. Deputy Faiivae was semi-conscious, and Deputy Nickey subsequently administered two additional doses of Naloxone.

At approximately 1651 hours, ambulance RA141 from the San Marcos Fire Department arrived to take over treatment of Deputy Faiivae. Paramedics transported Deputy Faiivae to Palomar Medical Center with Deputy Crane riding with them.

Prior to leaving the scene, I took Deputy Crane's statement:

Statement of Deputy S. Crane:

Deputy Crane told me that he and Deputy Faiivae had arrested Smith earlier, and after having what was described as a seizure, Smith was transported to the hospital. Deputy Crane and Faiivae searched Smith's Jeep and located a plastic bag with what they suspected was illicit narcotics. Deputy Faiivae removed the material from the jeep and brought it to the trunk of their patrol vehicle (20630) and called for a TruNarc device for testing. While testing the material, Deputy Faiivae suddenly stiffened up, fell backwards and hit his head on the asphalt. Deputy Faiivae lost consciousness.

INVESTIGATION (cont):

Deputy Crane pointed out the bag of what he suspected was Fentanyl in the trunk of his vehicle. The bag was exposed to open air near all deputies who responded, so I shut the rear hatch in order to minimize any potential exposure.

Sgt.'s C. Hydar #4735 and I. White #7560 responded to the scene and requested we cordon off the immediate area for the preservation of evidence and security of Deputy Faiivae's department issued and personal equipment including his duty weapons.

Rosenthal #2236 and California State San Marcos Officer L. Sanchez #546 While awaiting additional information, a female, later identified as approached the scene on foot. We initially told her to stay away from the scene, but, assuming she was a likely companion of Smith's, Deputy Tesar and I later contacted her across the street at an apartment complex at 452 N. Twin Oaks Valley Road. admitted to being Smith's companion and stated she still had some property inside of the Jeep. I asked to volunarily walk back to the scene with us. agreed and Deputy Tesar and I had her sit in a shady spot in the back of the mortuary, unhandcuffed. Deputy Tesar ran her information through Sheriff's Inquiry and learned that she was on probation with two fourth amendment waivers. I explained to that a deputy sustained an injury as a result of exposure to what we believed to be Fentanyl. Statement of said she told Smith not to mess around with the "Feni". parking lot for a couple of hours, and he was playing with his BB gun by shooting at random things. said she knew there was Fentanyl in the vehicle. ..., herself, has used methamphetamine and heroin in the past and was recently arrested for possession for sale of methamphetamine. Deputy Tesar photographed , and she was later released from the scene. I later placed the photos on a CD and submitted them into evidence at the San Marcos station. Detectives I and arrived at the scene to assume control, and I left at approximately 1913 hours. The duration of my time on scene was captured on my bodyworn camera. **EVIDENCE**: (1) CD with field interview photos INJURIES: Deputy hospitalization (extent of injuries yet to be determined) FOLLOW-UP: None.

Case Synopsis:

On 7-3-21, at approximately 1500 hours, suspect Robert Raymond Smith was contacted by Deputies Faiivae #0524, Crane #0251 and Galvan #6832 following a report of vandalism at Allen Brothers Mortuary located at 435 N Twin Oaks Valley Road, in the City of San Marcos. After conducting their initial investigation, Deputies arrested Smith for felony vandalism and being under the influence of a controlled substance. After being notified he was being placed under arrest, Smith exhibited seizure like symptoms and was transported to Palomar Medical Center by San Marcos Fire Department Paramedics for medical evaluation. It was subsequently determined Smith had also attempted to burglarize the Mortuary. During a search of Smith's vehicle Deputies located three baggies containing a powdery substance. Deputies utilized the TruNarc device to test the contents of the bags in the field. One bag tested presumptive positive for methamphetamine and the other two tested presumptive positive for Fentanyl.

During the testing process Deputy Faiivae #0524 became exposed to the substances and lost consciousness causing him to fall to the ground and hit his head. Deputy Faiivae exhibited signs and symptoms consistent with a drug related overdose as a result of the exposure and was in medical distress. Deputies on scene administered four doses of Naloxone and requested medical aid. San Marcos Fire Department Paramedics arrived on scene and initiated life-saving measures. Paramedics transported Deputy Faiivae to Palomar Medical Center where he received additional medical treatment and was in stable condition.

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Myself along with other San Marcos Street Narcotics and Gang Team (SNGT) Detectives responded, processed the scene and conducted follow up interviews. San Diego County HazMat responded and decontaminated the affected areas. Both the suspect vehicle and the affected patrol vehicle #20630 were towed from the scene.

Smith was medically cleared and ultimately booked into Vista Detention Facility for 594(b)(1) PC - VANDALISM (\$400 OR MORE), 11550(a) H&S - USE/UNDER INFL OF CONTROLLED SUBS, 11377(a) H&S - POSSESS CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, 11350(a) H&S - POSS NARCOTIC CONTROLLED SUBS, 11364 HS - POSS CONTROLLED SUBS PARAPHERNALIA, and 459 PC - BURGLARY.

Two case reports were generated to document the entirety of this incident (SDSO #21128570 and 21128566) including related Deputy Reports.

Case Investigation:

On 7-3-21, at approximately 1700 hours, I was notified of a suspected Fentanyl related exposure involving Deputy Faiivae. Myself and other San Marcos Street Narcotics and Gang Team (SNGT) Detectives responded to the scene at Allen Brothers Mortuary located at 435 N Twin Oaks Valley Road, in the City of San Marcos. Upon arrival I saw the scene had been marked off with Sheriff's crime scene tape. Inside the scene I observed a red 2006 Jeep Wrangler (LP //CA) parked in the northeast corner of the parking lot. The vehicle was backed in to a parking space near a large hole cut in the nearby chainlink fence and bolt cutters were hanging from the fence. There was also a large pile of miscellaneous items lying on the ground outside the vehicle. I also observed Sheriff's patrol vehicle #20630 parked in the parking lot facing the Jeep. All doors to the vehicle were closed. Lying on the ground near the vehicle was a pile of equipment I recognized as a soft body amor vest, a law enforcement duty belt and rescue sled. I also observed four Pelican cases with expended Naloxone applicators and packaging. I took multiple photos to document the scene.

I was briefed by Deputies Nickey #3746 and Hendricks #5117 that Deputy Faiivae had been conducting an investigation at the location related to vandalism and burglary. The suspect (Robert Raymond Smith) had been placed under arrest and transported to Palomar Medical Center after exhibiting seizure like symptoms. Deputy Faiivae had located suspected narcotics in the suspect vehicle (which was identified as the red Jeep). Deputy Faiivae tested the narcotics in the back cargo area of his patrol vehicle (which was identified as vehicle #20630) using the TruNarc device. The substance tested presumptive positive for Fentanyl. During the testing Deputy Faiivae experienced medical distress which was believed to have been caused by exposure to the Fentanyl. Deputy Crane administered two doses of department issued Naloxone and requested code cover. Deputy Nickey responded to the scene and administered an additional two doses of department issued Naloxone. Deputy Faiivae was transported to Palomar Medical Center for medical treatment by San Marcos Fire Department Paramedics. The back of the patrol vehicle (containing the narcotics) had been closed by responding Deputies in an effort to limit the

potential for any further exposure. The scene had been taped off and frozen pending our arrival on scene. Deputy Nickey notified me a female subject identified as I had approached the scene after Deputy Faiivae had been transported. notified the Deputies she had been with the suspect (Robert Raymond Smith) prior to the incident and had personal belongings inside the Jeep. was seated on a bench near the entrance to the mortuary with Deputy Tesar #6444. who provided me with the following statement which I recorded using my department issued handheld digital recorder. Statement of stated she had known Robert Smith for several years. Smith had picked her up during the early morning hours of 7-3-21. At approximately 1400 hours, Smith drove to the mortuary and parked in the back of the parking lot. Smith was acting odd and they sat in the parking lot for what she believed to be several hours. While at the location Smith was either sitting in the Jeep, sitting against the nearby garage, lying on the ground yelling, or shooting his BB gun at the nearby trees. While in the vehicle, ■ noticed a plastic bag sitting in the center console. The bag contained a fine white powder. not know what the substance was and had jokingly asked Smith if it was baby powder. Smith did not or tell her what the substance was. Smith had overheard Deputies talking about Fentanyl on scene and believed that was likely what the powder was. did not use Fentanyl and did not know if Smith did either. did not know why Smith had brought her to the mortuary, did not see Smith approach the building other than to lean against the garage, did not see him cut a hole in the fence, and did not see him use any drugs. At approximately 1500 hours, eventually convinced Smith they needed to leave the location with the intent to go to the mall or a casino. However, the battery to the Jeep was dead. and began walking around the nearby apartments and businesses along Twin Oaks Valley Road trying to find assistance from someone with jumper cables. found one person who said they could help and followed her back to the Jeep. When she got back to the Jeep, Smith was in the process of pulling all of the contents out of the vehicle and said he was looking for jumper cables. The person who said they were going to assist then said they didn't have cables and left the area. believed she was gone for about an hour to an hour and a half before returning and encountering law enforcement on scene. did not know if Smith cut the fence or approached the mortuary while she was gone. The only items in the vehicle which belonged to included her clothes, hygiene products, shoes and said she did not have any narcotics or other illegal items in the Jeep. Investigation (Continued):

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Lieutenant Twyman #2561 arrived on scene. I was notified Deputy Faiivae's condition at the hospital had stabilized and Sheriff's Division of Inspectional Services (DIS) did not need us to hold the scene for any further investigation from their unit.

I ensured all of contact information was collected and she left the scene.

The County Hazardous Materials unit (HazMat) was notified and requested to respond to the scene to render the vehicles and area safe prior to any further processing.

I observed there were security cameras on the exterior of the mortuary which I believed may have captured footage related to the incident. Attempts were made to contact the reporting party (Kenneth Radford) to review and collect the video as evidence. However, no answer was received at the phone number provided and the voicemail was not set up.

I responded to Palomar Medical Center while the remaining SNGT Detectives remained on scene to coordinate with HazMat and process the scene.

I arrived at the hospital and contacted Deputy Galvan who was guarding Smith while he was being medically evaluated. Deputy Galvan provided me with the following statement.

Statement of Deputy Galvan:

Deputy Galvan had arrived on scene to act as a cover Deputy for Deputy Faiivae. Deputy Galvan had been present while Deputy Faiivae conducted his investigation and subsequently placed Smith under arrest for vandalism and being under the influence of a controlled substance. Upon being notified he was being placed under arrest, Smith began to exhibit seizure like symptoms and San Marcos Fire Department Paramedics responded to the scene. While Smith was being evaluated Deputy Galvan saw Deputy Faiivae discover three plastic bags containing a white powder which he believed to be either Fentanyl and/or methamphetamine from inside the Jeep. Deputy Galvan told Deputy Faiivae to stop manipulating the bags and requested the TruNarc device be brought to the location to test the substance. It was determined Smith would need to be transported by Paramedics to Palomar Medical Center for further medical evaluation. Deputy Galvan left the scene and followed the Paramedics to the hospital.

Deputies Faiivae and Crane remained on scene to complete the investigation. Deputy Crane later called Deputy Galvan and notified him the substance in one bag tested presumptive positive for methamphetamine and the other two bags tested presumptive positive for Fentanyl. Deputy Crane also notified Deputy Galvan additional evidence had been discovered indicating Smith had attempted to burglarize the mortuary so he was going to additionally be charged with burglary and possession of

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narcotics. A short time later, Deputy Galvan heard Deputy Crane's radio traffic requesting "Code cover" and medical aid at the location for Deputy Faiivae.

Investigation (Continued):

I spoke with Deputy Crane who was nearby checking on the welfare of Deputy Faiivae. Deputy Crane provided me with the following statement.

Statement of Deputy Crane:

Deputy Crane was acting as Deputy Faiivae's Shadow Phase Field Training Officer while Deputy Faiivae was conducting his investigation. The two were riding together in unit #20630. Deputy Crane observed Deputy Faiivae during the course of his investigation. Upon arrival on scene Deputy Crane saw Smith sitting against the tire of his Jeep and was clearly "on the nod" and under the influence of a controlled substance. Through the course of the investigation Deputy Faiivae determined Smith was under the influence of a controlled substance, had vandalized a fence belonging to the mortuary and placed Smith under arrest. Upon learning he was going to be arrested Smith began to exhibit seizure like symptoms and medical aid was requested. While Smith was being evaluated by San Marcos Fire Department Paramedics, Deputy Faiivae continued his investigation and located suspected narcotics in the Jeep. It was determined Smith would need to be transported to the hospital for further evaluation so Deputy Galvan left the scene to accompany Smith, while Deputies Crane and Faiivae remained on scene to complete the investigation.

The reporting party (Kenneth Radford) arrived on scene and it was determined Smith had attempted to burglarize the mortuary. Deputy Crane notified Deputy Galvan of the additional charges. Deputy Tesar arrived on scene with the TruNarc device as requested by Deputy Galvan. Deputy Faiivae decided to test the narcotics he had located using the TruNarc device and took it to the back storage area of the patrol vehicle. Deputy Faiivae tested each of the three bags using the TruNarc on top of the upper metal deck in the back of the patrol vehicle. Deputy Faiivae was wearing one pair of black nitrile gloves and the safety glasses recommended for use when using the TruNarc device. Neither Deputy Faiivae nor Deputy Crane had an N95 mask with them or were wearing any sort of mask. The first two bags tested presumptive positive for Fentanyl and the last bag (which was a small plastic bindle) tested presumptive positive for methamphetmine. Deputy Crane assisted by taking photos of the TruNarc results. During this process, Deputy Crane also discussed the dangers of Fentanyl with Deputy Faiivae and placed a department issued Pelican case containing two doses of Naloxone on the metal deck.

Once the results came back as positive for Fentanyl, Deputy Faiivae placed the bags into a plastic bag and was going to place them into a second bag for more protection. Deputy Faiivae placed the bag containing narcotics on the bottom storage area below the upper deck and retrieved a second plastic bag from his evidence collection kit. During this process Deputy Faiivae bent down and his face was close to the upper deck area where he had previously been testing the narcotics. Deputy Faiivae stood up,

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stumbled backward and fell down on the ground. Deputy Crane immediately retrieved the Naloxone and requested "Code Cover" for assistance. Deputy Crane administered one dose of Naloxone to each nostril, unbuttoned Deputy Faiivae's shirt and removed his soft body armor vest to allow him to breath more freely. Deputy Faiivae was unresponsive, sweating profusely, his eyes were rolled back in his head and he appeared to be seizing.

Deputy Nickey arrived on scene and administered another dose of Naloxone. Deputy Faiivae began dry heaving so he was placed in the recovery position on his side. Deputy Crane held Deputy Faiivae while waiting for medical personnel to arrive on scene and placed rescue sleds under his head. Deputy Faiivae briefly regained consciousness but then began to seize again. Deputy Crane administered one additional dose of Naloxone. San Marcos Fire Department Paramedics arrived on scene and continued life saving efforts. Deputy Faiivae was transported to Palomar Medical Center and Deputy Crane rode with them.

Investigation (Continued):

Deputy Galvan and I entered the room where Smith was being treated. Deputy Galvan activated his body worn camera and I activated by department issued handheld digital recorder. Smith was asleep and snoring and was difficult to wake up. I called out to him several times and had to shake him on the shoulder to rouse him from his sleep. I read Smith his Miranada rights directly from my Deputies notebook. While reading his rights Smith appeared to fall back to sleep as he appeared to be heavily under the influence of one or more controlled substances. I called out to Smith and woke him back up. I asked Smith if he heard and understood his rights and he responded "Sure". I offered to reread his rights but he indicated he understood his rights again stating "Sure do" which I interpreted as an affirmative response. When asked if he was willing to speak with me about the case, Smith shook his head up and down which I interpreted as an affirmative response. Smith provided me with the following statement:

Statement of Robert Smith:

When asked about the powder found in his vehicle Smith stated he didn't know what it was. When asked if it was possibly Fentanyl Smith stated "no". Smith stated the Jeep was his dad's but his dad was dead and had left him the Jeep. Smith then decline to answer any additional questions without a lawyer. Due to the potentially life threatening implications to Deputy Faiivae, I believed there was an exigency to try to learn if there was anything besides Fentanyl in the powder found in the vehicle so I asked Smith again what was in the powder. Smith stated he didn't think there was any Fentanyl in there and it possibly contained bath salts.

Investigation (Continued):

While speaking with Smith I noted he had a cellular phone sitting on his lap. Deputy Galvan notified me it had likely not been removed from Smith when he was transported. Deputy Galvan seized the phone, turned it over to me and I retained custody of the phone. The phone was later placed into a locked

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Farady Box at the San Marcos Patrol Station and will remain there pending a search warrant for its contents related to the burglary.

I went to Deputy Faiivae's room and asked if he felt well enough to provide me with a statement and he indicated he did. Deputy Faiivae provided me with the following statement.

Statement of Deputy Faiivae:

While conducting his investigation, Deputy Faiivae had located two plastic bags and a small plastic bindle containing a white powdery substance in Smith's Jeep. Deputy Faiivae had also located some unknown blue and yellow pills and a glass methamphetamien pipe. In order to expedite the investigation, Deputy Faiivae decided to test the substances in the field using the TruNarc device. Deputy Faiivae tested the substances in the back of his patrol vehicle on the upper deck in the storage area. Deputy Faiivae was wearing the recommended safety glasses for use with the TruNarc and black nitrile gloves, but no mask. Deputy Crane was standing nearby while he conducted the tests. The first two bags tested presumptive positive for Fentanyl and the bindle tested presumptive positive for methamphetamine. During the testing, Deputy Faiivae pressed the TruNarc device against the surface of the bags containing the substances in order to get a good reading. The bindle was partially opened and some particles of the substance spilled out of the bindle and onto the upper deck when Deputy Faiivae tested it. Deputy Faiivae swept the particles back into the bindle and placed all of the bags into an evidence bag. Deputy Faiivae was unsure if either of the bags containing the Fentanyl were open or not during the testing.

Once the results came back positive for Fentanyl Deputy Crane told him they needed to double bag the items for safety. Deputy Faiivae reached down below the upper deck to retrieve a second bag from his evidence kit and in doing so placed his face approximately six inches from where he had been testing the substances. Deputy Crane told him not to get so close and when he stood up he began to feel light headed and fell down. The next thing Deputy Faiivae remembered was seeing Deputy Nickey, and someone administering Naloxone up his nostril, and being loaded into an ambulance. Deputy Faiivae stated Smith had denied being high or having any drugs in his vehicle.

Investigation (Continued):

I left the hospital and returned to the scene with Deputy Crane.

The SNGT Detectives on scene notified me HazMat had completed their decontamination process. The patrol vehicle was emptied of its contents and towed to San Diego Sheriff's Department Property and Evidence. The Jeep was towed by Western Towing.

The bag containing the narcotics was located, photographed and seized as evidence. Due to the totality of the situation and the known presence of Fentanyl the bag was not reopened for weighing of the

substances. The bag was later triple sealed and submitted into evidence with a request for laboratory testing at the San Marcos Patrol Station as a part of the related crime report (SDSO Case #21128566).

The photos taken from the scene by SNGT were later transferred onto a CD along with the recorded interviews and placed into evidence at the San Marcos Patrol Station.

On 7-6-21 Narcotics Task Force Sergeant was notified of the HazMat call out.

I attempted to call the Allen Brothers Mortuary directly and was able to leave a message requesting a copy of any available security video footage related to the in incident. As of the time of submitting this report no call back had been received.

Origin:

On 7/3/21, at about 1444 hours, I responded to a Code 3 cover call at 435 N. Twin Oaks Valley Road, in the City of San Marcos.

Deputy's Observations and Actions:

Upon arrival, I found Deputy Crane #0251 holding Deputy Faiivae #0524 in the recovery position. Deputy Crane alerted me that Deputy Faiivae was apparently suffering from fentanyl exposure. I immediately retrieved my Naloxone from my vehicle and ran to assist Deputy Faiivae. Deputy Crane told me he had already administered two rounds of Naloxone. I saw that Deputy Faiivae's eyes were rolling into the back of his head and he was convulsing. I administered a 4mg dose of Naloxone into Deputy Faiivae's nasal cavity.

Deputy Faiivae remained conscious but was only semi responsive. About three to five minutes after delivering the third round of Naloxone, Deputy Faiivae closed his eyes and became non-responsive again. I delivered another 4mg dose of Naloxone and began rubbing Deputy Faiivae's arm to rouse him awake. Deputy Faiivae awoke and remained conscious until paramedics from the San Marcos Fire Department arrived on scene and took over treatment.

After Deputy Faiivae was transported to the hospital, I used crime scene tape to tape off the surrounding area and maintained a perimeter position. At 1901 hours, I was relieved of my position by Deputy Plocki #3271.

I had no further involvement in this incident.

ORIGIN:

On 07/03/21, at about 1505 hours, Deputy Crane, Deputy Galvan, and Deputy Faiivae were dispatched to investigate a vandalism at 435 N Twin Oaks Valley Road, in the City of San Marcos. A suspect was arrested but was taken to Palomar Hospital because he was experiencing seizures. The Fire Department transported the arrestee and Deputy Galvan trailed to sit with him at the hospital. Deputy Crane and Deputy Faiivae remained on scene. At about 1644 hours Deputy Crane requested a code cover and additional Narcan for Deputy Faiivae at the same location.

DEPUTY OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I was aware of the details of previously mentioned call and that Deputy Crane and Deputy Faiivae were testing possible controlled substances using the TruNarc device. I was driving my patrol vehicle near Rancheros Drive and Santar place when I heard Deputy Crane's radio traffic. I responded code three to Deputy Crane's location and arrived on scene just after Deputy Nickey. Upon arrival, I grabbed my station issued Narcan and ran over to where Deputy Crane, Deputy Faiivae, and Deputy Nickey were. I observed Deputy Faiivae was laying on his side as Deputy Crane was holding him. Deputy Nickey administered a dose of Narcan that he had brought, and I set mine down on the ground near everyone. I began assisting by removing Deputy Faiivae's duty belt so that he could breathe better. I placed all the gear I took from Deputy Faiivae by his patrol vehicle, which was about 10-15 away from us. At one point, Deputy Faiivae began to experience symptoms of Fentanyl exposure again. Deputy Nickey and I both opened a pack of Narcan and Deputy Nickey administered his; I held my opened Narcan incase Deputy Faiivae needed a fifth dose. All deputies remained with Deputy Faiivae until San Marcos Fire Department arrived and took over medical care. I placed my opened, but unused, Narcan among the pile of Narcan containers that were left on the ground.

I remained on scene and assisted Deputy Nickey and Deputy Hendricks with securing the crime scene. While guarding the crime scene, a female walked into the parking lot before turning around and walking away. Sometime later, Deputy Hendricks and I observed the same female just outside the parking lot. Deputy Hendricks and I followed her and eventually made contact across the street in the nearby apartment complex. The female was identified as agreed to talk to us back over at 435 N Twin Oaks Valley Road.
