# This is a confidential document. PHI KAPPA PSI FRATERNITY: NOTICE OF INTERIM SUSPENSION.

The University is investigating recent reports of:

Allegations of Alcohol and Healthy and Safety policy violations within Phi Kappa Psi Fraternity at San Diego State University.

It has been reported that Phi Kappa Psi has participated in behavior necessitating the University to take immediate action for the safety of members and the campus community. Reportedly, Phi Kappa Psi hosted a social event on August 26, 2019 that resulted in a transport of a student following the event.

Given the seriousness of the matter, I am placing Phi Kappa Psi on immediate interim suspension pending the outcome of a University investigation. Once information is available from this investigation, the Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership will make a recommendation to me regarding the continued campus recognition status for Phi Kappa Psi. The interim suspension is in effect immediately with an outcome or update of the investigation to be given on or around Friday, September 27, 2019.

While on Interim Suspension, the chapter is expected to cease all social activities, and any other activity with alcohol, including events between active members and alumni where alumni are consuming alcohol. The chapter may participate in alcohol and other drug-free events that are chapter management, wellness, brotherhood, philanthropic, and leadership in nature.

During the interim suspension, all chapter-related activities must be completely **alcohol and drug free**. Any violation will result in more severe sanctions. No chapter members may host or participate in any chapter-related function where alcoholic beverages are present, regardless of location:

All members of Phi Kappa Psi will be expected to fully cooperate with the investigation and review process. Be advised that providing false or misleading information, concealing information, instructing others to provide false information or conceal information, attempting to obstruct the investigation, or attempting to threaten or intimidate witnesses or others involved in the investigation will result in judicial referral of all students involved and possible sanctions on the organization.

The University is investigating recent reports of:

Allegations of Alcohol and Healthy and Safety policy violations within Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity at San Diego State University.

It has been reported that Sigma Alpha Epsilon has participated in behavior necessitating the University to take immediate action for the safety of members and the campus community. Reportedly, Sigma Alpha Epsilon hosted a social event on October 2, 2019 that resulted in a transport of a student following the event.

Given the seriousness of the matter, I am placing Sigma Alpha Epsilon on immediate interim suspension pending the outcome of a University investigation. Once information is available from this investigation, the Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership will make a recommendation to me regarding the continued campus recognition status for Sigma Alpha Epsilon. The interim suspension is in effect immediately with an outcome or update of the investigation to be given on or around Friday, November 22, 2019.

While on Interim Suspension, the chapter is expected to cease all social activities, and any other activity with alcohol, including events between active members and alumni where alumni are consuming alcohol. The chapter may participate in alcohol and other drug-free events that are chapter management, wellness, brotherhood, philanthropic, and leadership in nature.

During the interim suspension, all chapter-related activities must be completely **alcohol and drug free**. Any violation will result in more severe sanctions. No chapter members may host or participate in any chapter-related function where alcoholic beverages are present, regardless of location.

All members of Sigma Alpha Epsilon will be expected to fully cooperate with the investigation and review process. Be advised that providing false or misleading information, concealing information, instructing others to provide false information or conceal information, attempting to obstruct the investigation, or attempting to threaten or intimidate witnesses or others involved in the investigation will result in judicial referral of all students involved and possible sanctions on the organization.







During the course of the Interim Suspension, the San Diego State University chapter may have no communication with new members. 

Technically, yes. Per our bylaws, only our New Member educator is allowed to run formal meetings with our new members. However, of course there will be active brothers engaging with our new members throughout the duration of their process to ultimately have all active brothers personally know all new members. This is to assure our brotherhood is becoming stronger and this practice is shared across all Greek new member processes. I feel I am unable to provide an accurate response to this question - as I do not understand exactly what you are asking of me. There is simply no way for me to account for all informal meetings with our new members in the past 14 months (3 semesters). For example, our active brothers and new members, prior to our suspension, were consistently grabbing lunch, going to the beach, hanging out around campus, doing homework together, watching sports on the weekend, and any other activities to become closer with one another. As a fraternity, we do not document such events. Granted, we do have new members attend informational events scattered around the semester(ie. drug and alcohol awareness, RSO New Member Symposium information, etc.) in which I have provided in my calendar overview of the past 14 months. Additionally, there are social events and brotherhood(big/little, camping, etc.) events scattered throughout the semester that we encourage both our active and new members to attend.



No member of Pi Kappa Alpha may retaliate towards, threaten, or intimidate anyone perceived to be participating in the investigation, including perceived reporting parties.



Thank you for meeting with me on Friday, August 30, 2019. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a social event that reportedly occurred on August 28, 2018 and a report that outlined that a guest of the event was drugged at the social. The reports resulted in alleged violations of the Alcohol, Health and Safety, and Illegal Drugs policies.

### Review and Discussion of the Incident and Alleged Policy Violations

During the Informal Conference, a review of the initial incident reports occurred, along with information found during the course of the investigation. The specific alleged policy violations were discussed in detail: Alcohol, Health and Safety, and Illegal Drugs.

During the Informal Conference, the group reviewed an allegation posted on Twitter. Reportedly, the fraternity hosted an event in August 2018 where a member of the campus community was present and drugged.

The group discussed the initial report, along with themes derived from the investigative interviews and information presented by the fraternity. One set of information discussed during the informal conference were screenshots of text messages that were provided to the University by the fraternity. The messages outline communication shared between a member of the organization and the reporting party. The text messages demonstrate that a party occurred and that it was "rolled" (shut down by the police).

Although members of the fraternity acknowledged that the party occurred, there was discussion around whether or not the social event was related to Pi Kappa Alpha. During the Informal Conference, Pi Kappa Alpha, the Interfraternity Council and Fraternity & Sorority Life staff engaged in dialogue around elements that constitute an organization-related event. Specifically, the reasonable observer standard was discussed. The group reviewed

that the event was perceived and reported to be hosted by Pi Kappa Alpha. The group also discussed that there were numerous Pi Kappa Alpha members said to be present (reported by the fraternity as 20, possibly more). The group discussed that the event was not approved by the organization's advisor, did not use organization funds, and was not held in the chapter facility.

Members of Pi Kappa Alpha also outlined that members of other fraternities live in the house. Matthew Garcia and I stated the issue would also be discussed with those organizations if the organizations' identities were known. The fraternity did not disclose additional names of organizations.

#### Decision

Based on the preponderance of the evidence gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews, and discussion during the informal conference, I have found Pi Kappa Alpha to be in violation of the Alcohol policy.

b(2) Alcohol. Violation of applicable law or University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic beverages while on or off campus.

The preponderance of the evidence was not established to hold Pi Kappa Alpha responsible for the alleged violations of the Health and Safety and Illegal Drugs policies. Therefore, I have found Pi Kappa Alpha not responsible for the alleged Health and Safety and Illegal Drugs policy violations.

As a result of the Alcohol policy violation. Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity is sanctioned to **Probation** through **December 2019**.

Any further violations of University policy during the term of the Probation may result in an immediate Interim Suspension of the fraternity and could result in the removal of campus recognition. In addition to the Probation, Pi Kappa Alpha must complete the following stipulations:

### Chapter Education

Educational Workshops. Pi Kappa Alpha is expected to host educational workshops for members of the chapter. Specifically, the following workshops are stipulated for the term of the Probation and must have 90% chapter participation:

- · Fall 2019: Alcohol
- Fall 2019: Post-Probation Risk Management

Fraternity & Sorority Life can advise on presenters and workshop development. The presentations will be facilitated by trained, professional staff/volunteers of the University and/or Fraternity. Active members and Executive Board members may not facilitate the trainings.

It is expected that the chapter leadership will schedule a meeting with Matthew Garcia to review and advise on the workshops and identify presenters. Documentation of workshop completion must be sent to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff within 24-hours of the workshops. Documentation should be in Google Slides format and include photos, presenter information, the strengths of the workshops and the opportunities for growth. Additionally, attendance must be tracked using Presence.

### **Events and Activities**

Event Proposals and Risk Management Plans. During the term of the Probation, Pi Kappa Alpha must submit a proposal with detailed risk management plans for all events hosted or co-hosted by the chapter to Fraternity & Sorority Life. Despite location, the events must follow the University's approval process and timelines, and risk management plans must be submitted for all events. The risk management plan timeline should align with the University's tiered model for event permitting (submission 2 weeks, 4 weeks, 8 week, and 4 months in advance depending on the activity). The exception to the espoused timelines will be Fall 2019 recruitment events, which may be submitted by Sunday, September 15, 2019.

Events with Alcohol. During the term of the Probation, Pi Kappa Alpha may request to host one, on-campus event with alcohol that follows all University processes and procedures during the Fall 2019 term.

The purpose of hosting the structured event(s) with alcohol is to provide developmental opportunities for the chapter to intentionally plan and implement events. If the event application process is not followed or additional policies are violated, the privilege of hosting events with alcohol may be rescinded during the term of the Probation.

Outside of the outlined event with alcohol, the chapter may host dry socials that follow the event approval process outlined above.

Advisor Presence. During the term of the Probation, an advisor is expected to be present during the duration of all chapter events/meetings.

Failure to complete these sanctions may result in the interim suspension of Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity.

Please be advised that no member of Pi Kappa Alpha may retaliate towards, threaten, or intimidate anyone perceived to have participated in the investigation of incidents, including perceived reporting parties.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with me in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents will contribute to the success of Pi Kappa Alpha at San Diego State University.





The University is investigating recent reports of:

Allegations of Alcohol, Noise, Healthy and Safety, and Violation of Student Organization Conduct Procedures policy violations within Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity at San Diego State University.

It has been reported that Sigma Phi Epsilon has participated in behavior necessitating the University to take immediate action for the safety of members and the campus community. Reportedly, Sigma Phi Epsilon hosted a social event on August 24, 2019 (into the morning on August 25) that resulted in a transport of a student following the event. Additionally, it has been reported the fraternity hosted two events at the chapter facility that resulted in noise complaints and contact by the San Diego State University Police Department on August 18, 2019 and August 21, 2019. Each of the events reportedly occurred when Sigma Phi Epsilon was sanctioned to Suspension in Abeyance with Stipulations, which is an alleged violation of the fraternity's sanctions.

Given the seriousness of the matter, I am placing Sigma Phi Epsilon on **immediate interim suspension** pending the outcome of a University investigation. Once information is available from this investigation, the Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership will make a recommendation to me regarding the continued campus recognition status for Sigma Phi Epsilon. The interim suspension is in effect immediately with an outcome or update of the investigation to be given on or around Friday, September 27, 2019.

While on Interim Suspension, the chapter is expected to cease all activities. No chapter members may host or participate in any chapter-related function, regardless of location. The chapter may coordinate meetings, with prior permission from the Office of Student Life & Leadership, to communicate information with members. The first chapter meeting scheduled for Sunday, September 1, 2019 with Matt Dutcher, Regional Director for Sigma Phi Epsilon, is permitted. Matt Dutcher may also meet with individual chapter members and/or specific groups of members during his visit.

All members of Sigma Phi Epstlon will be expected to fully cooperate with the investigation and review process. Be advised that providing false or misleading information, concealing information, instructing others to provide false information or conceal information, attempting to obstruct the investigation, or attempting to threaten or intimidate

## This is a confidential document. DELTA UPSILON FRATERNITY: INVESTIGATION UPDATE

As noted in the notice of interim suspension letter sent on August 27, 2019, the University is investigating recent reports of:

Allegations of Alcohol, Noise, and Healthy and Safety policy violations within Delta Upsilon Fraternity at San Diego State University.

The length of time of the investigation has been lengthened due to additional concerns being shared through the investigation process.

Delta Upsilon continues on **interim suspension** pending the outcome of the University investigation. Once information is available from this investigation, I will make a recommendation to the Director of Student Life & Leadership regarding the continued campus recognition status for Delta Upsilon. The interim suspension continues to remain in effect with an outcome or update of the investigation to be given on or around Thursday, October 31, 2019.

While on Interim Suspension, the chapter is expected to cease all social activities, and any other activity with alcohol, including events between active members and alumni where alumni are consuming alcohol. The chapter may participate in alcohol and other drug-free events that are chapter management, wellness, brotherhood, philanthropic, and leadership in nature.

During the interim suspension, all chapter-related activities must be completely **alcohol and drug free**. Any violation will result in more severe sanctions. No chapter members may host or participate in any chapter-related function where alcoholic beverages are present, regardless of location.

All members of Delta Upsilon will be expected to fully cooperate with the investigation and review process. Be advised that providing false or misleading information, concealing information, instructing others to provide false information or conceal information, attempting to obstruct the investigation, or attempting to threaten or intimidate witnesses or others involved in the investigation will result in judicial referral of all students involved and possible sanctions on the organization.

#### **Additional Information**

You also asked about perceptions that the University takes hazing violations more seriously than sexual assault violations. While that perception may exist, the University is committed—as I am committed — to addressing all reports of violence, that includes hazing and sexual violence within the SDSU community.

As I outlined yesterday, the university must uphold the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) when engaging in individual student conduct. When instances of sexual misconduct are reported, the reports are most often regarding individual students, not organizations. Therefore, the individual names of both the person reporting and the person alleged are confidential.

Conversely, when hazing is reported to the University, the report often identities a specific or type of organization. As organizations are not covered by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, information related to the status of the organization may be shared.

Despite these different processes, the University is committed to addressing all acts of violence--including both hazing and sexual violence--within the campus community. Acts of sexual violence and hazing are antithetical to our values as an institution, and we work to support survivors and hold individuals and organizations accountable.

Thank you for inquiring about a moratorium. At this time, a moratorium has not been placed on fraternities by the University or any of the Fraternity & Sorority Life governing councils.

We never use that term to address conduct matters (sanctions are intended to be educational, not punitive) and we definitely don't "discipline" organizations prior to the conclusion of an investigation. I'm not sure if this merits a conversation with or not. However, my concern is that the view may be that the organizational rights are being violated by "disciplining" before the conclusion of the investigation (by assigning organizations interim suspension).

Pursuant to Article IV, Section 4(a) of *The Constitution and Bylaws of Theta Chi Inc.*, this letter serves as notice that Gamma Theta Chapter has been placed on probation by the Chief Executive Officer through June 4, 2020. While on probation, Gamma Theta Chapter shall conform to the following requirements:

- 1. The chapter will comply with the terms of the 180-day Order of Suspension issued by the Grand Chapter of Theta Chi Fraternity on November 22, 2019.
- 2. The chapter may complete a membership review and officer review to determine:
  - a. Which members might move forward with Gamma Theta Chapter
  - b. Which members might serve in officer positions with Gamma Theta Chapter
- 3. After any membership review, any members selected for continued membership will sign an affidavit indicating their support of the zero-tolerance hazing policy as laid out in Theta Chi Fraternity's Safety Standards Manual.
- 4. The chapter may be subject to a safety surcharge for staff hours and travel dedicated to assisting Gamma Theta Chapter during the period of probation

All of these requirements are tasked congruently to the Alumni Probation Committee. Members of the Alumni Probation Committee are accredited and approved alumni of Theta Chi Fraternity. They need not be a part of the Gamma Theta Chapter. That group of brothers will coordinate with the International Headquarters to ensure action(s) are taken to make Gamma Theta a stronger chapter within Theta Chi and at San Diego State University.

The Alumni Probation Committee shall consist of the following brothers:



While the chapter is on probation, the Alumni Probation Committee shall have the following responsibilities:

- Facilitate the successful completion of the terms of probation of Gamma Theta Chapter
- Provide guidance to Gamma Theta Chapter during its period of probation

- Assist Gamma Theta Chapter with the recruitment of members
- Assist Gamma Theta Chapter with the education and initiation of members

In completing its charge, the Alumni Probation Committee shall have the following powers:

- To interview all collegiate members of Gamma Theta Chapter
- To investigate any activities of Gamma Theta Chapter
- To suspend collegiate members of Gamma Theta Chapter
- To expel collegiate members of Gamma Theta Chapter by a three-fourths vote of the members of the Alumni Probation Committee
- To remove and replace any officers of Gamma Theta Chapter

Austin, the goal of probation is not to penalize or impede the chapter. Rather, we hope that this period is an opportunity for the chapter to learn from its previous mistakes and take a leadership role within both Theta Chi Fraternity and San Diego State University.

If you wish to appeal this probation to the International Standards Committee, you may file such a request no later than January 3, 2020. No appeal will be considered after that date. Any appeal must be signed, dated and emailed to the International Headquarters at appeals@thetachi.org.





The University is investigating recent reports of:

Allegations of Alcohol, Dishonesty, Harassment and Abusive Behavior, Hazing, and Healthy and Safety policy violations within Theta Chi Fraternity at San Diego State University.

Theta Chi received a Notice of Investigation on Friday, October 4, 2019. Following the receipt of additional allegations, it has been reported that Theta Chi has participated in behavior necessitating the University to take immediate action for the safety of members and the campus community. Reportedly, Theta Chi has participated in hazing behaviors that have jeopardized the physical safety, mental health, and dignity of new and initiated members in an ongoing capacity.

Given the seriousness of the matter, I am placing Theta Chi on immediate interim suspension pending the outcome of a University investigation. Once information is available from this investigation, the Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership will make a recommendation to me regarding the continued campus recognition status for Theta Chi. The Interim Suspension is in effect immediately with an outcome or update of the investigation to be given on or around Friday, December 13, 2019.

While on Interim Suspension, the chapter is expected to cease all activities. No chapter members may host or participate in any chapter-related function, regardless of location. The chapter may coordinate meetings, with prior permission from the Office of Student Life & Leadership, to communicate information with members. The requests must be made two weeks in advance and have a member of the Theta Chi International Headquarters staff or Student Life & Leadership staff present for the entirety of the convening.

Given the concerns for the fratermity. Theta Chi may host no new member education, new member activities, or initiation events, on or off campus. During the course of the Interim Suspension, the San Diego State University chapter may have no communication with new members. Communication from Theta Chi may only be sent to new members by the Theta Chi International Headquarters staff. Additionally, no other student or organization, including but not limited to the Interfratermity Council and College Panhellenic Association, may communicate with new members on Theta Chi's behalf. No member of Theta Chi who serves on the Interfraternity Council executive board may act on behalf of Theta Chi or use their position to influence the investigation.



Student Life & Leadership Division of Student Affairs

All members of Theta Chi will be expected to fully cooperate with the investigation and review process. Be advised that providing false or misleading information, concealing information, instructing others to provide false information or conceal information, attempting to obstruct the investigation, or attempting to threaten or intimidate witnesses or others involved in the investigation will result in judicial referral of all students involved and possible sanctions on the organization.

Within 48-hours of the receipt of this letter, Theta Chi must submit the following documentation to me via email:

- · An overview of the new member process, beginning with recruitment through the time of initiation
- The names and roles of active members who are or were involved in the new member education process during the Fall 2018, Spring 2019, and Fall 2019 terms
- The dates, times, and locations of every meeting/event/convening, both formal and informal, with new members (Fall 2018, Spring 2019, Fall 2019) both before and after initiation
- . The dates, times, and locations of installation and mitiation events for the Fall 2018 and Spring 2019.
- · A roster with two added columns that denotes the big brother and little brother of all members
- Screenshots of all electronic communication in the form of group messages for each of the new member classes (Fall 2018, Spring 2019, and Fall 2019), including, but not limited to, emails, GroupMe messages, group texts/chats, etc.

- Chapter Bylaws (attached) (all items in Red need to be stated verbatim in order to be approved)
  - Addition of Advisor Clause
    - "The organization shall appoint an individual employed as a faculty or staff member by San Diego State University to serve as the university advisor to this organization as required by the California State University. Auxiliary staff and student assistants are not eligible to serve as advisors. The advisor shall fulfill the responsibilities specified in the SDSU Student Organizations Handbook. Advisors shall serve on an academic year basis or until their successor has been selected."
  - Addition of SDSU Authority Statement
    - "This organization is a recognized student organization at San Diego State University and adheres to all campus policies as set forth in the SDSU Student Organization Handbook."
  - Addition of SDSU Open Membership Clause
    - "Participation in the organization shall be open to those regularly-enrolled at San Diego State University" (You have a statement that is similar in nature, but please change to this statement)

As a suggestion, I would also change the language in this statement:

"The Scholarship Committee will ensure that the chapter has the highest average G.P.A. of any other Fraternity at San Diego State University."

Using the word "strive" instead of "ensure" may be beneficial, since it is a more realistic expectation or goal.



Hi Randy and Caryl,

Caryl, just left a message on your VM.

I understand you are all dealing with the mumps outbreak on campus, and I'm absolutely sympathetic. Nonetheless, I'm concerned about your upcoming appeal deadline, tomorrow. My understanding is this:

- 1) The last date to appeal Caryl's decision letter is tomorrow (3/6/20)
- 2) On 2/25/20 (our last group phone call) I sent an email requesting an opportunity to change specific language in that decision letter
- 3) On 2/28/20 I asked for a timeline for an update—either way whether/not to know to plan for an appeal
- 4) On 3/3/20, having received no such indication, I provided the letter to our stakeholders, again letting them know I was waiting to hear whether/not the decision letter language would be amended
- 5) It is now 3/5/20, a day before any such appeal would be due, and I only have an indication from Randy's 3/3/20 email response that he "hopes to provide an updated letter" for what he called my upcoming meeting on 3/6/20, when in fact, that is SDSU's cut-off date for an appeal

I really need one of the following before 3/6/20:

- 1) A "yes" that an "updated letter" will be provided to my office tomorrow (with some time for me to review, prior to 5pm ET), including the removal of language per my proposal, or;
- 2) A "no" that an "updated letter" will a) not be provided or b) not be provided by the 3/6/20 appeal deadline.

If your wish is to extend the appeal deadline to accommodate your wish to get us an "updated letter" and have some time to review before advising whether Theta Chi will/will not appeal, please advise, in writing, such an updated appeal deadline.

Again, if the updated removal of language I had proposed on 2/25/20 is acceptable, I will be advising that Theta Chi not appeal the updated decision letter on 3/6/20. If, however, that language is not going to be updated at all/not going to be updated in time, I will need to solicit the wishes of my constituents regarding an appeal on those grounds, and I'll now have but a business day tomorrow, 3/6/20 to do so.

Please advise at your earliest convenience, verifying that my understanding of the appeal date (3/6/20) is correct, and when I can expect a letter and/or what that letter might indicate, if at all.

Please also note that this message isn't meant to appear terse or with an air of impatience; I simply want to continue to be transparent and to abide by the decision letter's timeline, our discussion on 2/25/20, and my duty to our constituents beyond my office.

Randy and Caryl,

As always, thanks for your phone call earlier to discuss the language in the attached Decision Letter.

This email serves as a formal request to, if possible, strike the following language from that letter:

"I want to acknowledge that while the outlined behavior was occurring within the membership and at the chapter house, house directors hired and supervised by the (Theta Chi) Gamma Theta Housing Corporation lived in the chapter facility. It is beyond concerning that individuals who were hired by the alumni managing the chapter facility since 2017 neglected to prevent or stop the blatant hazing and alcohol misuse. It is even more concerning that they did not report this information to the University."

My rationale is as follows:

1) Theta Chi agrees to the points above the language regarding the disallowance of Theta Chi Members from 2017-2020 or live-in house directors from 2017-2020 being engaged with any subsequent Theta Chi expansion project. No such members or directors will be engaged moving forward in 2023/thereafter.

- 2) Currently, Theta Chi IHQ has no such evidence/record that the individuals hired to be House Directors had knowledge of "hazing and alcohol misuse" in order to "[prevent, stop or report]" it. If you have evidence illustrating otherwise, and are able to share this, Theta Chi will certainly take this into account.
- 3) Because Theta Chi agrees to SDSU's stipulations per point 1) above, perhaps the justification created for it by the letter's language above is already achieved.
- 4) The mention of the Gamma Theta Housing Corporation could prove to be prohibitive to encouraging a positive seller/buyer relationship in the future with regard to any interest from the Housing Corporation wishing to sell the property to SDSU and/or SDSU wishing to buy the property from the Housing Corporation.

Again, please take these comments as continued wishes to cooperate and partner with SDSU throughout this process—I simply wish to articulate the interests of our constituents, maintain a positive and proactive future for Theta Chi at SDSU (e.g. knowing that this letter will be public record until 2023 and beyond), and find a favorable resolution regarding any potential changes in property ownership.

Randy, I appreciate your offer to take these points to those who might be able to amend the letter as such, and I'll look forward to your response.

Regarding a timeline—Theta Chi wishes to resolve any efforts within the mentioned ten (10) business day period for appeal (with the deadline of March 6, 2020). For transparency, before that date, I'll need to know whether/not the letter will be amended as proposed, and I'll need time to communicate to my team, our board, and our alumni to dictate any March 6, 2020 appeal. (Also, out of professional courtesy, if I suspect an appeal will be submitted, I'll let you two know that, ahead of that date.)

Thanks so much in advance for your support as I look to balance the wishes of SDSU and Theta Chi's many constituents.

Good evening Ray,

Thank you for following up with us. We have reviewed the section of the Theta Chi letter. While a concern still exists regarding how the live-in house director could be unaware of the hazing and other misconduct occurring within the chapter facility, to facilitate the process moving forward, we can remove the section from the letter (despite the presumption of implied knowledge) on the ground that there isn't specific evidence that the house director(s) was directly involved with the hazing or alcohol misuse.

Of course, this information will exist in the University's records. When Theta Chi requests to reestablish at SDSU, that decision will require that we address how to best engage the house director and chapter advisor as leaders in creating a positive culture for the organization.

We will work to reformat the letter and send it to you early next week.

Dear

After reviewing information provided by the Hearing Review Panel and Student Life & Leadership staff in response to violations of the Student Organization Handbook, violations of Phi Kappa Theta's probation and recent history of serious policy violations, it is my determination that Phi Kappa Theta shall remain on Probation through June 1, 2016.

As demonstrated by the continued probation, I consider the evidence of a pattern of policy violations to be of great concern. It has been demonstrated that Phi Kappa Theta has struggled with both alcohol and hazing violations over the last five years. In addition to these violations, I placed Phi Kappa Theta on the chapter's fourth Interim Suspension in the last five years in October. The cycle of interim suspensions and policy violations are indicative of the lack of respect for the University and University processes by the chapter.

In my decision, I recognize that there have been positive changes to the landscape of Phi Kappa Theta over the year. However, it is also important to acknowledge that these changes may have been created out of the obligation of an interim suspension. It should be noted that the violations in Fall 2014 demonstrated contempt for the probation and stipulations imposed in Spring 2014. It is my expectation that Phi Kappa Theta will demonstrate that the chapter can adhere to their outlined sanction and stipulations.

As stated, the Phi Kappa Theta is to remain on Probation through June 1, 2016. Additionally, the chapter is to implement the following stipulations. Failure to complete these sanctions and stipulations may result in immediate Interim Suspension.

#### Housing

- Phi Kappa Theta will retain both the chapter facility (lodge) and occupancy in the stacks of Fraternity Row with the following conditions: dry housing with a live-in professional House Director
- In order to retain permissions for house, Phi Kappa Theta must develop, implement and enforce a dry housing policy with Student Life & Leadership staff. This policy should be instituted by June 1, 2015.
- Additionally, Phi Kappa Theta must hire a live-in, professional House Director that has not been an active member of the SDSU chapter of Phi Kappa Theta or any fraternity in the last five years. A full position description and staffing expectations are to be coordinated between and agreed upon by both Phi Kappa Theta's national office and San Diego State University Student Life & Leadership staff prior to the position posting. Student Life & Leadership staff will also be available to work with Phi Kappa Theta on the selection process.
- Once selected, the House Director will participate in training outlined by Student Life & Leadership staff at San Diego State University
- The Phi Kappa Theta House Director will meet with Caryl Montero-Adams and Jordan Lewton biweekly throughout the 2015-16 academic year

# Recruitment and New Member Processes

- Phi Kappa Theta is limited to extend 25 bids for the Fall 2015 term with an opportunity for an additional 25 bids (for the Spring 2016 term) under the condition that no further incidents or violations of the probation occur
- An advisor must be present for the entirety of all new member processes, including recruitment events, new member education meetings, ceremonies, activities, retreats, etc.

# Advising

- Phi Kappa Theta President is to schedule and attend bi-weekly meetings with Jordan Lewton throughout the 2015-16 academic year
- Phi Kappa Theta's advising team is to work with Caryl Montero-Adams to design and implement advisor development opportunities, committing 2 hours per month outside of monthly Advisor Meetings, which may include workshops, one-on-one meetings, advising mentor programs, etc

# **Programming**

• Phi Kappa Theta is to co-host a program with the Interfraternity Council to address the portrayal of women in society and within the Greek community during the month of October 2015

I am also mindful of the importance of providing opportunities for the chapter to begin implementing processes that exhibit expected behavior of fraternity men. That being said, I believe that it is vital to also outline exceptions that lend permission to participate in specific Greek Life and chapter functions. In addition to the stipulations listed above, Phi Kappa Theta is expressly granted permission to participate in the following:

- In order to begin to practice responsible event management, social events with alcohol are limited to 1 event per semester, hosted on campus with a detailed risk management plan advised by Greek Life staff, specifically Caryl Montero-Adams and Jordan Lewton
- Phi Kappa Theta is permitted to have up to 2 dry, social exchanges with sororities; these events are to be approved by Student Life & Leadership-Greek Life staff and the approval process will include an advising session with Jordan Lewton, Phi Kappa Theta President and the sorority president
- Phi Kappa Theta will be eligible to participate in activities implemented within Greek Life, including Greek Week, philanthropy and intramurals

Lastly, my hope is that each member of the fraternity understands the individual and collective choices that resulted in serious policy violations from the chapter. It is critical to identify the unacceptable behaviors that have been fostered within Phi Kappa Theta, take responsibility and make real, meaningful culture changes.

# This is a confidential document. KAPPA ALPHA ORDER DECISION LETTER

Thank you for meeting with me on October 4, 2017. In the Informal Conference, allegations of Alcohol policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed reports that Kappa Alpha Order hosted a tailgate on Saturday. September 16, 2017 prior to the start of the San Diego State University football game versus Stanford. The initial report sparked a joint investigation with Kappa Alpha Order and San Diego State University. Additionally, Kappa Alpha Order placed the Gamma Iota chapter on Temporary Suspension during the course of the investigation.

During the meeting, the group discussed the investigation, which involved interviews with members of the executive board. The interviews were conducted by Jennifer Riso, investigator for Kappa Alpha Order, and me on September 30 and October 1, 2017. During the interviews, executive board members discussed their understanding of University and fraternity policies centered around risk management. The "dry period" policy, stating that Recognized Student Organizations cannot host events with alcohol from August 1-October 1 annually, was also discussed. Additionally, bulgates, annex/satellite houses and events that have occurred during the Fall 2017 semester were discussed. It is the sentiment of both interviewers that the executive board members were truthful during the interviews.

During the Informal Conference, the group discussed central findings from the documentation and interviews. Based on the evidence presented during the course of the investigation, it was confirmed that the Gamma Iota chapter of Kappa Alpha Order hosted a tailgate on September 16, 2017. Although alcohol was present at the event, the findings indicate that alcohol was provided by members who brought and consumed their own alcohol. There was no evidence that alcohol was distributed by the fraternity on September 16, 2017. This was the second tailgate that the fraternity convened during the Fall 2017 semester.

During the interviews, executive board members identified a satellite house where six members of the fraternity, including executive board members, live. Members of the executive board identified that there had been as many as three satellite parties where alcohol had been present during the Fall 2017 term at this location. With the exception of the chapter president, it was clear that executive board members did not understand that these events were organizational in nature. When presented during the meeting, this finding facilitated conversation on "non-chapter, chapter events" and the corresponding responsibility and liability of the chapter during the events.



Division of Student Affairs

During the conversation, President . and Alumnus Advisor David Dere represented the fraternity and President Victor Todor and Vice President for Judicial Affairs Russell Parris were present on behalf of IFC.

# Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference, I have found the Gamma Iota chapter of Kappa Alpha to be in violation of the Alcohol policy in the Student Organization Code of Conduct.

(b.2) Alcohol. Violation of applicable law or University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic beverages while on or off compus.

As a result of Alcohol policy violation, Kappa Alpha is sanctioned to Probation effective immediately and ending on March 16, 2018. Any further violations of University policy during the term of the Probation may result in an immediate Interim Suspension of the fraternity. In addition to Probation, Kappa Alpha Order must complete the following atipulations:

# Chapter Education

Educational Workshops. Kappa Alpha is expected to host ongoing educational workshops for members of the chapter. Specifically, the following workshops are stipulated for the term of the Probation and must have 90% chapter participation:

- Risk Management and Chapter Events
- Alcohol and Other Drugs

Fraternity & Sorority Life and Kappa Alpha Order can advise on presenters and workshop development. It is expected that the chapter leadership will schedule a meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams to review and advise on the workshops and identify presenters. Documentation of workshop completion must be sent to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff within 24-hours of the workshops. Documentation should be in Google Slides format and include photos, presenter information, a list of participants (last name, first name, Red ID), and a written reflection on the workshop.

Risk Management Plan Development Workshop. Kappa Alpha Order's executive board and at least one alumnus advisor will work with Caryl Montero-Adams and/or Anthony Graziani to facilitate a workshop that helps the executive board forecast risk in events and identifies best practices for risk management. Additionally, the board will develop a risk management plan, with the potential of being modified to meet the needs for future events.

### Events and Activities

Advisor Presence. During the term of the Probation, an advisor is expected to be present during the duration of all chapter events/meetings.



Events with Alcohol. During the term of the Probation, Kappa Alpha Order may host events with alcohol following the successful implementation of an event with alcohol on campus. The fraternity may host an event with alcohol on campus by implementing University processes for events with alcohol. The event proposal will include an Event Approval System request, space reservation on campus, a formalized risk management plan, and an alcohol approval issued by the Vice President for Student Affairs office (after review by Fraternity & Sorority Life staff).

If the fraternity chooses to not implement the event with alcohol on campus, alcohol cannot be present at formal or informal chapter events during the term of the probation.

Failure to complete these sanctions may result in the interim suspension of the Gamma Iota chapter of Kappa Alpha Order.

At this time, it is also my recommendation to the Dean of Students, Dr. Randy Timm, that an investigation regarding toilgates at SDSU football games is launched by the University. The investigation will begin with a review of fraternal practices regarding tailgates. Based on the information presented during the course of the investigation, tailgates with alcohol during the University's dry period are not isolated to Kappa Alpha.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with me in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Kappa Alpha Order at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life, on November 13, 2017. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a reported social event that occurred on September 29, 2017, which resulted in alleged violations of the Alcohol, Failure to Comply, and Violations of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policies.

During the conversation, President , Vice President and Purple Legionnaire represented the fraternity. International Headquarters Staff joined the meeting, with Field Secretary Daylon Weddle attending and Senior Director of Undergraduate Services Todd Rotgers calling in: Additionally, Student Life Advisor for Fraternity & Sorority Life, Matthew Garcia was present. In addition to the reported incidents, the group discussed the status of the chapter with the International Headquarters and the University also submitted the Strategic Plan for the Development of the Sigma Delta Chapter of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity, which outlines an educational and accountability plan for the chapter. Below is the account that outlines the conversation during the Informal Conference by area.

#### Review of Chapter Status

During the Informal Conference, Caryl Montero-Adams reviewed the University status of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity, which is an Interim Suspension resulting from allegations of a previously assigned Probation with Supulations, also explained the chapter's probationary status with the international Fraternity.

# Alcohol Policy Allegations

During the Informal Conference, a review of the initial incident report occurred. The anonymous report was submitted by a community member who stated they believed they were drugged at the event. The individual described that they had consumed alcohol at the event, that alcohol was distributed to minors, and that they were aware "FIJI" was on probation during the event. The initial report also included an address of a satellite house and photos from the event.

The group then discussed the details that were found during the course of the investigation, including that the event was a date party and, therefore, seen as being low-risk. The event was confirmed to have occurred on September 29, 2017 where 100-120 people were present, including brothers and their dates. Members of the executive board were present and a risk management team with rotating responsibilities was enacted. The group also reviewed the photos, with one picture showing six handles on a table with an ice luge where a member of the risk management team was pouring hard liquor from a handle down the luge for a guest to consume.



A consistent theme that was presented during the investigation was that individuals who were at least 21 years old could bring a six-pack of beer or equivalent per Fraternity risk management policy. Members further stated that a handle of hard liquor was deemed an equivalent by members. When asked about the equivalency, members stated that equivalency is "hard to judge" or "under interpretation."

# Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures

During the Informal Conference, allegations of Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures were discussed, specifically, the misrepresentation of information during the investigation, retaliation towards reporting parties, and failure to comply with previously assigned sanctions.

Misrepresentation of Information. During the Informal Conference, the group discussed inconsistent information related to the risk management plan and implementation at the off-campus satellite party. Of those interviewed during the investigation, some members identified that ID checks were implemented and wristbands were given. Some members identified that wristbands were given to individuals who were at least 21 years of age and another identified that different color wristbands were issued depending on age. Receipt of purchase for the wristbands was not provided and the color(s) of the wristbands were unknown. The risk management team was said to be between eight and ten members, but only three names could be remembered. Alcohol was reportedly provided by individuals for their personal consumption, but a table with the ice luge had at least six handles of hard liquor present. Given the inconsistent information presented by those interviewed, it is more likely than not that the organization was not entirely truthful when presenting information during the investigation

Retaliation. During the Informal Conference, information related to retaliatory behavior, including rumors.

Tweets and the treatment of perceived reporting parties was discussed. Reported behavior, such as posting photos of active members who previously engaged in dating relationships with perceived reporting parties, was presented.

This behavior demonstrates that Phi Gamma Delta is more concerned with who the chapter believes "wronged" the fraternity rather than holding chapter members and the organization accountable. To this end, I am deeply concerned that the fraternity does not understand the impact of individual and collective actions—both in regards to retaliation and overall accountability.

Failure to Comply with Previously Assigned Sanctions. During the investigation and Informal Conference, the chapter acknowledged that the event violated policy and prior sanctions.

In Prior Gamma Delta President, stated that the event was intended to boost morale within the organization and that the chapter knowingly violated the terms of the previously-assigned Probation.

#### Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference. I have found Phi Gamma Delta to be in violation of the Alcohol and the Violation of the



Student Organization Conduct Procedures policies. An additional violation of the listed b(38)-6 has been founded instead of the initial b(16) Failure to Comply alleged violation

b(2) Alcohol. Violation of applicable law or University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic beverages while on or off campus.

b(38)-1 Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures, Falsification, distortion or misrepresentations of information related to a student organization discipline matter.

b(38)-5 Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures. Verbal, written or physical harassment, intimidation or retaliation of any participant in a student organization disciplinary matter.

b(38)-6 Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures. Failure to comply with the sanction(s) imposed under a student organization disciplinary proceeding.

As a result of the Alcohol and Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policy violations, Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity is sanctioned to Suspension in Abeyance, followed by Probation through June 2019. The Suspension in Abeyance will transition to Probation once the following milestones are met, which must occur by the end of the Spring 2018 semester for continued campus recognition:

- Board of Chapter Advisors Installed
  - As outlined in the Phi Gamma Delta Development Plan and discussed in the Informal Conference, Phi Gamma Delta will be developing a Board of Chapter Advisors (BCA). The chapter will remain on Suspension in Abeyance until the Board of Chapter Advisors have been selected by the fratemity and trained by International Headquarters volunteers/staff and University staff. A joint training will be designed by Todd Rotgers, Caryl Montero-Adams and Javier Gomez. The Board of Chapter Advisors must be installed by the end of the Spring 2018 semester.
- · Membership Fraining
  - International Headquarters and University staff, led by Todd Rotgers and Caryl Montero-Adams respectively, will design and implement a training for all members of the fraternity. The training will cover topics of policies, risk management, bystander intervention, retaliation, and alcohol and other drugs. Ninety percent (90%) participation is required from the chapter. The training for members must occur by March 1, 2018.

Any further violations of University policy during the term of the Suspension in Abeyance or Probation may result in an immediate Interim Suspension of the fraternity and could result in the removal of campus recognition. In addition to the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation. Phi Gamma Delta must complete the following stipulations:

### Terms of Suspension in Abeyance

During the Suspension in Abeyance, the frateriuty may not host or be affiliated with social events. The chapter may only participate in weekly meetings, community service, philanthropy, and educational programming with prior approval from



the Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life, Caryl Montero-Adams (following the process outlined below). During the term of Suspension in Abeyance, all chapter-hosted events that are open to non-members must be held on campus.

During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance, and throughout the duration of the Spring 2018 term, the chapter may host the Frank Norris Pig Dinner on campus, an event that is a collaboration with active and graduate brothers. The chapter can request to have alcohol at the Frank Norris Pig Dinner, provided that all University procedures are followed. Planning for this event must begin at least eight-weeks prior to the date of the event.

## Chapter Education

Educational Workshops. Phi Gamma Delta is expected to host ongoing educational workshops for members of the chapter. Specifically, the following workshops are stipulated for the term of the Probation and must have 90% chapter participation:

- · Semesterly: Alcohol and Other Drugs, Hazing
- Spring 2018: Membership Training (outlined above)
  - Spring 2019; Post-Probation Risk Management

Given that the chapter did not complete the originally assigned educational workshops during the Fall 2017 term.

(Alcohol and Other Drugs, Hazing), no events will be approved prior to the submission of an educational workshop plan. The plan must include the presenters, dates, and a program outline for the current term.

Fraternity & Sorority Life can advise on presenters and workshop development. It is expected that the chapter leadership will schedule a meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams to review and advise on the workshops and identify presenters. Documentation of workshop completion must be sent to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff within 24-hours of the workshops. Documentation should be in Google Slides format and include photos, presenter information, a list of participants (last name, first name, Red ID), the strengths of the workshops and the opportunities for growth.

Pre-Recruitment Meeting. The chapter must host a pre-recruitment meeting with the chapter's executive board, 90% of membership and graduate advisor(s) prior to any recruitment activities each semester. This meeting will establish the process and expectations around recruiting new members and how new members are engaged during their first semester. Hazing, alcohol and other drugs must be discussed during the meeting to mitigate the risk of these behaviors. A member of the Fraternity & Sorority Life staff team must also be present. If the meeting does not occur, Phi Gamma Delta may not participate in recruitment of new members.

### **Events and Activities**

# Event Calendar and Proposal Meeting

The chapter executive board and any event planners (risk management chair, philanthropy chair, etc) will schedule a meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams during the first two weeks of each semester to discuss the chapter's event calendar. In this meeting, the event approval process will be discussed in detail. Additionally, risk management plans and expectations will be discussed.



Event Proposals and Risk Management Plans. During the term of the Probation, Phi Gamma Delta must submit a proposal with detailed risk management plans for all events hosted or co-hosted by the chapter to Fraternity & Sorority Life. Despite location, the events must follow the University's approval process and risk management plans must be submitted for all events. For educational workshops, community service participation, and regular meetings, the chapter must submit proposals three weeks in advance. For events with greater risk, such as philanthropies. Frank Norris Pig Dinners, and socials, the chapter must submit the events eight weeks in advance.

Eveuts with Alcohol. During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation, Phi Gamma Delta may request to host the following events with alcohol:

- Spring 2018: Frank Norris Pig Dinner, located on-campus
- · Fall 2018: One, on-campus social event
- Spring 2019: One, off-campus social event at a third party vendor and the Frank Norris Pig Dinner located on-campus

The purpose of hosting structured events with alcohol is to provide developmental opportunities for the chapter to intentionally plan and implement events. In the event that the approval process is not followed or additional policies are violated, the privilege of hosting events with alcohol may be rescinded during the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation.

Outside of the events with alcohol, the chapter may host dry socials that follow the event approval process outlined above.

Advisor Presence. During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation, an advisor is expected to be present during the duration of all chapter events/meetings.

#### Disclosure

Disclosure. It is expected that all members, new members and potential new members are made aware of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation and all stiputations. It is vital to the sustainability of the chapter that the entire membership understands the outcome of the investigation and expectations of members in this process.

To ensure that potential new members are aware of the chapter's status, it is an expectation that an announcement is made at each Phi Gamma Delta recruitment event by alumni advisor(s) during the Spring 2018, Fall 2018 and Spring 2019 semesters. Potential new members must also sign and submit a Memorandum of Understanding regarding the fratemity's status.

### No Contact with Perceived Reporting Parties:

The chapter may have no contact with individuals who are perceived to be reporting parties during investigations that occurred in the 2016-17 and 2017-18 academic years. This includes, but is not limited to:

 direct or indirect communication with the perceived reporting parties regarding investigations, consequences, University and/or Fraternity decisions, etc.



- Naming, describing, making allusion and/or reference to the perceived reporting parties during informal
  and formal chapter meetings, programs, events and all other functions and/or communication outlets both
  internal and external to the chapter
- posting direct or indirect messaging related to perceived reporting parties on social media platforms and other communication outlets
- discussing assumed reports made by the perceived reporting parties with members and non-members
- attempting to provide consequences to or ostracise a perceived reporting party's membership from the Greek community

Members of Phi Gamma Delta have access to University resources and are able to report any concerns for members of the campus community, including perceived reporting parties, to the University. While the fraternity may not contact or discuss perceived reporting parties between members and non-members, members of Phi Gamma Delta may report concerning behavior exhibited by perceived reporting parties to the University. To report concerning behavior, members of Phi Gamma Delta may contact Dr. Lee Mintz, Director of the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities and Deputy Title IX Coordinator, directly or may contact me or Caryl Montero-Adams for a referral.

### Failure to complete these sanctions may result in the interim suspension of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Montero-Adams in the informal conference. We also appreciate the chapter submitting The Strategic Plan for the Development of the Sigma Delta Chapter of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity and hope that the entire membership is committed to moving the chapter forward. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Phi Gamma Delta at San Diego State University.

Judicial Appeal

Thank you for meeting with me on March 12, 2018 regarding the appeal of your sorority judicial decision. I began the meeting by going over the purpose of our meeting. Specifically, I explained to you that this is an ad hoc appeal process, and that my function is to provide an objective review of the decision(s) previously made.

My responsibility is to evaluate whether there are reasonable grounds for the decision/sanction. I can then sustain, modify in some specified way, or revoke the decision. It is not the function of this process to conduct a full hearing of all of the evidence.

During this meeting, you did not submit any documents.

### Summary

In an oral presentation, you and your advisor, summarized the rationale for the appeal. You explained you are complying with the sanction in the original letter received however, you were appealing certain stipulations placed on the organization. You acknowledged that your organization and its members have learned from this process and are moving forward with planned changes within the organization.

The most pertinent points provided in your presentation were:

- I Concerns and appeals were being made on the following stipulations:
  - a. New member process
  - b. Event approval: Events only being held on campus
  - c. Event approval: Ending events by 10 PM
  - d. Event approval: Advisor at all events
- The organization has engaged in and begun taking steps to better the sorority including: learning from this experience; understanding need for greater transparency, creating a manual, bylaws and risk management plans; working in partnership with Student Life and Leadership; and increase training opportunities including for alumni and advisors.

As part of this process, I have also had the opportunity to review the following documents provided to me:

- 1. Informal Conference, Sigma Theta Psi, PowerPoint presentation; December 14, 2017
- 2. Sigma Theta Psi: Decision Letter; February 2, 2018
- 3. Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Alpha Chapter, Appeal Letter; February, 15, 2018
- 4. Prioritized (Tiered) organizational events hosted annually by the sorority, April 2, 2018

After reviewing the collective information I conclude the following:

Due process and appropriate procedural measures appear to have been granted to the organization in the investigative process. In addition, the organization has taken responsibility for the Hazing, Dishonesty and Student Organization Banking policy violations.

Taking into account this collective information, I conclude there are reasonable grounds for the original judicial disposition and sanctions. I believe that the aforementioned information shows that organizational policies were violated and that the sanctions and stipulations in the original decision are appropriate. I stand by the decisions made in regards to all of the appealed areas of the stipulations which include:

- a. New member process
- b. Event approval: Events only being held on campus\*
- c. Event approval: Ending events by 10 PM
- d. Event approval: Advisor at all events

I will amend one component of the original decision in regards to events held on campus. There are some traditional events that specifically relate to philanthropic endeavors or ongoing professional development that the sorority and/or a selection of its members will need to be able to be off campus to participate. Specifically the following events seem to not lend to being hosted on campus: Breast Cancer Awareness walk (tier 1), Southwest Keys, community service event (tier 1), National Conference (tier 2), Posada (tier 3), Corvette Diner dinner (tier 3), and the PIFA festival (tier 3). I expect the sorority to work closely with the Fraternity and Sorority Life staff within Student Life and Leadership to prepare for and implement these events within the guidelines in the handbook. Events outside of these events will need special permission from SLL to be hosted off campus.

I am grateful and appreciative for the self initiated steps being taken to increase the sororities' organization and practices, which include:

- · Creation of historical procedural documents, risk management plans and a manual with bylaws
- Increasing member and organization accountability
- Building a stronger sisterhood
- Providing better education and training for all affiliated with the organization (current members, prospective members, alumni and advisors)

I believe that the strength of your organizations will be realized through the ongoing and collaborative relationship between Sigma Theta Psi, Alpha Chapter and the Office of Student Life & Leadership.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life, on June 11, 2018. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a reported social event that occurred on February 19, March 2, and March 3 2018. The initial event led to the Interim Suspension of the chapter on March 9, 2018. The reports resulted in allegations of the Alcohol and Noise policy violations.

During the conversation, Presiden and Advisor John Little represented the fraternity. Interfraternity
Council Executive Vice President, Noah Siegel, was also present. In addition to the reported incidents, the group
discussed the status of the chapter

#### Review of Chapter Status

During the Informal Conference, Caryl Montero-Adams reviewed the University status of Delta Upsilon, which was Interim Suspension with the University.

#### Review of Alleged Policy Violations

During the Informal Conference, a review of the initial incident reports occurred, along with information found during the course of the investigation. The specific alleged policy violations were discussed in detail.

#### Alcohol Allegations

During the Informal Conference, the group reviewed incident reports from February and March 2018 that outlined a student who was cited for minor in possession on Hardy Avenue, a noise complaint from the fraternity house during a social, and a student who was transported from the residence halls. Reportedly, Delta Upsilon was named in the incidents. Following the Informal Conference, and in conducting investigative meetings and conferring with the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities, there was no additional link established between the fraternity and the transported student or the student cited for minor in possession.

#### Noise Policy Allegation

During the course of the investigation, an incident reportedly occurred on March 2, 2018 at the chapter facility. During the Informal Conference, the group discussed that police had made contact with the fraternity. The group elaborated that police responded to the house and the social event that was occurring during that time ended.



#### Discussion

During the Informal Conference, Delta Upsilon, the Interfraternity Council and Fraternity & Sorority Life staff engaged in dialogue around risk management at chapter events. Specifically, the group discussed risk management practices such as pouring cans/bottles that were brought by of-age members into cups. The group discussed why these actions could be problematic. The group also discussed a need for additional information. The fraternity updated the University in late July with the information requested.

#### Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews, conferring with the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities, and discussion during the Informal Conference. I have found Delta Upsilon to be in violation of the Noise policy.

b(24)-2 Noise. Excessive noise which disrupts the campus or surrounding community, including but not limited to the use of amplified sound on campus.

As a result of the Noise policy violation, Delta Upsilon is sanctioned to Formal Warning. There is no further action that must be taken at this time.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Montero-Adams in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Delta Upsilon at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life, on November 19, 2018. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a social event that reportedly occurred on September 28, 2018, and a reported social event that occurred on August 28, 2018. The September event led to the Interim Suspension of the chapter on October 3, 2018. The reports resulted in alleged violations of the Alcohol policy.

During the conversation, outgoing President and Advisors Michael
DiPirma and Gene Lamke represented the fraternity. Student Life Advisor for Fraternity & Sorority Life, Matthew
Garcia was present along with a representative from the Interfraternity Council, President Jacob Mahony. In addition to
the reported incidents, the group discussed the status of the chapter.

#### Review of Chapter Status

During the Informal Conference, Caryl Montero-Adams reviewed the University status of Theta Chi, which was Interim Suspension with the University.

### Review of Alleged Policy Violations

During the Informal Conference, a review of the initial incident reports occurred, along with information found during the course of the investigation. The specific alleged policy violations were discussed in detail:

#### Alcohol Allegations

During the Informal Conference, the group reviewed an incident report from September 2018 that outlined two students who were transported from the residence halls for their level of intoxication and one student who was arrested for Driving Under the Influence. Reportedly, one individual was a new member of Theta Chi, one individual had been with a member of Theta Chi, and one individual was reportedly coming from Theta Chi. The group discussed that in conducting investigative meetings and conferring with the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities, there was no additional link established between the fraternity and the transported students.

During the Informal Conference, the group discussed a report that detailed an alleged satellite house of the fraternity where a large social event occurred on August 28, 2018. Reportedly, the fraternity hosted an event at the satellite house. During the course of the investigation, it was determined the individuals residing at the reported satellite house were not members of the fraternity. Additionally, it was found that the chapter misused a status in the University roster system and

that the individuals who reportedly hosted an event at the satellite house in August were no longer members of the international fraternity.

#### Discussion

During the Informal Conference, Theta Chi, the Interfraternity Council and Fraternity & Sorority Life staff engaged in dialogue around the roster management and risk management. Specifically, it was discussed that the chapter was labeling some former members as "inactive" in the University roster system, despite the individuals no longer having membership within the international fraternity. The group discussed the importance of roster maintenance, different statuses within the system, and accountability of members.

#### Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews, and discussion during the informal conference, the preponderance of the evidence was not established to hold Theta Chi responsible for the alleged policy violation. Therefore, I have found Theta Chi not responsible for the alleged Alcohol policy violation. There is no further action that must be taken by the fraternity at this time.

Although not a founded violation of the University's alcohol policy, it is recommended that the chapter review the internal accountability measures (ex. Standards/Iudieud Board) and membership rosters.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Montero-Adams in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents will contribute to the success of Theta Chi at Sun Diego State University.

## This is a confidential document. ALPHA PHI SORORITY DECISION LETTER

Thank you for meeting with me on February 20, 2019. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed the executive board's response to a report of a member being drugged at a fraternity house on October 27, 2018. This incident led to the Interim Suspension of the chapter on November 8, 2018. The Interim Suspension was lifted on December 5, 2018 after a new executive board was trained on risk management and the FSL Reporting Protocol, and fully transitioned and installed. The reports resulted in allegations of the Health and Safety policy.

During the conversation, Presiden and Advisor Bridget Hansen represented the sorority.

Student Life Advisor for Student Organizations & Activities, Jessi Moore was also present.

The group discussed a report that a member of Alpha Phi approached the executive board sharing that she believed that she was drugged at a fraternity event on Saturday, October 27, 2018, and the executive board acted to suppress or dissuade the individual from reporting to the University and police. The investigative interviews indicated that the individual had a severe reaction to alcohol consumed at the fraternity event. The reaction included difficulty standing, speaking, and violently vomiting. The individual sought medical care on their own, and reported being tested positive for a drug in their system. When this individual reported this information to the executive board, the individual was not believed. The individual felt they were receiving messages from the executive board that the concern was for the organization, and any potential impact on Fraternity and Sorority Life at San Diego State University. Resources were not shared with the individual. The executive board thought they were trying to be helpful, but recognized the need to train and educate on sexual violence, drugs, and alcohol.

The new executive board feels confident that they know how to respond appropriately to allegations involving sexual violence, drugs, or alcohol after their training. They are making efforts to create a culture of support, where members feel comfortable reporting and accessing resources. They also recognize that there is work to be done to change the culture in their chapter to be supportive of survivors of sexual

violence through their words and actions. We discussed some education and training opportunities that could be beneficial to the chapter in the future as well.

#### Decision

Based on the preponderance of the evidence gathered during the investigation, including investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference, I have found Alpha Phi to be in violation of the Health and Safety policy. The scope of this violation represents serious concern for the health and safety of members of the SDSU community. There is a preponderance of evidence indicating the chapter did not report and provide resources as expected.

(21) Health and Safety. Conduct that threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person within or related to the University community, including physical abuse, threats, intimidation, harassment, sexual misconduct, throwing bottles or objects that could result in personal injury, or where three or more members of a student organization engage in group violence or taunt others to engage in violence.

As a result of the Health and Safety policy violation, Alpha Phi Sorority is sanctioned to a Warning through May 9, 2019.

Thank you again for taking time to meet with me to discuss this incident. I am confident that our conversations will support the success of your organization moving forward. Please do not hesitate to reach out for support.

Thank you for meeting with Jordan Lewton and me on September 29, 2014 to discuss the alleged policy violations that took place during the week of August 18, 2014 with Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity. During our meeting, you informed us that SAE did not have a social event during the week of August 18, 2014 where alcohol was present. You also stated that a member of your chapter purchased a goat, the goat was temporarily located at the SAE chapter house and after the goat was removed, it was returned to a farm where it had originated. You stated that the goat was not intended for amusement, rather purchased as a pet.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including the informal conference and photos posted to social media, I have found Sigma Alpha Epsilon to be in violation of the Animals policy. Based on the preponderance of evidence, it is my belief that it is more likely than not that the goat was brought to the fraternity for amusement.

As a result of the Animals policy violation, Sigma Alpha Epsilon is sanctioned to 8 weeks of probation, effective August 18, 2014. Additionally, Sigma Alpha Epsilon must plan and implement a risk management seminar with 90% of chapter members in attendance that focuses on the intent versus the impact of chapter activities. The planning of this seminar should include advising and approval from SDSU Greek Life staff (Jordan Lewton, me). This seminar must be held by February 1, 2015. **Failure to complete these sanctions may result in immediate Interim Suspension.** 

At this time, there is no further action that needs to be taken regarding the alleged alcohol violations that were investigated in this meeting.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with us in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Sigma Alpha Epsilon at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Jordan Lewton and me on October 9, 2014 to discuss the alleged policy violations that took place during the week of August 22, August 23 and September 6, 2014 with Delta Upsilon Fraternity. During our meeting, you informed us that DU did have social events throughout the first several weeks of the semester. You stated that on August 22, 2014 there was a social event at the house where there was never more than 120 people present. You also informed us that on August 23, 2014, it was incredibly hectic on Hardy Avenue and that there were numerous people attempting to access the DU facility. Lastly, you stated that on September 6, 2014 that there was an unorganized social occurring at the DU house which drew outsiders to the house. You also confirmed that individuals have hopped DU's fence. When asked if alcohol was at any of the social events, you confirmed that alcohol had been present, as Delta Upsilon members snuck the alcohol into the facility. You also stated that there individual members were adjudicated through the DU process and that there were attempts to contain behavior of members after the alcohol violations were discovered.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, which includes your admission, I have found Delta Upsilon to be in violation of the Alcohol policy.

As a result of the Alcohol policy violation, Delta Upsilon is sanctioned to 16 weeks of probation, effective August 22, 2014. Additionally, Delta Upsilon must design a 50-minute risk management seminar that features the planning, implementation and evaluation of their mock party. This risk management seminar should discuss ways to reduce risk of social events and describe how implementing a mock event is beneficial for chapters. The planning of this seminar should include advising and approval from SDSU Greek Life staff (Jordan Lewton, me). Greek Life staff will also coordinate with IFC leadership so that the seminar can be given during an IFC delegate meeting. Failure to complete these sanctions may result in immediate Interim Suspension.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with us in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Delta Upsilon at San Diego State University.

An investigation of alleged policy violations conducted by Phi Delta Theta opened on September 29, 2014. The investigation began when Phi Delta Theta President, reported that his chapter had hosted a tailgate at Qualcomm Stadium on September 27, 2014 where common-source alcohol was present. Additionally, informed us that Delta Gamma was also invited to the tailgate. At this point, the investigation focused on the following policies within the Student Organization Handbook:

### Chapter 4-2: Alcohol

Unless held at a licensed establishment with professional bartenders, hard liquor (alcoholic beverages other than beer or wine) shall not be consumed at organization events.

#### Chapter 4-6: Alcohol

No organization shall permit any person who is under the age of 21 or who is obviously intoxicated to consume alcoholic beverages at organization functions. Use of wristbands and/or private security guards hired to check age identification may be required. At joint functions each organization is responsible for keeping those under the age of 21 from consuming alcoholic beverages.

#### Chapter 4-15: Alcohol

Unless a waiver is granted by Student Life & Leadership, the purchase and/or use of any bulk quantity of alcoholic beverages or providing a common source of alcohol (e.g., kegs, miniature kegs, alcoholic punch, coolers filled with canned beer, open bars, etc.) is expressly prohibited. (A keg shell present on organization premises shall be considered evidence of a violation of this policy.) Organizations that attend a jointly-sponsored event where a common source of alcohol is present shall have ten minutes to either have the source removed or have all members leave the function, otherwise, all participating organizations become jointly responsible for the presence of the common source of alcohol.

On October 8, 2014, Phi Delta Theta was assigned Interim Suspension by the Vice President for Student Affairs office. Following their interim sanction, Jordan Lewton and I met with Phi Delta Theta Fraternity on October 16, 2014 to discuss alleged policy violations that occurred on September 27, 2014.

During our informal conference, President confirmed that there were two, five-gallon Gatorade containers that were filled with mixed alcohol beverages containing liquor. indicated that there was no attempt to remove the alcohol and that he walked away to attempt to develop a solution. eventually left the tailgate due to internal challenges within the chapter. confirmed that Delta Gamma was also at the tailgate

The severity of the alleged Alcohol policy violations resulted in interim suspension of the fraternity on October 8, 2014. During my investigation of the policy violations, Phi Delta Theta has acted within the terms of the interim suspension and has been cooperative with all policies and requests.

I have concluded that Phi Delta Theta is responsible for the Alcohol policies, specifically 4-2, 4-6 and 4-15. After the conclusion of the investigation, Phi Delta Theta's interim suspension is lifted. The chapter is assigned a sanction of 16 weeks of probation, effective September 27, 2014 and concluding January 17, 2015. In addition to probation, Phi Delta Theta must complete the following stipulations:

- All on and off campus activities should be approved by the district alumni association and Greek Life staff at SDSU. Alcohol is prohibited at all events, including those off campus, during the entire probation period.
- Leadership and brotherhood development activities should be planned and implemented once a month during the term of the probation utilizing campus resources with 90% chapter membership in attendance.
- The fraternity's incoming executive board and new member education offices must be approved by the Local Board of Directors and SDSU Greek Life Staff.

Lastly, it should be noted that during the time of the incident and investigation there were deep internal concerns going on in the chapter. While they are not fully resolved, I am confident that with advising, intentional programming and commitment from the brothers, the chapter can grow from the experience. I hope the outcome of the investigation will contribute to Phi Delta Theta's success at San Diego State University.

#### Dear

Thank you for meeting with Student Life and Leadership staff on December 12, 2014 to discuss the alleged policy violations that took place during on November 21, 2014. During our meeting, we discussed the alleged Harassment policy violation that took place during the Take Back the Night march.

During our discussion of the alloged Harassment incident, you stated that Sigma Phi Epsilon members were largely out of the house due to a date dance with Pi Beta Phi. However, you stated that four individuals were in the "nine room," which has a small balcony attached. Additionally, you stated that one of these individuals went out onto the balcony and yelled "go home!" once marchers allegedly approached Sigma Phi Epsilon's property. Additionally, you stood by your comments issued in the media, stating that you feel Sigma Phi Epsilon is being verbally abused.

Throughout the conversation, we discussed the discrepancies in the of the reports provided to our office. With this, we talked about the video evidence that was described versus the video that was produced. We also discussed the inconsistent accounts of Sigma Phi Epsilon versus the consistent information provided by Taka Back the Night marchers.

Based on the Information gathered during the investigation, it is our belief that, more likely than not, during the Take Back the Night rally, individual(s) at the Sigma Phi Epsilon house should obscenities at marchers. However, based on the preponderance of the evidence, isolated individuals yelled at the marchers. Therefore, we are forwarding the names of the individuals involved in this incident to the University's Title IX Coordinator for further review. Given these individuals committed the behaviors in a facility owned by the chapter and the manner in which chapter members reacted to the allegations, there are still behavioral challenges that warrant a warning for the chapter with educational sanctions. These sanctions are in addition to the student initiated programmatic efforts within the SDSU Greek community. We concur with your volunteer services director's recommendation for the bystender intervention and sexual assault awareness program (by Archie Messersmith.) We are also happy to work with the organization if further educational programming is needed and will assist in the development of any events the chapter implements.

As a result of the Harassment policy violations, Sigma Phi Epsilon is given a warning regarding this situation. In addition to the warning, Sigma Phi Epsilon is responsible for the following educational stipulations:

- Sigma Phi Epsilon will support the Interfraternity Council moratorium on social events. Additionally, the
  chapter will fully participate in required activities that educate the Greek community on sexual violence as
  espoused by student leaders and administration at San Diego State University.
- Sigma Phi Epsilon will develop and implement a program addressing sexual violence and bystander intervention in conjunction with their national office and SOSU Student Life & Leadership staff members.
   Each Sigma Phi Epsilon member is required to participate and this program should be completed by April 1, 2015.

Lastly, individuals involved in and present at the house during the Take Back the Night March will be referred to the San Diego State University Title IX Coordinator, Jessica Rentto. If the coordinator finds it warranted, the names may also be forwarded to the Center for Student Rights and Responsibilities.

To appeal this decision, please contact Associate Vice President for Student Affairs Christy Samarkos (csamarko@mail.sdsu.edu) and Director of Student Life and Leadership Randy Timm (rtimm@mail.sdsu.edu) within ten (10) business days. The appeal request must be in writing. The appeal request should contain which part(s) of the decision the chapter is appealing and the chapter's justification for the appeal.

Thank you for meeting with Student Life and Leadership staff on December 12, 2014 to discuss the alleged policy violations that took place during the fall 2014 term. During our meeting, we discussed the alleged Alcohol policy violations that occurred on October 25, 2014, alleged Alcohol and Hazing policy violations that occurred on October 31, 2014 and the alleged Harassment policy violation that occurred on November 21, 2014. Additionally, we discussed a Community Safety Alert that was issued on November 23, 2014. The Community Safety Alert described a sexual assault that occurred on the 5500 block of Hardy Avenue.

When discussing the alleged Alcohol policy violations, you admitted that Delta Sigma Phi had parties on October 25 and October 31, 2014. You described that individuals came to the party with alcohol (varying types, including liquor) and that there was no control over who consumed what. You also stated that Delta Sigma Phi's risk management procedures did not include differentiating between members and guests who were 21 and those who were not; based on your account, anyone who attended may have consumed alcohol. When discussing the alleged Hazing incident that occurred, you informed us that you were maware of any behavior of members that may have required new members to drink in excess.

During our discussion of the alleged Hurassment incident, you admitted that a member (along with two other individuals who were in the library connected to the balcony) waved a dildo at the Take Back the Night marchers on November 21, 2014. In addition to the information discussed in the Informal Conference, Student Life and Leadership received a Standards Board Report (from the colony) that detailed the incident

The final incident that was discussed was the Community Safety Alert describing a sexual assault. During this conversation, you confirmed that Delta Sigma Phi hosted a "Hustler" party where the company Hustler was a sponsor. You also stated that the risk management procedure of the party was similar to those on October 25 and October 31. We then discussed the impact of themed parties, especially those that are sexualized and may perpetuate a cycle of violence.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including your admission, we have found Delta Sigma Phi to be in violation of the Alcohol. Hazing and Harassment policies. Based on the preponderance of evidence, it is my belief that it is more likely than not that the during the party on October 31 that a group of new members were required to drink in excess.

As a result of the Alcohol, Hozing and Harassment policy violations, San Diego State University and Delta Sigma Phi Fraternity have worked in concert to address conduct concerns. As a result, Delta Sigma Phi Fraternity has Delta Sigma Phi Fraternity Decision Letter Page 2

closed the Gamma Alpha Chapter. Delta Sigma Phi and San Diego State University have agreed that the earliest date for recolonization would be Fall 2016. The return date is subject to review, pending any additional acts of incivility and inappropriate behavior.

When the national organization negotiates the return of the colony, the organization must agree not to utilize housing for the organization until the colony reaches full charter status. Upon their return to housing, the chapter must agree to maintain an alcohol and drug free environment both in the chapter house and individually-leased spaces (bedrooms, apartments, etc). The chapter is to employ a full-time house manager to address behavioral issues and advise the chapter. The organization will also create an advising panel that will provide individual advising for each chapter officer.

Lastly, individuals involved in the Harassment policy violation will be referred to the San Diego State University Title IX Coordinator, Jessica Rentto. Individual members may also be referred to the Center for Student Rights and Responsibilities. Additional information regarding the incidents will also be sent to the Center for Student Rights and Responsibilities to address inconsistencies from the outgoing executive board during their individual judicial meetings addressing the October 31, 2014 incident.

To appeal this decision, please contact Associate Vice President for Student Affairs Christy Samarkos (csamarko@mail.sdsu.edu) and Director of Student Life and Leadership Randy Timm (rtimm@mail.sdsu.edu) within ten (10) business days. The appeal request must contain which part(s) of the decision the colony is appealing and the colony's justification for the appeal. A meeting will then be scheduled to further discuss the incident.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with us in Delta Sigma Phi's informal conference. We hope that the imposed sanctions will contribute to the future success of Delta Sigma Phi at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Christy Samarkos, Randy Timm, Jordan Lewton and me on December 18, 2014 to discuss the alleged policy violations that took place during the Fall 2014 semester with Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity. During our meeting, we discussed alleged policy violations including Health and Safety, Harassment and Abusive Behavior, Alcohol and Illegal Drugs. During our conversation and in writing, you provided us with information about each of the alleged incidents. You confirmed that there were Sigma Alpha Epsilon related events that took place on October 11, 2014 and October 24, 2014. Additionally, you described the risk management of each of these events. In addition to discussing the alleged incidents, we discussed University concerns including the culture and climate of the chapter at SDSU.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including the informal conference and information provided by the chapter, I have found Sigma Alpha Epsilon to be in violation of the Health and Safety and Alcohol policies.

As a result of the Health and Safety and Alcohol policy violations, Sigma Alpha Epsilon is sanctioned to probation, effective immediately and through August 15, 2015. Additionally, Sigma Alpha Epsilon is to complete the following educational stipulations, some of which were suggested by the chapter during the informal conference. Those suggested by the chapter are signified with an asterisk (\*). **Failure to complete these sanctions may result in immediate Interim Suspension.** 

- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will work with Student Life Advisor Jordan Lewton to insure that rosters accurately reflect chapter membership with an initial update to be completed by February 6, 2015
- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will work with Student Life Advisor Jordan Lewton and Assistant Director Caryl Montero-Adams, in consultation with the Sigma Alpha Epsilon national office and local advisors, to develop a recruitment plan to be implemented beginning Fall 2015
- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will host sexual assault trainings in consultation with their national insurance company, Favor Insurance Company, which would be open to the SDSU community before the end of the 2014-15 academic year\*
- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will self-impose a probation on social events (using IFC definitions from November 2014) and implement a dry chapter house for the entirety of the Spring 2015 term\*
- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will implement two trainings a semester each academic term, where 100 percent of membership will be trained on sexual violence, effective immediately. One of the trainings each semester must be implemented with another chapter (fraternity or sorority) from a council outside of IFC\*
- Sigma Alpha Epsilon, in consultation with the Health Promotion Department, will enroll a minimum of four members n FratMANers effective Spring 2015\*

- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will create a FratMANers chair position within the chapter so that information can be presented to the chapter from the class\*
- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will opt out of Spring Recruitment during the Spring 2015 term\*

In addition to the above sanctions, Sigma Alpha Epsilon's SDSU chapter and national office discussed imposing a Membership Review. The Sigma Alpha Epsilon national office also discussed the opportunity to impose an Alumni Commission. San Diego State University enthusiastically supports the implementation of both of these sanctions and would extend assistance throughout these processes.

We also look forward to Sigma Alpha Epsilon's participation in additional programs that will be implemented in the Spring 2015 semester, including Agent of Change and other events related to sexual violence awareness and prevention occurring throughout the term.

Lastly, Sigma Alpha Epsilon will be held to a sanction imposed earlier in the semester regarding the Animals policy violation. As a reminder, this sanction stated that Sigma Alpha Epsilon must plan and implement a risk management seminar with 90% of chapter members in attendance that focuses on the intent versus the impact of chapter activities. The planning of this seminar should include advising and approval from SDSU Greek Life staff (Jordan Lewton, Caryl Montero-Adams). This seminar must be held by February 1, 2015.

Typically, when a chapter is on probation they are unable to participate in some Greek community events. However, Sigma Alpha Epsilon is expressly permitted to participate in Greek Week. Participation in additional Greek-wide activities should be approved three weeks in advance. Requests should be sent to Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life and Leadership for Greek Life.

At this time, there is no further action that needs to be taken regarding the alleged illegal drugs or harassment and abusive behavior violations that were investigated in this meeting.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with us in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Sigma Alpha Epsilon at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Jordan Lewton and me on February 27, 2015 to discuss the alleged policy violations that took place on January 18/19, 2015 with Nu Alpha Kappa Fraternity. During our meeting, you informed us that NAK had initiated new members on the evening of Sunday, January 18, 2015. You also stated that following the initiation of new members, NAK hosted a celebration at the Nu Alpha Kappa house. Additionally, you informed us that at the celebration, which occurred during the early morning hours of January 19, 2015, members—both active and new—consumed tequila. You continued, stating that during the celebration, one new member informed the brothers that he was going to be picked up at 7:00am by his family. You explained that at this time, this new member was not permitted to drink anymore and was taken to a residence of a brother. You continued, explaining that when the family arrived, the newly initiated member was still intoxicated and was later taken to the hospital by the family. In addition to being forthcoming with this information, you also explained that NAK has met with the family of the new member.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, which includes your admission, I have found Nu Alpha Kappa to be in violation of the Alcohol and Hazing policies.

As a result of the Alcohol policy violation, Nu Alpha Kappa is sanctioned to probation, effective immediately and ending on December 31, 2015. Additionally, Nu Alpha Kappa is responsible for the following stipulations:

- During the 2015-16 academic year, all aspects of the recruitment and intake process for the fraternity must occur in the Conrad Prebys Aztec Student Union or another approved location at San Diego State University
- During the 2015-16 academic year, individuals who are going through the intake process are not permitted to be in the Nu Alpha Kappa house or on the premises without an advisor present until the individual is a fully initiated member of the fraternity
- For the 2015-16 academic year, the fraternity's executive board and new member education offices must be approved by Student Life & Leadership staff
- During the term of the probation, Nu Alpha Kappa must host a risk management program on alcohol at least once per semester utilizing the Health Promotion Department on campus or another approved source

Thank you for meeting with Jordan Lewton and me on April 30, 2015 to discuss the alleged policy violations that took place on April 25, 2015 at Kappa Sigma Fraternity. During our meeting, you confirmed that Kappa Sigma did have a social event on April 24, 2015. You described, in detail, the layout of the event and the risk management procedure. You explained that the social event began around 10:00pm and was cleared out by 11:30pm. You also insisted that there was no hard liquor at the event.

In addition to the information you provided, we discussed the several inconsistencies between the police report and your account of the evening. This includes the type of alcohol that was provided and the fact a social event occurred. We also discussed the five underage transports that occurred between 12:00am and 2:00am on April 25, 2015 citing Kappa Sigma.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation and based on the preponderance of the evidence, I have found Kappa Sigma to be in violation of the Alcohol policy.

As a result of Alcohol policy violation, Kappa Sigma is sanctioned to Probation effective immediately and ending on June 1, 2016. In addition to Probation, Kappa Sigma must complete the following stipulations:

- During the term of the probation, alcohol is prohibited at all events, including those off campus
- During the term of the probation, all on and off campus activities should be registered with Greek Life staff at SDSU
- The fraternity's entire executive board must meet with Greek Life staff at the beginning of the 2015-16 academic year, prior to Fall Recruitment
- During the term of the probation, Kappa Sigma must host a risk management program on alcohol at least once per semester utilizing the Health Promotion Department on campus or another approved source
- Kappa Sigma must also complete the previously stipulation development of a comprehensive social event management policy that includes how the fraternity will ensure attendees are over 21+ and/or how the risk of underage drinking will be managed in the future (stipulation of Formal Warning, April 2015)

Failure to complete these sanctions may result in immediate Interim Suspension.

Thank you for meeting with Jordan Lewton and me on April 28, 2015 to discuss the alleged policy violations that took place on throughout the semester, on March 20, 2015 and on April 23, 2015 at Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity. During our meeting, you confirmed that Sigma Phi Epsilon had social events on March 20 and April 23, 2015. You described, in detail, the layout of the event and that a mixed drink with liquor was served in the house. You explained that Sigma Phi Epsilon received a First Response Notice and was CAPP'ed on March 20, causing the chapter to receive an Administrative Citation and a \$13,000 fine on April 23, 2015.

In addition to the two social events, we also discussed the damages caused to the Wesley Foundation fence and the state of the outdoor space at the Sigma Phi Epsilon house. You stated that the damage to the fence was likely caused by people trying to climb over the fence during social events hosted by Sigma Phi Epsilon.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, which includes your admission, I have found Sigma Phi Epsilon to be in violation of the Alcohol, Noise, Noise and Neighbor Relations and Property Damage policies.

As a result of these policy violations, Sigma Phi Epsilon is sanctioned to Probation effective immediately and ending on June 1, 2016. In addition to Probation, Sigma Phi Epsilon must complete the following stipulations:

- During the term of the probation, alcohol is prohibited at all events, including those off campus
- During the term of the probation, all on and off campus activities should be registered with Greek Life staff at SDSU

During our conversation you confirmed that Sigma Alpha Epsilon hosted a social event at the fraternity house on November 7, 2015. You explained that the event theme was "Career Day." Additionally, you confirmed that a banner with the following statements was hung as a decoration:

It is important to note that the banner targeted a specific student at San Diego State University, which was discussed in the meeting.

During the meeting, you stated that you removed the banner when you returned from the Pi Beta Phi date dance, which was after the social had begun. In addressing the banner within the chapter, you stated that the organization removed the Social Chair , from his role. Additionally, you provided the name of the individual, to the individual to have the fraternity has taken steps to hold individuals accountable for the incident.

However, because the banner was hung for an ambiguous amount of time where members of Sigma Alpha Epsilon had the opportunity to remove it, the scope of the incident is beyond individual accountability. Members of the chapter were exposed to the banner and chose to keep it hung on a wall in a high-traffic area of the house. Therefore, in addition to Frame's alleged involvement in the creation of the banner, the fraternity is complicit. The responsibility of addressing sexual harassment in Sigma Alpha Epsilon cannot exclusively fall on the president.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including the informal conference and investigative interviews. I have found Sigma Alpha Epsilon to be in violation of the Harassment and Abusive Behavior policy.

As a result of the Harassment and Abusive Behavior policy violations, Sigma Alpha Epsilon is sanctioned to probation, effective immediately and through November 7, 2016. Additionally, Sigma Alpha Epsilon is to complete the following educational stipulations:

- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will work with Student Life Advisor Jordan Lewton and Assistant Director Caryl Montero-Adams in identifying a Faculty/Staff Advisor by April 1, 2016.
- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will work with Student Life Advisor Jordan Lewton and Assistant Director Caryl Montero-Adams, in consultation with the Sigma Alpha Epsilon national office and local advisors, to identify best practices around risk reduction and develop a risk management plan template for the chapter to institutionalize. A draft of the risk management plan is due on May 1, 2016 and the final template is due on September 30, 2016.
- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will host a program discussing sexual harassment and the objectification of women during both the Spring 2016 and Fall 2016 terms. The deadlines are May 1, 2016 and October 15, 2016 respectively. It is the expectation that Sigma Alpha Epsilon consults with San Diego State University staff in the conception and implementation of the programs and that Caryl Montero-Adams advises on the events. 90% of members must be in attendance at both programs.
- Sigma Alpha Epsilon will not have any social events with alcohol during the term of the probation.

#### Failure to complete these sanctions may result in immediate Interim Suspension.

Typically, when a chapter is on probation they are unable to participate in some Greek community events. Participation in Greek-wide activities should be approved three weeks in advance. Requests should be sent to Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life and Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams and Jordan Lewton on April 6, 2016 to discuss the alleged Hazing policy violations that took place on November 14, 2015 at the Pi Beta Phi chapter facility, During our meeting, Caryl Montero-Adams outlined the process and findings of Fratemity & Sorority Life's investigation.

Throughout the investigation, which included interviews of 26 new, active and executive board members, it was found that the new members were confined to the facility's bedrooms in groups ranging from six to nine new members for approximately eight hours, with an estimated time frame of 7:30am-3:30pm. It was found that shortly after arriving to the house, the new members were ushered upstairs where they found a Post-It note on a bedroom door with their name on it, identifying their assigned room. The new members then waited in the rooms until they were escorted downstairs to the Chapter Room for initiation. With the exception of legacies, two members were initiated at a time and the process of escorting the members to and from the bedrooms and the performing the ritual took approximately 10-15 minutes. Once a new member was initiated, they were escorted back upstairs and placed in a new bedroom. Legacies were permitted to leave with their mom, grandmother, and/or aunt after they were initiated. Once all 80+ new members were initiated, the women met with the former president, who explained the ritual. Following their brief meeting with the former president, the new members were escorted downstairs for a celebration.

While the new members were in the bedrooms, there were expectations that they remain quiet, that they ask to use the restroom and that they refrain from flushing the toilet. It was also found that cell phones were collected and that the new members were not allowed to do homework. Purses and other belongings were placed in the hallway, but the new members could have access to their snacks, water bottles, sweaters and jackets.

The experiences of the new members also varied based on the bedrooms they were placed in. Some new members had access to sitting on beds, while other groups did not. Some rooms had blankets for the new members to use, while others did not. Some live-in active members had placed an assortment of snacks and water in the rooms, while others did not. The level of access to beds, blankets, food and water impacted the experience

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, I have found Pi Beta Phi to be in violation of the Hazing policy. It should be noted that hazing was found in the practice of

As a result of Hazing policy violation, Pi Beta Phi is sanctioned to Probation effective immediately and ending on June 1, 2017. In addition to Probation, Pi Beta Phi must complete the following stipulations:

- During the term of the probation, Pi Beta Phi must work with their AACs, Chapter Support Officer, and
  Headquarters, as well as Fraternity & Sorority Life Staff to evaluate and redesign initiation day for both large
  and small new member classes. A new process should be approved by Pi Beta Phi Fraternity for Women
  Headquarters and Fraternity & Sorority Life Staff (Caryl Montero-Adams) at least one month prior to the date of
  initiation during the Fall 2016 and Spring 2017 terms.
- Pi Beta Phi must host two hazing prevention workshops at least one month prior to the Fall 2016 initiation.

   Life staff. The first workshop must have 95% of active members in attendance and the second workshop must have 95% of new members in attendance.

  Sorority Life Staff to discuss the investigation and answer questions from the chapter.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life and Matthew Garcia, Student Affairs Assistant for Fraternity & Sorority Life on December 14, 2016. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed events that occurred on September 3, 2016 and September 24, 2016, which resulted in alleged violations of the Alcohol at Off-Campus Events and Hazing policies.

During the conversation, outgoing Phi Kappa Thera President stated that the fraternity hosted an event in the chapter facility on September 3, 2016 where active members, potential members that were "looking to rush" Phi Kappa Thera, and "girls" they knew or met were invited. stated that the invitation list was electronic and that the apartments were blocked off to account for risk management. further explained that no one was able to get in unless they were on the guest list.

The group discussed two transports that occurred after the individuals transported reportedly consumed alcohol at the chapter facility. The individuals were underage and transported from the residence halls to the hospital due to their level of intoxication.

A SnapChat video of alcohol and allegedly completing three handle pulls was shown admitted that there were handles of vodka (estimated 20 handles) and boxes of wine (estimated 8 boxes) available for consumption and there was no restraint on who consumed alcohol at the event. The alcohol was paid for by individual brothers of the fraterinty.

When asked about the alleged handle pulls in the SnapChat video, maintained that he was drinking water from the bottles. When asked if everyone in the space knew that he was drinking water, stated that most people would not have known that he was drinking water. To this end, Montero-Adams and discussed the power dynamic that the perception of the behavior creates within a group. Specifically, it was discussed that the chapter president appeared to be engaging in a high-risk behavior in front of a group of prospective members and first year students, which demonstrates that the overconsumption is encouraged amongst the fraternity

also shared that he had consulted with the Interfraternity Council prior to the event and that IFC had allegedly confirmed that the chapter could host the event.



During the conversation, the group also discussed the allegation of a satellite party on September 24, 2016. The group talked about a message that was sent by member that used graphic language to invite guests to the party. and incoming president indicated that satellite party occurred, new members were present and alcohol was consumed. Additionally and indicated that they gave new members expectations around drinking should they choose to drink and idicated that although the event occurred, the chapter did not condone the message than sent. As a consequence of this message, was suspended from Phi Kappa Theta Documentation of fraternity status was requested during the Informal Conference, but was not provided by the chapter.

Lastly, the group discussed the Interim Suspension and events that were submitted for review. Specifically, there were expressed concerns with a risk management plan for an auction that were necessary to address prior to approval; the items were not addressed and the event was bosted without prior University approval.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, I have found Phi Kappa Theta to be in violation of the Alcohol at Off-Campus Events, Hazing and Failure to Comply policies.

### (4-22) Alcohol at Off-Campus Events

- 1. Organizations are expected to be familiar with and comply with State of California laws regulating the sale and consumption of alvoholic beverages.
- Unless held at a licensed establishment with professional bartenders, hard liquor (alcoholic beverages other than beer or wine) shall not be consumed at organization events.
- 3 Open parties, meaning those with unrestricted access by non-members without specific invitation, where alcoholic beverages are present are forbidden.
- 6. No organization shall permit any person who is under the age of 21 or who is obviously intoxicated to consume alcoholic beverages at organization functions.
- 7. At events where the number of guests exceeds the number of members, private, licensed security guards, or employees of licensed establishment, shall be responsible for checking the identification and providing wristbands or hand-stamps to persons over the age of 21 who wish to consume alcoholic beverages. The security personnel are responsible for patrolling the event to ensure that only those persons with the designate wristband or hand-stamp are consuming alcoholic beverages.
- 22. Commonly referred to as "Dry Feriod," recognized student organizations, fraternity and scrovity events must be alcohol-free from August 1-October 1 during the Fall semester.

#### (7-4) Hazing and Initiation

Hazing is defined as any method of indoctrination, initiation or pre-initiation into a student organization, or any other organization-related activity, which, regardless of location, intent, membership status or rank of the



Division of Student Affairs

participants, or the express or implied consent of the participants, causes, or is reasonably likely to cause, physical or mental injury, substantial mental or physical discomfort or stress, personal degradation, harassment or intimidation of or to any former, current or prospective student of any education institution. Hazing also includes any activity that compels a student to participate in any activity that is unlawful, publicly indecent or contrary to the policies and regulations of the University, a any activity that unreasonably and materially interferes with a student's academic efforts.

### (10-4) 16. Failure to Comply

Failure to comply with directions or interference with any University official or any public safety officer while acting in the performance of his/her duties.

As a result of Alcohol at Off-Campus Events, Hazing, and Failure to Comply policy violations, Phi Kappa Theta is sanctioned to Suspension in Abeyance (not activated) effective immediately and ending on June 1, 2018 followed by a subsequent year of Probation, ending on June 1, 2019. Any further violations of University policy during the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation will result in the removal of recognition of Phi Kappa Theta at San Diego State University. Considering the breadth of the fraternity's behavioral history and the recent incidents, it has become necessary to assign an elevated sanction. Please understand that much like the Alumni Receivership assigned by the executive office of Phi Kappa Theta Fraternity, this status is intended to provide the final opportunity for the chapter to demonstrate the ability to govern. In addition to Suspension in Abeyance and Probation, Phi Kappa Theta must complete the following atipulations:

#### Housing

House Director. Phi Kappa Theta Fraternity will employ a house director in an ongoing, permanent capacity. Phi Kappa Theta alumni, executive office staff and SDSU's Fraternity & Sorority Life staff will collaboratively develop a position description and expectations for the house director to be posted by March 1, 2017. The selection and move-in of the house director must occur prior to July 1, 2017. The House Director must be trained prior to August 1, 2017. Phi Kappa Theta will not have access to the chapter facility if a house director is not employed by July 1, 2017. For future searches, the fraternity must hire a House Director by the first of July prior to the start of the upcoming academic year. The alumni, executive office and University staff will also develop expectations should a vacancy arise during the academic year.

House Management Plan. Phi Kappa Theta alumni advisors, chapter executive board officers and the house director will work with Student Life & Leadership staff and consult with Fraternity Row staff to develop a house management plan. The house management plan will be reviewed and implemented annually and will address topical areas including: move-in, move-out, facility maintenance, member accountability for damages, etc. The fraternity will establish the first planning meeting by March 1, 2017. The House Management Plan for the 2017-18 academic year must be finalized by July 31, 2017.



Live-In Meeting. As part of the House Management Plan, the executive board, with the presence of at least one Alumni Advisor and the House Director, will host a meeting for live-in members three times per semester. Specifically, the chapter will host meetings:

- Within 72 hours of move-in (Fall) and during the first weekend of the semester (Spring)
- Mid-semester (Fall and Spring)
- 7-14 days prior to the end of the somester (Fall and Spring)

The purpose of the meetings will be to address any processes and trends, as well as to set expectations for the chapter facility. Additionally, a meeting with live-ins who have signed a lease for the upcoming academic year must be convened by April 30 annually.

Executive Board Live-In Training. The Phi Kappa Theta President, alumni advisor, House Director and Froternity & Sorority Life staff will develop a training program for the live-in executive board members of the fraternity. The training should identify and reflect the needs of the fraternity. The training will be facilitated prior to the beginning of the Fall term and within the first two weeks of the Spring term. An annual review of the training should occur during the Spring semester, with the curriculum being reviewed by Fraternity & Sorority Life staff and finalized by July 1. During the inaugural training, Fall 2017, the curriculum must be finalized by July 31, 2017 to account for the participation of the House Director.

Sophomore Success Program Adherence. During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation, Phi Kappa Theta must adhere to the new guidelines established as part of the Sophomore Success Program. To this end, the fraternity will not be eligible to apply to house suphomores in the chapter facility until the process is implemented for the 2020-21 academic year.

### Events and Activities

Educational Workshops. Phi Kappa Theta is expected to host ongoing educational workshops for members of the chapter. Specifically, the following workshops are stipulated for the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation and must have 90% chapter participation:

- · Semesterly: Alcohol and Other Drugs
- Spring 2017: Power within the Group Dynamic
- Fall 2017: Hazing
- Spring 2018: Bystander Effect and How to Intervene (can include but may not exclusively focus on sexual violence)
- Fall 2018: Hazing
- Spring 2019: Post-Probation Risk Management

Fraternity & Sorority Life can advise on presenters and workshop development. It is expected that the chapter leadership will schedule a meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams to review and advise on the workshops and identify presenters. Documentation of workshop completion must be sent to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff within 24-hours of the workshops. Documentation should be in Google Slides format and include photos.



presenter information, a list of participants (last name, first name, Red ID), the strengths of the workshops and the opportunities for growth

Risk Management Plan Development Workshop. Phi Kappa Theta's executive board and at least one alumnital advisor will work with Caryl Montero-Adams to facilitate a workshop that helps the executive board forecast risk in events and identifies best practices for risk management. Additionally, the board will develop a risk management plan, with the potential of being modified to meet the needs for future events. The workshop must occur during the Spring 2017 semester with at least two weeks notice.

#### Events and Activities

Event Proposals and Risk Management Plans. During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation. Phi Kappa Theta must submit a proposal with risk management plans for all events hosted or co-hosted by the chapter to Fraternity & Sorority Life. Despite location, the events must follow the University's three-week event approval process and risk management plans must be submitted for all events.

Advisor Presence. During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation, an advisor is expected to be present during the duration of chapter events. The House Director may also serve in this capacity.

Events with Alcohol. During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance. Phi Kappa Theta may not host any events with alcohol. When the chapter's status transitions to Probation, Phi Kappa Theta may host two events with alcohol. Specifically, the chapter can host one event per semester during the 2018-19 academic year, which must be on-campus and follow all University and fraternity policies. Outside of the events with alcohol, the chapter may host dry socials that follow the event approval process outlined above:

#### Recruitment and New Member Processes

Recruitment. During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation, the chapter may recruit no more than 30 new members during the Fall semester and no more than 20 members in the Spring semester.

Pre-Recruitment Meeting. The chapter must host a pre-recruitment meeting with the executive board, 90% of membership and alumni advisor(s) prior to any recruitment activities each semester. This meeting will establish the process and expectations around recruiting new members. Hazing, alcohol and other drugs must be discussed during the meeting to mitigate the risk of these behaviors during recruitment and throughout the new member process.

New Member Process. With the exception of events held during the designated IFC recruitment period, the entirety of the new member process must occur in on-campus facilities during the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation.



Advisor Presence. At least one advisor must be present during all recruitment and new member activities, with the exception of those hosted by the Interfraternity Council held on campus.

#### Disclosure

Disclosure. It is expected that all members, associate members and potential new members are made aware of the Suspension in Abeyance, Probation and all stipulations. It is vital to the sustainability of the chapter that the entire membership understands the outcome of the investigation and expectations of members in this process.

Failure to complete these sanctions may result in the immediate closure of Phi Kappa Theta Fraternity.

The University also recognizes the status of the chapter is currently Alumni Receivership. As such, the University understands that the executive board will be managed by the alumni until further notice. To this end, Fraternity & Sorority Life staff and the University is committed to working with the alumni and students to ensure the fraternity's process is supported. In addition to the stipulations above, please send the names, contact information and specific advisory roles of those advisors who will be working with the chapter during the Suspension in Abeyance, Probation and Alumni Receivership to Caryl Montero-Adams by February 1, 2017. It is encouraged that the chapter-both alumni and student leaders--meet with Fraternity & Sorority Life staff on a monthly basis during the term of the University and Executive Office sanctions.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Montero-Adams and Matthew Garcia in the informal conference.

As previously mentioned, this is the University's effort to provide developmental guidelines so that the chapter can institutionalize change with the goal of self-governance. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Phi Kappa Theta at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Curyl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraterinty & Scienty Life on March 6, 2017. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed initial reports of events that occurred in September, October and December of 2016, which resulted in alleged violations of the Alcohol at Off-Campus Events, Hazing and Harassment and Abusive Behavior policies. The group also discussed Hazing and Alcohol at Off-Campus Events allegations that were reported during the investigation and allegedly occurred over time and in March 2017 (respectively). The March 2017 Alcohol at Events Off-Campus policy violation would also be an allegation of the Failure to Comply policy, as the action may have been in violation of the Interim Suspension. The group also discussed an overview of the investigation, including interviews, reports and other documentation.

During the conversation, President and Advisor Javier Gomez represented the fraternity and President and Vice President for Judicial Affairs Kevin Sargent were present on behalf of IFC. Below is the account, by allegation, of the informal conference.

#### **Flazing Allegations**

The group discussed the initial hazing allegations that occurred in September 2016. It was reported that a new member, who had been a potential new member of an expanding fraternity, informed the professional staff consultant that he was required to complete exercises early in the morning at the Phi Gamma Delta chapter facility the week after bid day. This information was later reported to the University and the Phi Gamma Delta international headquarters.

The group also discussed allegations that were reported to the University during the course of the investigation. Specifically, it was reported that there is ongoing hazing within Phi Gamma Delta, including an I-Week where new members are expected to live in one room in the chapter house with a chicken, as well as meal plan requirements (deprivation, requirement to use on actives), being compelled to drink alcohol and participation in sensory stimulating activities. It was also reported that the new members were dropped off at an undisclosed location and were required to find their way back to the chapter facility, in the dark, with no cell phones.

When discussing these allegations, President and denied the hazing behaviors were occurring in the chapter. The group discussed the interviews conducted with members, which also denied the behaviors and described the new member process. The group then discussed an overview of the new member process, which includes an 8-week



educational process designed by the International Headquarters, meetings at the house, and the time commitment equivalent of a 1-unit class.

### Alcohol at Events Off-Campus Allegations

The group discussed reports of an event that allegedly occurred at the chapter facility on October 15, 2016. In the reports from the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities, two transports had allegedly occurred as a result of a social event. The group discussed the transports, one related to level of intoxication and one due to injury. Both individuals who were interviewed by the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities named "FIJI" as the organization hosting the event. One outlined that they were underage, that there were no ID checks, no wristbands, that mixed drinks were out on a table and that shots were also available. The individual also reported that they were given a yellow pill at the party. The other individual who was interviewed described FIJI as a "less sketchy frat" and that they brought their own alcohol because FIJI is known for not providing a lot. President and described that the fratemity did not host any social event that night or during that weekend.

December 3, 2016 was the reported date of the following Alcohol at Events Off-Campus policy violation. During the Informal Conference and investigation. President and described that the incident as being a result of an informal "Open House Policy," where any member can come back to the house at any time, and that guests are permitted to come with them. During the incident on December 3, 2016, members and their dates returned from sorority formals and came over to the house. It was reported that no alcohol was present at the house.

Lastly, on March 6, 2017 it was reported that the fraternity hosted a social event on March 4, 2017. Reportedly, there was a "cuffs" event that occurred that weekend and photo documentation of and was sent to Assistant Director Montero-Adams. The photo documentation shows the members listed handcuffed to dates and alcohol in the photos and references to a "cuffs" theme in Instagram captions. When discussed during the informal conference, President detried any knowledge of the event, stated that it was not hosted in the chapter house and that they had not seen the posts on social media. The group discussed that organization events are not location-bound and events can be organizationally-related and bound to policy despite location or if they are "chapter sanctioned."

During the course of the investigation and during the Informal Conference, President — was transparent in that he recognizes the fraternity's policy related to dry housing. However, to engage older members, the fraternity described that they allow those who are 21 years old to have one 6-pack of beer in the chapter facility. Additionally, the "Open House" policy was reiterated throughout the investigation and during the Informal Conference.

## Harassment and Abusive Behavior Allegations

A sexual assault reportedly occurred during the December 3, 2016 event. During the Informal Conference, Assistant Director Montero-Adams outlined that the report was made to Fraternity & Sorority Life from a campus partner and was referred to the Deputy Title IX Coordinator. Plows described, in a meeting immediately following the incident, during



a later interview and at the Informal Conference, that the incident was reported to him that night, he spoke with survivor at their request the next day and the alleged member was expelled from the fraternity on December 4, 2016.

The group discussed the Greek Life Reporting Protocol, the responsibility to report incidents and how to report assaults confidentially as chapters do not have a mandatory reporting responsibility. The group also discussed the nature and differences of individual and organizational responsibility.

#### Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference. I have found Phi Gamma Delta to be in violation of the Alcohol at Off-Campus Events and Failure to Comply policies.

## (4-22) Alcohol at Off-Campus Events

- 1. Organizations are expected to be familiar with and comply with State of California laws regulating the sale and causimption of alcoholic beverages.
- 2 Unless held at a licensed establishment with professional bartenders, hard liquor (alcohalic beverages other than beer or wine) shall not be consumed at argunization events.
- 3. Open parties, meaning those with unrestricted access by non-members without specific invitation, where alcoholic beverages are present are forbidden.
- No organization shall permit any person who is under the age of 21 or who is obviously intoxicated to consume alcoholic beverages at organization functions.
- 16. At "BYOB" functions, individuals 21 years of age or older may being not more than a six-pack of 12 ounce beers (two individuals arriving together may bring a twelve-pack) or a four-pack of 12 ounce wine coolers).

Any further violations of University policy during the term of the Probation may result in an immediate Interim Suspension of the fraternity. In addition to Probation, Phi Gamma Delta must complete the following stipulations:

Educational Workshops. Phi Gamma Delta is expected to host ongoing educational workshops for members of the chapter. Specifically, the following workshops are stipulated for the term of the Probation and must have 90% chapter participation:

· Semesterly: Alcohol and Other Drugs



· Full 2017; Hazing

Spring 2018; Post-Probation Risk Management

Fraternity & Sorority Life can advise on presenters and workshop development. It is expected that the chapter leadership will schedule a meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams to review and advise on the workshops and identify presenters. Documentation of workshop completion must be sent to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff within 24-hours of the workshops. Documentation should be in Google Slides format and include phoros, presenter information, a list of participants (last name, first name, Red ID), the strengths of the workshops and the opportunities for growth.

Risk Management Plan Development Workshop. Phi Gamma Delta's executive board and at least one alumni advisor will work with Caryl Montero-Adams to facilitate a workshop that helps the executive board forecast risk in events and identifies best practices for risk management. Additionally, the board will develop a risk management plan, with the potential of being modified to meet the needs for future events. The workshop must occur during Summer 2017 or the Fall 2017 semester with at least two weeks notice and before any events are approved.

Pre-Recruitment Meeting. The chapter must host a pre-recruitment meeting with the executive board, 90% of membership and alumni advisor(s) prior to any recruitment activities each semester. This meeting will establish the process and expectations around recruiting new members and how new members are engaged during their first semester. Hazing, alcohol and other drugs must be discussed during the meeting to mitigate the risk of these behaviors. A member of the Fraternity & Sorority Life staff team must also be present.

#### Events and Activities

Event Proposals and Risk Management Plans. During the term of the Probation, Phi Gamma Delta must submit a proposal with detailed risk management plans for all events hosted or co-hosted by the chapter to Fraternity & Sorority Life. Despite location, the events must follow the University's three-week event approval process and risk management plans must be submitted for all events.

Advisor Presence. During the term of the Probation, an advisor is expected to be present during the duration of all chapter events/meetings.

Events with Alcohol. During the term of the Probation, Phi Gamma Delta may host up to two events with alcohol. Specifically, the chapter can host one event with alcohol per semester during the 2017-18 academic year, which must be on-campus and follow all University and fraternity policies. Outside of the events with alcohol, the chapter may host dry socials that follow the event approval process outlined above.

#### Disclosure

Disclosure, it is expected that all members, new members and potential new members are made aware of the Probation and all stipulations. It is vital to the sustainability of the chapter that the entire membership understands the outcome of the investigation and expectations of members in this process.



To ensure that potential new members are aware of the chapter's status, it is an expectation that an announcement is made at each Phi Gamma Delta recruitment event by alumni advisor(s) during the Fall 2017 and Spring 2018 semesters.

Failure to complete these sanctions may result in the interim suspension of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity.

At this time, there is not a preponderance of the evidence to find the fraternity responsible for the Hazing policy violations. Please be advised that although the fraternity was not found responsible for the University's Hazing policy, we take reports very seriously. We advise that the fraternity assesses all recruitment, new member and initiation practices. Furthermore, if during the chapter's assessment unveils behaviors that could constitute hazing, the fraternity must alter these behaviors to align with the safety and welfare of members, University policy, fraternity policy and the law. We encourage the chapter to consult with the Phi Gamma Delta International Headquarters to support this endeavor.

Lastly, it is recognized that the timeline for the interim suspension, informal conference and decision were delayed. During the course of the interim suspension, there were two additional reports that prolonged the investigation and anticipated length for the Interim Suspension. Please be advised that this was unforeseen and that the University appreciates the Executive Board's compliance.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Montero-Adams in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Phi Gamma Delta at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams on May 26, 2016 for the Informal Conference to discuss the alleged violations of the Hazing, Harassment and Abusive Behavior, Group Violence and Alcohol policies that took place during the Spring 2016 semester and after the Membership Intake Process of the 2014-15 academic year. During the meeting, Caryl Montero-Adams outlined the process and findings of Student Life & Leadership's investigation.

Throughout the investigation, which included reports from campus partners, communication with Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. Graduate Advisors and members, investigative interviews, photos and video, it was found that Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. was involved in several incidents with underlying interpersonal conflict.

#### Harassment & Abusive Behavior and Group Violence

During the course of the investigation, a recurring theme was the level of interpersonal conflict between the organization members that escalated into physical altercations or threatening behavior on three occasions. The first incident occurred on March 25, 2016 at an off-campus apartment complex. During an event hosted by NPHC fraternities, there was a fight that took place between members of the sorority. During the course of the investigation, video evidence of the altercation, which was circulated on social media, was reviewed and participation was confirmed in investigative interviews.

The second incident took place on April 15, 2016 at an event hosted in downtown San Diego by Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated. During the event, a member of the sorority was involved in a physical altereation with the cousin of an active member of the sorority. This altereation led into the third incident, which took place during the early morning hours of April 16, 2016. Members of the sorority who were not present during the event downtown arrived at the residence of several Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. members. It was reported that Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. members were looking for and threatening the sorority member that they had previously engaged in the first physical altereation and who had been in the second altereation that evening. It was reported that members of the fraternity had to intervene so that a third physical altereation did not occur.

#### Hazing

Throughout the course of the investigation, it was consistent by all members interviewed that there were no hazing behaviors that occurred during the formal Membership Intake Process. However, it was reported that at least two members of the organization participated in post-pledging bazing initiated by alumnae of the Mu lota chapter of Alpha

Decision Letter Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.

Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. Specifically, two undergraduate members described post-pledging practices that included servitude, degradation and physical exercises. The post-pledging was described as occurring in the Los Angeles area and facilitated by alumnae.

#### Investigation: Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated

Caryl Montero-Adams was interviewed by the Far Western Region's Investigative Team on October 1, 2016. During that meeting, Caryl Montero-Adams presented the slideshow that had been reviewed during the Informal Conference on May 26, 2016. The slideshow outlined the investigative process, documentation, alleged policy violations and key findings. In February 2017, Caryl Montero-Adams received Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. suspension notices for individual members of the organization. However, there was no documentation that the sorority as an organization was found responsible for violations of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated's Bylaws or Soror Code of Ethics. To this end, we believe that it is important to recognize that while individual misconduct was pervasive throughout the organization, interpersonal conflict within the sorority transitioned into behavior that constitutes organizational policy violations.

#### Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, I have found Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. to be in violation of the Hazing, Harassment & Abusive Behavior and Group Violence policies. I have found Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. not responsible for the Alcoholic Beverages at Events Off-Campus alleged violation.

As a result of Hazing, Harassment & Abusive Behavior and Group Violence policy violations, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. is sanctioned to Suspension. The earliest date that planning conversations regarding Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated's reactivation can begin is January 31, 2018 for a Fall 2018 reactivation.

In addition to the sanction of Suspension, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. must complete the following stipulations prior to and during the reactivation process:

#### Reactivation

- Prior to University's approval for reactivation, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. Graduate Advisors and
  the Far Western Regional Director will meet with Student Life & Leadership staff to discuss timeline,
  Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated's process and University process. To mitigate travel, this
  meeting can be convened using Skype or other electronic conferencing technologies. This meeting should
  occur at least six months prior to the desired reactivation and should be initiated by the Far Western
  Region Director of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.
- After the meeting and similar to letters sent during other fraternity/sorority establishment efforts, the
  University will issue a formal invitation letter to Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. This letter will outline
  expectations discussed during the previous meeting, including the Membership Intake Process, the
  Recognized Student Organization process, and expectations around Greek Accreditation and membership.

### Membership

Members of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. who were active during the 2015-16 academic year and
who were found to have participated in the alleged incidents may not engage with the Mu Iota
undergraduate chapter during and after the reactivation. If graduated, the individuals may not serve in
advisory roles and may not have contact with undergraduate members.

#### Advisors

- Faculty/Staff and Graduate Advisors and alumnae of the organization who were named as part of the incidents may not engage with interests, the Membership Intake Process, or the active Mu Iota undergraduate chapter.
- Once the formal invitation for reactivation is sent to Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., the Graduate
  Advisors should begin to attend monthly advisor meetings hosted by Student Life & Leadership staff.
  Additionally, Graduate Advisors are expected to attend trainings facilitated by Student Life & Leadership staff as they are espoused.
- The Graduate Advisors should meet with Student Life & Leadership staff monthly to discuss the Mu Iota undergraduate chapter during the first academic year of the reactivation process.

Failure to complete these sauctions may result in the delayed or canceled reactivation of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. at San Diego State University.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Montero-Adams in the informal conference and during the investigative interview. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will ultimately contribute to the reactivation and success of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with mc on Friday. May 26, 2017 regarding the appeal of your fratemity judicial decision. I began the meeting by going over the purpose of our meeting. Specifically, I explained to you that this is an ad hoc appeal process, and that my function is to provide an objective review of the decision previously made.

My responsibility is to evaluate whether there are reasonable grounds for the decision/sanction, I can then sustain, modify in some specified way, or revoke the decision. It is not the function of this process to conduct a full hearing of all of the evidence.

During this meeting, you did not submit any documents.

## Summary

In an oral presentation, you and your advisor, Javier Gomez, summarized the rationale for the appeal.

The most pertinent points provided in your presentation were:

- Concerns regarding judicial meetings and decisions. Specifically:
  - a. Due process not being followed; Pictures were received the day of the informal conference regarding the "cuffs" event
  - There was not sufficient opportunity and therefore information was not received by the University prior to judicial decisions being made; not all parties were met with during the investigation
  - c. Events occurred at an off campus locations; not at the fraternity house
- 2. The organization has engaged in and begun taking steps to better the fraternity including: increased community service hours; summer preparation; adapting new member process; having the housing corporation and alumni be more present; and the creation of a development plan. Each of these measures in turn should shorten the length of the probationary status of the organization.

As part of this process, I have also had the opportunity to review the following documents provided to me:

- 1. Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity Interim Suspension Notice Letter; December 5, 2016
- 2. Informal Conference Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity PowerPoint presentation; March 6, 2017
- 3. Incident Reports, including pictures, of alleged violations against the fraternity
- 4. Student Life & Leadership Informal Conference Notes; March 6, 2017
- 5. Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity Decision Letter; April 12, 2017
- 6. Phi Gamma Delta Appeal Letter; undated

After reviewing the collective information I conclude the following:

Due process appears to have been granted to the organization in the investigative process. The concern was that a new allegation was introduced, with short notice, prior to the informal conference. Being that collective alcohol and hazing reports were being discussed, and the new reports were in line with the purpose of the informal conference, and the organization accepted the opportunity to discuss the new report as part of the informal conference, I do not believe the fraternity's due process rights were violated.

In regards to sufficient information not being received by Student Life & Leadership staff in order to make an appropriate decision, we discussed during the appeal meeting your concerns regarding members not having the opportunity to share their side of the story however, information received, shows that students had multiple opportunities to meet with the Student Life & Leadership staff and some did not respond to the opportunities/requests.

The event that occurred at an off campus location, has numerous pictures showing Phi Gamma Delta members involved and participating in the "cuffs" event. One member was identified as an Officer of the organization, which was disputed. However, the Registered Student Organization database listed that particular individual as an Officer. During the appeal meeting, we discussed the nature of that individual's role, which was "Member Educator", and though not an official Executive Officer of the organizations, it was noted, by you, that the role was one of the most important and highest positions within the organization. You stated that this role is responsible for new member education and the person who holds the role needs to have the following qualities: strong leadership skills; solid ethics; and be a good communicator. It was noted that this individual is "not chosen lightly, they are responsible for the building of the chapter members."

Taking into account this collective information, I conclude there are reasonable grounds for the original judicial disposition and sanctions. I believe that the aforementioned information shows that organizational policies were violated and that the sanctions and stipulations in the original decision are appropriate.

I am grateful and appreciative for the self initiated steps being taken to increase member and organization accountability, build a stronger brotherhood, provide better education and training, and increase the amount of community service that each member will be participating in as a part of Phi Gamma Delta. I believe that the strength of your organizations will be realized through the ongoing and collaborative relationship between Phi Gamma Delta and the Office of Student Life & Leadership.

Thank you for meeting with Dr. Randy Timm, Dean of Students, Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life, and me on October 9, 2017. During this meeting, we reviewed the status of the fraternity and additional alleged violations of the Student Organization Code of Conduct that occurred on September 1-September 2, 2017.

Prior to the meeting and per a decision letter issued in January 2017, Phi Kappa Theta's status with San Diego State University was Suspension in Abeyance with Stipulations through June 2018 followed by Probation with Stipulations through June 2019. Due to the breadth of policy violations over several years, Phi Kappa Theta was cautioned that any further violations of University policy during the term of the Suspension in Abeyance and Probation would result in the removal of recognition of Phi Kappa Theta at SDSU.

During the October 9th meeting, the status of the fraternity was reviewed and the documentation regarding the alleged violation was presented. As discussed in the meeting, Phi Kappa Theta was named during an incident (as Phi Kap) and following the incident (as Phi Kappa Theta) that resulted in a transport of a student due to their level of intoxication. The event was reported to have occurred off campus on September 1 into September 2, 2017, where an underage student consumed 6-7 mixed drinks that contained vodka and juice.

Based on information presented during the course of the investigation, the University finds Phi Kappa Theta to be in violation of the Alcohol policy of the Student Organization Code of Conduct;

b(2) Alcohol. Violation of applicable law o University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic beverages while on or off campus.

As a result of Alcohol policy violations, and the current status of the organization being on Suspension in Abeyance, I am accepting the recommendation that Phi Kappa Theta be sanctioned to Expulsion from San Diego State University. The closure of the chapter will remain in effect for a period of at least seven academic years. This timeline can be extended based on further acts of incivility, behavioral concerns or violations of campus policy or law. After the designated period for the closure (at minimum, seven years), the executive office of Phi Kappa Theta Fraternity is eligible to apply for expansion at San Diego State University following the Interfraternity Council process.

In addition to the University's findings, Phi Kappa Theta's National Board voted to remove the chapter's charter on October 12, 2017. The revocation of the charter is for a period of no less than five years.

As discussed in the October 9, 2017 meeting, the focus now shifts to how the chapter is closed, the facility is addressed and members are informed. The University will continue to offer support during this process.

Thank you for meeting with me on December 11, 2017. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a reported social event that occurred on October 20, 2017, which resulted in alleged violations of the Alcohol policy.

During the conversation, outgoing Commander is incoming Commander . former

Commander and Alumnus Advisor James Stark represented the fraternity. Additionally, Student Life Advisor for Fraternity & Sorority Life Matthew Garcia was present.

During the Informal Conference, the group discussed information that was presented during the course of the investigation. Specifically, the group reviewed the initial incident report from another chapter president following the Fraternity & Sorority Life Reporting Protocol when a member of their organization was transported to the hospital. A second incident report from the Residential Education Office was also discussed.

Following the review of the incident reports, the group discussed details that were founded through admission of the fraternity and in investigative interviews. Specifically, members of the fraternity disclosed that there was a social event on October 20, 2017 hold at a satellite house. There were 200-300 people at the event where hard liquor and kegs of beer were present and served. Reportedly, there was a guest list but the list was not followed. Additionally, the fraternity did not implement a process to verify the age of guests. The fraternity had a risk management team comprised of 21 members, all of whom had specific roles

In addition to reviewing the details of the incident on October 20, 2017, the group discussed a transport of an underage member that occurred in September 2017. Outside of the individual's membership, organizational involvement was not found during the course of the investigation.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference. I have found the Eta Kappa Colony of Sigma Nu Fratemity to be in violation of the Alcohol policy of the Student Organization Code of Conduct

b(2) Alcohol. Violation of applicable law or University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic beverages while on or off compus.

As a result of the Alcohol policy violation, Sigma Nu Fraternity is sanctioned to Probation with Stipulations through October 20, 2018.

Any further violations of University policy during the term of the Probation may result in an immediate Interim Suspension. Additional violations will also be communicated with the General Fraterinty, which may result in the discontinuation of the reestablishment effort by the General Fraterinty. In addition to the Probation, Signa Nu Fraterinty must complete the following stipulations:

#### University Support for Membership Review

Membership Review. It is the University's understanding that the General Fraternity will be conducting a membership review to January 2018. These efforts of the General Fraternity are supported by San Diego State University. Fraternity & Sorority Life staff will work with the General Fraternity to identify space on campus to conduct membership interviews. If other items are needed in this process, Fraternity & Sorority Life staff will work with the General Fraternity to address further needs

#### Chapter Education

Risk Management Policy Workshop: Eta Kappa must participate in a workshop jointly facilitated by General Fraternity staff and Fraternity & Sorority Life staff. The purpose of the workshop is to review University and Fraternity risk management policies. The fraternity must have 90% of members in attendance during the workshop and must be facilitated by February 1, 2018. The fraternity should verify attendance using the Presence platform

Alcohol Education. In flew of an alcohol education workshop, the University will recognize the 100% membership participation of Alcohol Edu for Sanctions, which is an online educational module provided by the General Fraternity. The online course should be completed by February 28, 2018. Fraternity & Sorority Life start will work with the General Fraternity to confirm participation of all members.

#### Events and Activities

Events with Alcohol. During the term of the Probation, Sigma Nu may not host events with alcohol

#### Disclosure

Disclosure. It is expected that all members, new members and potential new members are made aware of the Probation and all stipulations. It is vital to the sustainability of the organization at SDSU that the entire membership understands the outcome of the investigation and expectations of toembers in this process. Although this will be accomplished for all current members in the Risk Management Workshop, potential new members must also be made aware. To ensure that potential new members are aware of the fraternity's status, it is an expectation that an announcement is made at each Sigma Nu recruitment event by alumni advisor(s) during the Spring 2018 and Fall 2018 semesters.

Fallure to complete these sauctions may result in the Interim suspension of Sigma Nu Fraternity.

Lastly, it should be noted that the members interviewed, as well as Commander , were transparent and forthcoming during the investigation. The cooperation of the fraternity is acknowledged and appreciated.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with me in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incident and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Signa Nu at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life, and Matthew Garcia, Student Life Advisor for Fraternity & Sorority Life, on December 14, 2017 in an Informal Conference. During the Informal Conference, alleged Hazing policy violations that occurred during the Fall 2017 term within the Alpha chapter of Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Incorporated were discussed. During the meeting, President

Assistant Pledge Educator, and Alumna Advisor Susana Tello represented the sorority. United Sorority & Fraternity Council President Matthew Robison and Judicial Director Daniel Arteaga were also present.

During the Informal Conference, the group discussed information that was presented during the course of the investigation. Specifically, the group discussed that the initial incident report was submitted via email to the University's report hazing email address. The detailed report prompted investigations by Student Life & Leadership and the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities.

Following the review of the incident report, the group discussed investigative themes, including rules/requirements/consequences, activities, and documents regarding the prospective new member process in the Alpha chapter of Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc.

#### Investigative Themes: Rules/Requirements/Consequences

During the investigation, documents were submitted by the sorority that outlined the "Pledge Class Rules." Additionally, information presented during the course of the investigation outlined methods of how the national requirements were managed by the chapter, as well as consequences the chapter put in place with prospective new members. During the Informal Conference, the group discussed several national rules, including:

- Prospective new members must greet Big Sisters/Pledge Sisters, which was espoused as "Greet every sister and
  your pledge sister the first time you see her in the morning, afternoon and evening. Good (time of day) Big
  Sister/Pledge Sister (full name) of the most honorable Sigma Theta Psi Sorority.
- . Prospective new members must have their binders in their possession at all times
  - · Prospective new members must wear their organization pan at all times
  - · Prospective new members were not permitted to walk on grass
  - Prospective new members were not permutted to ride in elevators.
  - Prospective new members must offer and give greetings to active members and alumnae



 Prospective new members were expected to go to all mandatory events, which included late-night events not on the sorority's "pledge calendar"

Following the discussion of national rules, the group discussed the Alpha chapter's implementation of the rules. Alpha chapter implemented greetings to include only Big Sisters (active members and alumnae). Additionally, the prospective new members were required to offer a greeting and inquire how the Big Sister wanted to be greeted. Depending on the expectation of the specific Big Sister, the length of the greeting grew. Some Big Sisters expected the prospective new members to recite the Big Sister's pledge class, their line sisters, and/or their lineage. Statements such as "excuses are the nails that build our house of failure," were added to the greetings as consequences. Additional consequences for prospective new members not greeting Big Sisters included wearing a necklace with the letter "R," which stood for running and respect, and having to run, not walk, to greet Big Sisters when they were seen on campus.

In addition to the rules and consequences surrounding greetings, the prospective new members were required to adhere to additional consequences during the process. Specifically, the group discussed that the prospective new members were required to wear a heart pin that increased in size, carry their binder in their left arm at all times, were yelled at and/or were told that they were being disrespectful and unsisterly on a consistent basis, and were threatened to be removed from the organization. Many of the rules and consequences were enforced during the activities facilitated by the chapter.

#### Investigative Themes: Activities

The group discussed several activities that were part of the prospective new member process. The first event discussed was the Pinning Dinner, which took place at the home of an alumna or "Big Sister." This event was reported to be a positive bonding event. However, the group discuss the post-Pinning Dinner as exhibiting behavioral concerns. Following the dinner, icebreaker activities, and conversation, the environment shifted and the "Bigs" became "serious," demanding that the prospective new members line up by height order, shortest to tallest.

The prospective new members were then assigned to complete the task of obtaining warm clothes and shoes, developing a directory and printing 18 copies, and returning to the house where the dinner occurred. The group also discussed the discrepancy in the time allotted to complete the tasks. The active members stated that prospective new members had 60-90 minutes to complete the task, prospective members recalled 30 minutes. Prospective new members also expressed concern that two of the cars nearly were in car accidents due to the pressure and constraints of the activities.

Once they returned to the house, they were required to sign what prospective new members referred to as a "non-disclosure agreement," but is nationally known as the "Pledge Waiver." Following the completion of the waiver, prospective new members were blindfolded, put into multiple cars with loud music, and taken to a park near Mission Bay. While at the park, the group was instructed to complete a communication task. The prospective new members were reportedly in a single-file line, with their hands on the shoulders of the prospective new member in front of them. They were instructed to yell and provide direction to those behind them. Active members and alumnae reportedly yelled at prospective new members if they failed to be loud enough or stopped looking to the front. Reportedly, the active members took instruction from the "Pledge Educator."



Following the completion of the communication task, prospective new members were guided to a gazebo and unblindfolded one-by-one. Prospective new members lit candles and recited an oath. They also received gift baskets from their Big Sister, whose identity was unknown to the prospective new member, with a journal, candy, and something that represented their Big. The prospective new members also received binders. Reportedly, the prospective new members did not get home until 3:00am.

Prospective new members were expected to attend weekly meetings with the chapter, to convene weekly meetings amongst the prospective new members, and attend fibrary/study hours. Outside of these commitments, the prospective new members were required to attend "Sessions" on Monday evening at Mission Trails Regional Park. The sessions occurred weekly on September 25, October 2, October 9, October 16, and October 23. During the sessions, the prospective new members were required to line up, shortest to tallest, with their fists touching and arms interlocked. The prospective new members were expected to be in front of them, touching their toes, equidistant, and perfectly aligned. Prospective new members recalled that they were yelled at by Big Sisters to start over until they were in the perfect position, which they had to maintain throughout the "session."

During the lineups, Big Sisters and the "Pledge Educator" quizzed the prospective new members individually and collectively. If the prospective new member or the group could not respond with accurate information, the prospective new members were yelled at and told that they were being disrespectful for not knowing the information. Reportedly, the lineups were approximately 60 minutes in length.

During sessions, prospective new members had to greet the Big Sisters and were invited to participate in confessions. Prospective new members were told that actives had proof that they were violating rules of the process. The prospective new members were told they needed to keep their "head on a swivel," that photos were being taken of them violating rules, and that the sorority had people everywhere (who would report back to the Big Sisters). During confessions, prospective new members had the opportunity to "confess" that they didn't follow a rule. If prospective new members confessed, Big Sisters reportedly provided critical feedback that was yelled or in a berating tone.

In addition to the sessions, the chapter also facilitated a camping trip to Bontia, California. During the camping trip, prospective new members were expected to set up the campsites for prospective new members and Big Sisters. During this time, they were required to greet the Big Sisters, experienced a period of required studying, and were instructed to go to bed at 10:00pm. Because the "Pledge Educator" arrived after 10:00pm and wasn't greeted by the prospective new members, they were reprimanded for not greeting her. At 12:00am, the prospective new members were pulled out of their tents. Although distressing for all, this was reported to have deeply impacted individuals who relied on prescription medications to go to sleep and a prospective new member who had an injury.

The purpose of the pullout was another "session," and the prospective new members were driven to an offsite location. Reportedly, the prospective new members were quizzed in the cars and yelled at if the information they provided was



incorrect. During the line-up, one of the prospective new members had back spasms. When she expressed concerns, she was informed that she was being disrespectful but was given a chair.

During the line-up, one prospective new members expressed that a pin she was required to wear had broken earlier in the day. At that time, she was pulled out of line and escorted away for the broken pin. The Big Sisters announced that she would be taken back to campus and that she was out of the process. Admittedly, the Big Sisters had no intention of fully removing her from the process, but the purpose of the activity was so the other prospective new members would fight for her.

Distraught from seeing a prospective new member removed from the line, prospective new members began to express concern. At this time, another prospective new members had a panic attack and felt faint. If the prospective new members tried to help the individual who was pulled out of line, they were yelled at for not helping the prospective new member that was experiencing a panic attack. If the prospective new members tried to help the individual who was having a panic attack, they were yelled at for not helping the prospective new member that was pulled out of line. Overall, prospective new members felt scared to leave the line as Big Sisters (actives and alumnae) yelled at them for being disrespectful and unsisterly.

Once back in the parking lot and then to the campsite, all of the prospective new members discussed withdrawing from the process. The next morning, three individuals withdrew and went home. Reportedly, the remaining group purchased food, developed skits, and went home.

In addition to the meetings, events, and activities that were outlined, the group also discussed the Halloween event.

During this event, all prospective new members were expected to make their own costumes and dress as conchas.

#### Investigative Themes; Documents

During the course of the investigation, documents were submitted by the Alpha chapter, national board, and reporting parties. During the Informal Conference, the group discussed the documents, including the previously outlined "Pledge Class Rules" and the "Pledge Waiver," The pledge waiver was presented as a non-disclosure agreement by prospective new members that had signed the document. Reportedly, prospective new members cited that they believed they would be sued by the sorority if they discussed concerns they had about the process. Some prospective new members stated that as they withdrew from the process, they were reminded by Big Sisters that they signed the "non-disclosure agreement."

During the Informal Conference, the group discussed the "Pledge Waiver," one document that was submitted by the national board and the document that the Alpha chapter facilitated. In this process, there were two points that the Alpha chapter added into the waiver that differed from the national waiver, including:

- (2) The Expansion director/pledge educator will inform you (interested lady) if you qualify after the due date in extreme cases only.
- (9) If I were to say anything that refers to the pledging process of Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc., the
  organization has the right to take me to a court of law and prosecute me as stated policies and procedures."



Outside of the additions from the Alpha chapter, there were two points in the warver that were discussed in the Informal Conference. Specifically:

- (10) The pledging process is only to be discussed with sisters of Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc. and current pledges of Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc.
- (11) I understand that this sorority has a no hazing policy and will not force me to do anything I do not want to out
  of my own will. If I were to do anything, I would do it out of my own will and with no pressure of anyone. The
  pledging process is a decision made out of my own will.

In outlining the points of the waiver, the group discussed the national sorority's role in the structure of the organization and the culture of silence that was facilitated throughout the chapters of the sorority. The group also discussed the Big Sister contract, which outlined expectations for the active members and alumnae who would engage with the process.

#### Informal Conference Discussion

Following the review of the information presented during the course of the investigation, the group discussed a culture of hazing within the sorority. Specifically, the conversation acknowledged a previous hazing finding within the chapter in 2012. The meeting also included dialogue about the environment facilitated by the national sorority's "Pledge Class Rules," characterized by silence and perpetuation of hazing behavior. Furthermore, the group discussed the University's hazing policies and how behavior/activities, regardless of the express or implied consent, may be hazing. The importance of policy and behavior change within the organization, including the national sorority and Alpha chapter, was also discussed.

#### Fundraisers

Following the Informal Conference, additional information about the originally reported fundratising efforts of prospective new members was presented. The original report outlined that prospective new members were required to fundratise to cover costs of their process. Prospective new members expressed that they did not receive any of the funds and were not informed of any allocation on their behalf. The investigation led to a review of Sigma Theta Psi banking, in which the sorority indicated that their only banking relationship was with Associated Students during the Recognized Student Organization application process. It was later determined that the chapter also maintains an off-campus banking relationship with Wells Fargo bank.

### Decision

Based on the information presented during the course of the investigation, including documents provided by the sorority, I have found the Alpha chapter of Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc. to be responsible for violations of the Hazing, Dishonesty, and Student Organization Banking policies of the Student Organization Code of Conduct.

b(11)-1 Dishonesty. Furnishing false information to an official of the University or of a University anxillary organization or law enforcement agency.

b(20)-1 Hazing or conspiracy to haze. Hazing is defined as any method of indoctrination, initiation or



pre-initiation into a student organization, or way other organization-related activity, which, regardless of location, intent, membership status or rank of the participants, or the express or implied consent of the participants, causes, or is reasonably likely to cause, physical or mental injury, substantial mental or physical discomfort or stress, personal degradation, harassment or intimidation of or to any former, current or prospective student of any educational institution.

b(31)-1 Student Organization Banking. Maintaining an off-campus bank account without an exemption, no matter the circumstance (e.g. maintaining an Associated Students account in addition to the off-campus bank account).

As a result of the Hazing, Dishonesty, and Student Organization Banking policy violations, Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Incorporated is sanctioned to Probation with Stipulations through December 31, 2019.

Any further violations of University policy during the term of the Probation may result in an immediate Interim Suspension. In addition to the Probation, Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc. must complete the following stipulations:

#### Recruitment

During the Probation, Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc. may host recruitment events on campus that conclude before 10:00pm. The events must be scheduled following the process outlined in the "Event Approval" section of this letter. All recruitment events must have an advisor present for the duration of the event. Any advisor serving in this capacity must meet with Fraternity & Sorority Life staff prior to any recruitment events.

Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc. may participate in the United Sorority & Fratemity Council tabling during the council-organized week of tabling each term. During this time, the chapter may not distribute documents that list events without the prior approval of the events.

Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc. must disclose the status of the chapter, including the founded policy violations, to all interests and prospective new members, during each recruitment event. Prior to recruitment events, the chapter must submit a statement that will be read at the events to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff for approval.

#### Prospective New Member Processes

Prior to the start of the prospective new member process during each term of the Probation, Sigma Theta Psi leadership, including the President, those responsible for the prospective new member process, and the chapter advisor must meet with Fraternity & Sorority Life staff to review the process, expectations, and documents. Additionally, anyone who will be engaging with prospective new members during the process must sign a waiver stating they understand the status of the chapter, the hazing policies, and that they will not haze prospective new members.



All prospective new member processes must be held on-campus and scheduled through the process outlined in the "Event Approval" section of this letter. Meetings, activities, and events must have an advisor present and conclude prior to 10:00pm.

Division of Student Affairs

For clarity, the chapter may not implement the following: Pledge Class Rules, Pledge Waiver, sessions, greetings, pullouts, lineups, camping trips, confessions, yelling, and intimidation. The chapter may work with Fraternity & Sorority Life staff prior to the beginning of the prospective new member process to identify expectations that can be espoused by the chapter. Failure to uphold this expectation may result in the immediate Interim Suspension of the organization.

#### Event Approval

While on Probation, all activities, meetings, and events must be held on campus, have an advisor present, and be approved 48-hours in advance by Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life. These activities include but are not limited to chapter management, educational programs, service endeavors, recruitment events, and the new member process.

While the approval must be granted 48-hours in advance, the organization must enter all events into the Event Approval System and must adhere to the EAS timeline and process. Additionally, the chapter is expected to submit proposals with risk management plans for the activities to Caryl Montero-Adams at <u>caryl adamstarmant sdan edu</u> when the EAS is submitted. With the exception of structured community service, there may be no formal or informal activities chapter held off-campus.

#### Banking

The chapter may choose to close the Wells Fargo bank account or submit the documentation needed to receive an AS Banking Exemption. Regardless of the path that is chosen, the chapter must complete this action by March 1, 2018. Additionally, no fundraising activities may be completed in the name of the Alpha chapter of Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc. until the organization's banking is approved.

## **Educational Opportunities**

During each semester while under the Probation, Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc. must host a hazing education workshop for all active members, and all alumnae who will interact with the chapter. Failure to complete this workshop will result in the withdrawal of recruitment and/or prospective new member process privileges during the corresponding semester.

During each prospective new member process. Sigma Theta Psi Multicultural Sorority, Inc. must host a hazing education workshop. This workshop must be facilitated by a source outside of the Alpha chapter and include avenues to report concerning behavior. No active members or alumnae may be present during the workshop.



## Closing

Overall, the investigation revealed pervasive behavioral concerns that have been sustained from the national board, alumnae, and active members within the organization. While some of the rules and activities were innocuous expectations for new member processes, many of the national and chapter activities/policies enacted hazing or supported a culture of hazing within the organization. The sanctions and stipulations are an opportunity to restructure the organization and its operations. Given the seriousness of the matter, if the chapter has further hazing policy violations at San Diego State University, the organization's University recognition will be reconsidered.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Montero-Adams and Matthew Garcia in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Sigma Theta Pai Multicultural Sorority, Inc., at San Diego State University.

## GAMMA RHO LAMBDA NATIONAL SORORITY - DECISION LETTER

Thank you for meeting with me on June 14, 2018 for the Informal Conference to discuss the alleged violations that took place during the Fall 2017 and Spring 2018 semesters. During the meeting, I outlined the process and findings of Student Life & Leadership investigation.

During the course of the investigation, a recurring theme was the level of interpersonal conflict between the organization members/officers. The investigation included interviews from Gamma Rho Lambda potential new members, active members, and former members, Judicial Incident Reports, and a photo.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, I have found Gamma Rho Lambda to be in violation of multiple policies, listed below.

#### Hazing (b.20-1)

Hazing is defined as any method of indoctrination, initiation or pre-initiation into a student organization, or any other organization-related activity, which, regardless of location, intent, membership status or rank of the participants, or the express or implied consent of the participants, causes, or is reasonably likely to cause, physical or mental injury, substantial mental or physical discomfort or stress, personal degradation, harassment or intimidation of or to any former, current or prospective student of any educational institution.

### Health & Safety (b. 21)

Health and Safety. Conduct that threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person within or related to the University community, including physical abuse, threats, intimidation, harassment, sexual misconduct, throwing bottles or objects that could result in personal injury, or where three or more members of a student organization engage in group violence or tount others to engage in violence.

## Alcohol (b.2)

Violation of applicable law or University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic beverages while on or off campus.

## Property Damage (b. 28)

Unauthorized destruction, defacement or damage to University property or property of others, including placement of words, symbols or graphics on the property of others, or unauthorized removal, of signs or banners of other student organizations.

## Illegal Drugs (b.22-1)

Use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of illegal drugs or drug-related paraphernalia, (except as expressly permitted by law and University regulation) or the misuse of legal pharmaceutical drugs at an organization-related facility.

### Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, I have found Gamma Rho Lambda to be in violation of the Hazing, Health & Safety, Alcohol, Property Damage and Illegal Drugs policy violations. Gamma Rho Lambda is sanctioned to Suspension. The earliest date that Gamma Rho Lambda would be considered for reactivation is the first day of the Fall 2020 semester. The reactivation must be in accordance with the United Sorority & Fraternity Council expansion process and the formal invitation to reestablish at SDSU requires approval from the Dean of Students.

In addition to the sanction of Suspension, Gamma Rho Lambda must abide by the following stipulation during a future reactivation process:

## Membership

• All members and potential new members (defined as "pledges" by Gamma Rho Lambda) of Gamma Rho Lambda during the 2014-2018 academic years, regardless of their membership status at the time of the incidents, investigation, and decision, may not engage with the organization after a future reactivation. If graduated, the individuals may not serve in advisory roles with the future chapter at SDSU and may not have contact with undergraduate members following the reactivation.

Failure to complete these sanctions may result in the delayed or canceled reactivation of Gamma Rho Lambda at San Diego State University.

Student organizations have the right, within ten business days after receipt of a decision, to submit a written appeal to the Dean of Students. If an organization appeals a decision, the sanctions shall not become effective until the appellate process is completed.

It it important to note that the University received written notice from the Gamma Rho Lambda National Office on June 26, 2018, outlining that the national sorority officially revoked the charter of Beta chapter at San Diego State University. They noted that through their own internal investigation, they corroborate with San Diego State University's findings from the Informal Conference. The students affiliated with the former chapter have been notified of the charter revocation as of June 26, 2018 by the national organization.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with me in the Informal Conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will ultimately contribute to the reactivation and success of Gamma Rho Lambda at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life, on May 1, 2018. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a reported social event that occurred on February 18, 2018, followed by a report of alcohol being mixed with prescription drugs at chapter events. These events led to the Interim Suspension of the chapter on February 23, 2018. Following these reports, the University received a report of hazing occurring in a large lecture hall while the chapter was on Interim Suspension, which resulted in the Interim Suspension to be expanded to include that the fraternity could not continue with the new member process, effective March 7, 2018. In addition to discussing the initial reports during the Informal Conference, the group discussed additional reported that emerged during the course of the investigation, including the continuation of the new member process emerged during the investigation. The reports resulted in allegations of the Alcohol, Hazing, and Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policies.

During the conversation, President former President , and Advisor Kyle Ryan represented the fraternity. Student Life Advisor for Fraternity & Sorority Life, Matthew Garcia was present along with representatives from the Interfraternity Council including outgoing President Victor Todor, incoming President Jacob Mahony, and Vice President for Judicial Affairs, Alexander Franks. In addition to the reported incidents, the group discussed the status of the chapter with the International Headquarters and the University.

#### Review of Chapter Status

During the Informal Conference, Caryl Montero-Adams reviewed the University status of Phi Kappa Psi, which was Interim Suspension with the University and Temporary Suspension with Phi Kappa Psi Fraternity.

#### Review of Alleged Policy Violations

During the Informal Conference, a review of the initial incident reports occurred, along with information found during the course of the investigation. The specific alleged policy violations were discussed in detail:

#### Alcohol Policy Allegations

The group discussed the social event on February 18, 2018. During the morning hours on February 18, the Phi Kappa Psi hosted a "Muffins" event. By approximately 8:30am, the fraternity received a 30-day notice for noise from police and the event was closed down.



As discussion in the Informal Conference, a guest list was said to have existed during the investigation but could not be produced. Additionally, some of the individuals interviewed articulated that wristbands were present and that many people coming from the apartments (Stacks) were not wristbanded. Others stated that wristbands were not present.

During the investigation, all members who were interviewed, including former President indicated that no alcohol was present during the social. However, during the Informal Conference, former Presiden acknowledged that alcohol was present, had been purchased and brought to the event by individual members, and that the members were "managed internally." When asked what the internal judicial process looks like in the fraternity, Advisor Kyle Ryan indicated that the process was philosophical and included a sit down conversation with the brothers. Advisor Ryan stated that "short of expulsion from the fraternity, pretty much everything is managed internally."

#### Hazing Policy Allegations

The updated Interim Suspension was sparked when a report of classroom disruption, reported to be a hazing incident within Phi Kappa Psi, was received. During the Informal Conference, the group discussed that aside from the individual being a new member of the fraternity, there was not sufficient evidence find the fraternity responsible for this hazing violation.

However, the group also discussed that in the updated Interim Suspension letter, the instructions for the fraternity included the determination that the new member process cease. During the Informal Conference, reports from University officials and concerned parents were reviewed. One potential new member outlined to a University official that initiation was scheduled for the beginning of May. Concerned family members indicated that the process had continued since March, which included acts of servitude and the continuation of dues being paid throughout the semester.

The group discussed a request to review the financial records of the fraternity. Advisor Kyle Ryan expressed concern about providing access to the records to the University. Assistant Director Montero-Adams discussed that this was the final information needed. She discussed that compelling members or prospective members to violate policy, including failing to follow the Interim Suspension, is bazing.

Direct access to the financial records of the fraternity was not given to the University. Following the Informal Conference and throughout summer 2018. Presiden

Assistant Director Montero-Adams, and Director of Chapter Services & Standards Brian Kochheiser collaborated so that the University could gain access to financial information, if not the direct financial records. This process was not discussed during the Informal Conference, but demonstrated that prospective new members continued to pay dues despite the new member process being dissolved. The payment process began in March following the updated Interim Suspension. Some prospective members paid the full \$800 new member dues, while others stopped paying at some point during the Spring semester. None of the prospective new members paid the \$800 in one payment; all of the prospective new members had at least two installments, if not more. The last payment for one prospective new member was in June 20018.

Given the report to University official regarding initiation, information from concerned parents, and the dues paid from March through June, it more likely than not that there was a continuation of a new member process that involved contact



with prospective members and that the perception of prospective new members that they would be initiated into the fraternity. The University recognizes that the process may not have been the formal new member process typically implemented. A continuation of a process is a violation of the Interim Suspension and therefore, a violation of University policy. Compelling students to violate University policy is an act of hazing.

## Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures

During the Informal Conference, allegations of Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures were discussed, specifically, the misrepresentation of information during the investigation and failure to comply with previously assigned sanctions.

Misrepresentation of Information. During the Informal Conference, the group discussed inconsistent information about the risk management procedures and alcohol at the social event on February 18.

Failure to Comply with Previously Assigned Sanctions. During the Informal Conference, the group discussed that if a new member process continued, as reported, the fraternity, it would mean that the fraternity failed to comply with previously assigned sanctions.

## Alcohol and Other Drug Violation Allegation

Lastly, during the Informal Conference the group discussed a report of alcohol being mixed with Xanax during a social event in January, which was one of the incidents that sparked the first Interim Suspension. During the investigation, there was not substantial evidence to support a finding of this alleged violation.

#### Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference. I have found Phi Kappa Psi to be in violation of the Alcohol, Hazing and the Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policies.

b(2) Alcohol. Violation of applicable law or University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic beverages while on or off campus.

b(20)-2 Hazing. Hazing also includes any activity that compels a student to participate in any activity that is unlawful, publicly indecent or contrary to the policies and regulations of the University, or any activity that unreasonably and materially interferes with a student's academic efforts.

b(38)-1 Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures. Falsification, distortion or misrepresentations of information related to a student organization discipline matter.

b(38)-6 Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures. Failure to comply with the sanction(s) imposed under a student organization disciplinary proceeding.



As a result of the Alcohol, Hazing, and Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policy violations, Phi Kappa Psi Fraternity is sanctioned to Probation through June 2019.

Any further violations of University policy during the ferm of the Probation may result in an immediate Interim Suspension of the fraternity and could result in the removal of campus recognition. In addition to the Probation, Phi Kappa Psi must complete the following stipulations:

## Chapter Education

Educational Workshops. Phi Kappa Psi is expected to host ongoing educational workshops for members of the chapter. Specifically, the following workshops are stipulated for the term of the Probation and must have 90% chapter participation:

- Prior to IFC Recruitment (Fall 2018 and Spring 2019); Hazing Education
- Fall 2018: Alcohol and Other Drugs
- Spring 2019: Post-Probation Risk Management

Fraternity & Sorority Life can advise on presenters and workshop development. The presentations will be facilitated by trained, professional staff/volunteers of the University and/or Fraternity. Active members and Executive Board members may not facilitate the trainings.

It is expected that the chapter leadership will schedule a meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams to review and advise on the workshops and identify presenters. Documentation of workshop completion must be sent to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff within 24-hours of the workshops. Documentation should be in Google Slides format and include photos, presenter information, the strengths of the workshops and the opportunities for growth. Additionally, attendance must be tracked using Presence.

Pre-Recruitment and New Member Education Meeting. The chapter must host a pre-recruitment meeting with the chapter's executive board, 90% of membership and advisor(s) prior to any recruitment activities each semester. This meeting will establish the process and expectations around recruiting new members and how new members are engaged during their first semester. Discussion on Phi Kappa Psi's six week pre-initiation policy will also be reviewed. Hazing, alcohol and other drugs must be discussed during the meeting to mitigate the risk of these behaviors. A member of the Fraternity & Sorority Life staff team must also be present. If the meeting does not occur. Phi Kappa Psi may not participate in recruitment of new members.

#### **Events and Activities**

#### Event Calendar and Proposal Meeting

The chapter executive board and any event planners (risk management chair, philanthropy chair, etc.) will schedule a meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams during the first two weeks of each semester to discuss the chapter's event calendar. In this meeting, the event approval process will be discussed in detail. Additionally, risk management plans and expectations will be discussed.



Event Proposals and Risk Management Plans. During the term of the Probation, Phi Kappa Psi must submit a proposal with detailed risk management plans for all events hosted or co-hosted by the chapter to Fraternity & Sotority Life. Despite location, the events must follow the University's approval process and risk management plans must be submitted for all events. For educational workshops, community service participation, and regular meetings, the chapter must submit proposals three weeks in advance. For events with greater risk, such as philanthropies, recruitment events, and (dry) socials, the chapter must submit the events eight weeks in advance. Recruitment activities occurring in the Fall 2018 term must be submitted by Friday, August 31 to ensure review prior to the recruitment period.

Events with Alcohol. During the term of the Probation, Phi Kappa Psi may request to host one, on-campus event with alcohol that follows all University processes and procedures during the Spring 2019 term. If the chapter completes all milestones during their outlined timeline, Phi Kappa Psi may request to host one additional, on-campus event with alcohol following all University processes and procedures during the Spring 2019 term.

The purpose of hosting the structured event(s) with alcohol is to provide developmental opportunities for the chapter to intentionally plan and implement events. If the event application process is not followed or additional policies are violated, the privilege of hosting events with alcohol may be rescinded during the term of the Probation.

Outside of the outlined event(s) with alcohol, the chapter may host dry socials that follow the event approval process outlined above.

Advisor Presence. During the term of the Probation, an advisor is expected to be present during the duration of all chapter events/meetings. Advisors who plan to be present at events most participate in the Fraternity & Sorority Life Advisor Training during the Fall 2018 term.

#### Disclosure

Disclosure, It is expected that all members, new members and potential new members are made aware of the Probation and all stipulations. It is vital to the sustainability of the chapter that the entire membership understands the outcome of the investigation and expectations of members in this process.

To ensure that potential new members are aware of the chapter's status, it is an expectation that an announcement is made at each Phi Kappa Psi recruitment event by alumni advisor(s) during the Fall 2018 and Spring 2019 semesters. Potential new members must also sign and submit a Memorandum of Understanding regarding the fraternity's status.

#### Reimbursement

As all of the funds from prospective new members were collected after the Interim Suspension ceasing new member activities was issued, the dues collected must be reimbursed, in full, to every new member. Confurnation of the reimbursements must be sent to Caryl Montero-Adams by September 14, 2018.



## Failure to complete these sanctions may result in the interim suspension of Phi Kappa Psi Fraternity.

Although not a stipulation, it is recommended that the chapter review policies for members, including how violations of standards are addressed. While a formalized process outlined by Phi Kappa Psi Fraternity likely exists nationally, it is a concern that the process is not implemented to hold members accountable as all members are responsible for behavior, both individually and collectively.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Montero-Adams in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Phi Kappa Psi at San Diego State University.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraieraty & Sorority Life, on July 16, 2018. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a reported social event that occurred on February 16, 2018. The initial event led to the Interim Suspension of the chapter on April 2, 2018. In addition to discussing the initial reports during the Informal Conference, the group discussed an additional report that emerged during the course of the investigation, specifically a social event with alcohol that occurred on June 9. The reports resulted in allegations of the Alcohol, Hazing, Noise, and Failure to Comply policies.

During the conversation, President , Vice President , and Advisor Bill Marckwardt represented the fraternity. Student Life Advisor for Fraternity & Sorority Life, Mutthew Garcia was present along with representatives from the Interfraternity Council including Executive Vice President Noah Siegel, and Vice President for Judicial Affairs, Alexander Franks. In addition to the reported incidents, the group discussed the status of the chapter

## Review of Chapter Status

During the Informal Conference, Caryl Montero-Adams reviewed the University status of Sigma Alpha Epsilon, which was Interim Suspension with the University.

#### Review of Alleged Policy Violations

During the Informal Conference, a review of the initial incident reports occurred, along with information found during the course of the investigation. The specific alleged policy violations were discussed in detail:

## Alcohol & Hazing Policy Allegations

During the Informal Conference, the group reviewed an incident report from February 2018 that outlined a student who was transported from the residence halls. Reportedly, the witnesses indicated that the individual transported was "rushing SAE and Friday night was "bid night." The group processed that alcohol involved in new member events (ex. Bid Night) would constitute hazing. The group discussed that in conducting investigative meetings and conferring with the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities, there was no additional link established between the fraternity and the transported student.



### Noise & Alcohol Policy Allegation

During the course of the investigation, an incident reportedly occurred on June 9, 2018 at the chapter facility. During the Informal Conference, the group discussed a police report that detailed San Diego State University Police Department responding to another call in Greek Circle. While on the call, the police heard music and people at the Sigma Alpha Epsilon house and made contact with the fraternity. During the contact and in the Informal Conference, Vice President stated that individuals, members and guests, who were 21+ had been drinking. The type of alcohol was unknown to Vice President and the police. It should be noted that although contact was made, a noise complaint had not been received. Based on the information provided during the investigation, the incident is not a clear violation of the alcohol or noise policies of Student Organization Code of Conduct. However, this letter should serve as a formal referral to the Interfraternity Council so that the IFC can address the violation of the Social Moratorium imposed by the council.

### Failure to Comply Allegation

During the Informal Conference, the group discussed that if the chapter hosted an event with alcohol during the course of the Interim Suspension, it would mean that the fraternity failed to comply with previously assigned sanctions. This prompted a dialogue around the constitution of an "event" and the types of socials fraternities hosts. It was founded that due to the reported amount of people (approximately 30), that both members and guests were present, and that alcohol was present, that the incident on June 9 constituted an event with alcohol. Therefore, the chapter violated the Failure to Comply policy of the Student Organization Code of Conduct.

#### Discussion

During the Informal Conference, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, the Interfraternity Council and Fraternity & Sorority Life stuff engaged in dialogue around risk management and reporting responsibilities of the community. The group discussed the Fraternity & Sorority Life Reporting Protocol and outlined reasons for implementing the protocol.

#### Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference. I have found Sigma Alpha Epsilon to be in violation of the Failure to Comply policy.

b(16) Failure to Comply. Failure to comply with the directions of interference with any University official or any public safety officer while acting in the performance of their duties.

As a result of the Failure to Comply policy violation, Sigma Alpha Epsilon is sanctioned to Formal Warning. There is no further action that must be taken at this time.

Although not a founded violation of the University's alcohol policy, it should be noted that the fraternity admitted to having alcohol at the chapter facility where members and guests were socializing during the IFC Social Moratorium. The member's actions to disregard the social moratorium is a concern for the culture of the chapter. It is recommended that the chapter review the internal accountability measures (ex. Standards/Judicial Board) and reinforce that all members are responsible for the collective:

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Director of Student Life & Leadership, on February 8, 2019 by phone. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a reported brotherhood event that occurred on Friday, October 5, 2018 where it was alleged that alcohol was consumed by candidates (new and previously involved), and that new candidates were encouraged to drink a mixture of malt and hard liquor. This incident led to the Interim Suspension of the chapter on October 11, 2018. The reports resulted in allegations of the Alcohol, Hazing or Conspiracy to Haze, and Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policies.

During the conversation, Timothy Braddick, Director of Fraternal Operations represented Sigma Nu. Student Life Advisor for Fraternity & Sorority Life, Matthew Garcia was present along with Graduate Student Affairs Assistant Vanessa Jara, Interfraternity Council President Jacob Mahony, and Interfraternity Council Vice President Judicial Affairs Alexander Franks. In addition to the reported incidents, the group discussed the status of the chapter with the Headquarters and the University.

The group discussed that visiting members of Sigma Nu fraternity (from another chapter) witnessed concerning behavior and contacted Sigma Nu headquarters to address their concerns. Specifically, candidates brought alcohol to the chapter facility in an excessive manner inconsistent with risk management policies and procedures. In addition to violations of fraternity law and University policy, the candidates poured a mixture of hard and malt figuor into a large, plastic bin. New candidates (new members) participated in drinking the mixture, and several of those who drank the mixture became sick. The fraternity did not seek assistance for members who displayed signs of over-intoxication.

The group also discussed that the general fraternity ceased the reestablishment efforts of Eta Kappa in October. As Eta Kappa was establishing at SDSU, the general fraternity took into consideration the founded policy violations from October 2017 along with the new incident. Due to the risk management concerns for the organization, specifically violations of the fraternity's alcohol policies, Eta Kappa was closed. During the Informal Conference, Timothy Braddick further clarified that Eta Kappa was closed due to alcohol violations and that the organization was not found responsible for the general fraternity's hazing policies.

The group discussed that prior to the investigation, the status of the fraterinty at the University was Probation with Stipulations through October 20, 2018. In addition to concerns for the incident on October 5, 2018. Eta Kappa violated the sanctions assigned by the University.

### Division of Student Affairs

Based on the preponderance of the evidence gathered during the investigation, including reports from Sigma Nu headquarters, photos, video, and the discussion during the informal conference. I have found Sigma Nu to be in violation of the Alcohol, Hazing or Conspiracy to Haze and Violations of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policies.

**b(2) Alcohol.** Violation of applicable law or University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic beverages while on or off campus.

b(20)-1 Hazing or Conspiracy to Haze. Hazing is defined as any method of indoctrination, mitiation or pre-initiation into a student organization, or any other organization-related activity, which, regardless of location, intent, membership status or rank of the participants, or the express or implied consent of the participants, causes, or is reasonably likely to cause, physical or mental injury, substantial mental or physical discomfort of stress, personal degradation, harassment or intimidation of or to any farmer, current or prospective student of any educational institution.

b(38)-6 Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures. Failure to comply with the xanction(x) imposed under a student organization disciplinary proceeding.

As a result of the Alcohol, Hazing or Conspiracy to Haze, and Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policy violations, the University supports Sigma Nu Fraternity's decision to cease the reestablishment of Eta Kappa and has revoked the recognition of the fraternity. Sigma Nu is sanctioned to Suspension and is not eligible to participate in the Interfraternity Council's expansion selection process until January 2022. Once eligible, Sigma Nu will be able to participate in the expansion selection process, apply and potentially interview with the Interfraternity Council.

Participating in the IFC Expansion process does not guarantee if or when Sigma Nu will be selected to establish at SDSU.

During the Informal Conference, Timothy Braddick also outlined that no candidate during the reestablishment effort that took place at San Diego State University between 2016-18 will be eligible for membership in Sigma Nu. The University supports this measure.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Director of Student Life & Leadership, on December 11, 2018. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a reported social event that occurred on October 17-18, 2018 where it was alleged that a new member was hazed. This incident led to the Interim Suspension of the chapter on October 19, 2018. The reports resulted in allegations of the Alcohol, Hazing or Conspiracy to Haze. Noise, and Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policies.

During the conversation, President and Advisor David Dere represented the fraternity. Student Life
Advisor for Fraternity & Sorority Life, Matthew Garcia was present along with Interfratemity Council President Jacob
Mahoney. In addition to the reported incidents, the group discussed the status of the chapter with the Kappa Alpha Order
and the University.

The group discussed the incident report and following actions that were taken. Specifically, the initial report to Student Life & Leadership and the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs resulted in immediate contact with chapter President and Advisor David Dere. The report was specific to injuries that a new member had sustained, which were reported to be hazing-related. It was also discussed that the San Diego State University Police Department also made contact with the chapter.

Following the incident report, the chapter was placed on an immediate Interim Suspension during an investigation. The investigation was conducted jointly between the national office of Rappa Alpha Order and the University. The group discussed that with very few exceptions, individuals interviewed were evasive and provided false information during the course of the investigation.

The themes that could be developed during the investigation included that active and new members were participating in "social setup," which specifically included painting a fence in preparation for a social event. It was also confirmed that alcohol, specifically hard liquor, was consumed by active and new members in an active's bedroom in the chapter facility. It was also reported that there was an attempt to walk the new member home to their residence hall, but when the active member realized the state of intoxication the new member was in, they turned around so that residence hall staff could not intervene. It was reported that the new member fell down a few times on the walk home. Finally, it was reported that a few active members took shifts "watching him." It was discussed that at no point did the chapter attempt to get assistance for the new member, and in fact, one active member attempted to avoid engaging with staff who could assist.



In addition to the initial incident, additional incidents were discussed. The first occurred earlier in October where the SDSU Police Department made contact with the chapter after receiving a noise complaint. During this incident, the chapter expressed that the police had "no right to be there."

The group also discussed an incident that occurred on Halloween. Specifically, it was reported that a man and a woman (reportedly college-aged) trespassed in the Kappa Alpha house. The two individuals were in the bathroom and the woman expressed that she needed help. Chapter members kicked in the door and assisted the woman, escorting the man out of the house and into the back alley. Instead of calling the police, four active members and one new member were involved in a physical altercation with the man. At one point, a member picked up the man and body-slammed him on the ground, which resulted in injuries and the individual being transported by medics. During the time of this incident, the chapter's status was Interim Suspension, with stipulations that outlined the chapter could have no contact with new members. The group discussed that there was continued contact, given that a new member was involved in the incident and that he had been at the chapter facility.

During the Informal Conference, the group also discussed that during the interviews with both University and Kappa Alpha Order officials, members of Kappa Alpha were evasive and furnished false information. There were conflicting accounts by members and individuals were urged to be forthright by Kappa Alpha staff on numerous occasions. During the course of the investigation, only one member interviewed was deemed to be forthcoming, providing substantive information.

### Decision

Based on the preponderance of the evidence gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference, I have found Kappa Alpha Order to be in violation of the Alcohol, Health and Safety. Noise, and Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policies.

- b(2) Alcohol. Violation of applicable law or University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic heverages while no or off campus.
- (21) Health and Safety. Conduct that threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person within or related to the University community, including physical abuse, threats, intimidation, huraximent, sexual misconduct throwing bottles or ubjects that could result in personal injury, or where three or more members of a student argonization engage in group violence or taum others to engage in violence.
- b(24)-2 Noise. Excessive naire which disrupts the campus or surrounding community, including but not limited to the use of tamplified sound on campus.
- b(38)-1 Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures. Faicification, distortion or interepresentations of information related to a student organization discipline matter.
- b(38)-6 Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures. Failure to comply with the nauxion(s) imposed under a student organization disciplinary proceeding.

As a result of the Alcohol, Health and Safety, Noise, and Violations of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures pulicy violations, Kappa Alpha Order is sanctioned to Suspension through October 18, 2019.

During the term of the Suspension, Kappa Alpha may not be recognized by the University. Kappa Alpha may submit the application for University recognition beginning May 1, 2019 when the new recognition season opens but cannot be recognized until after October 18, 2019. Kappa Alpha has expressed permission to seek recognition outside of the recognition seasons for the 2019-20 academic year.

Kappa Alpha may not recruit during the Interfrateraty Council's fall 2019 recruitment period as recruitment occurs during the term of the suspension. However, Kappa Alpha may recruit individuals once the chapter regains recognition. Kappa Alpha leadership must work with Fraterarty & Sorority Life staff in order to extend bids to all new members and ensure they complete new member education.

Any further violations of University policy during the term of the Suspension may result in a lengthened suspension and/or a referral to a formal hearing.

It is highly encouraged that Kappa Alpha implement a membership review in order to address behavioral concerns of individual members that have impacted the collective organization. Additionally, once Kappa Alpha regains recognition, the chapter is expected to complete the following stipulations:

### Chapter Education

Educational Workshops. Kappa Alpha is expected to host ongoing educational workshops for members of the chapter. Specifically, the following workshops are stipulated:

- By February 1, 2020: Successful Community Living (program by Counseling & Psychological Services)
- By February 1, 2020: Alcohol & Other Drugs

Fraternity & Sorority Life can advise on presenters and workshop development. The presentations will be facilitated by trained, professional staff/volunteers of the University and/or Fraternity, or another approved speaker. Active members and Executive Board members may not facilitate the trainings.

It is expected that the chapter leadership will schedule a meeting with Matthew Garcia to review and advise on the workshops and identify presenters. Documentation of workshop completion must be sent to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff within 24-hours of the workshops. Documentation should be in Google Slides format and include photos, presenter information, the strengths of the workshops and the opportunities for growth. Additionally, attendance must be tracked using Presence.

### Kappa Alpha Order Sanctions

In addition to the sanctions and stipulations outlined above, the University is in support of sanctions assigned by Kappa Alpho Order Fraternity, including:

Any member of the chapter who selvieved below a 2.0 Fall 2018 term GPA will be removed from the chapter and

placed on Alumnus Not in Good Standing Status, Individuals who are removed may apply to be reinstated as an Active Member in Good Standing after achieving above n 2.7 semester GPA. Alumni not in good standing are prohibited from going to the KA house and may not attend or participate in any activity associated with KA.

- All members of Gamma lota Chapter must sign a membership contract which details KA's membership expectations and each members' agreement to attend all educational requirements included in this letter. This process will serve as a self-directed membership review. Any member not willing to sign the membership contract will be placed on Alumnus Not in Good Standing status and will no longer be an active member of Gamma lota Chapter.
- Gamma lota Chapter must best five educational workshops on the following topics: academic success, social event
  management, peer accountability, crisis and emergency response and reporting, and bystauder intervention. These
  educational sessions must be completed before May 9, 2019 and all members of the chapter must be present. Each
  educational session must be conducted by a facilitator approved by the NAO. The facilitators for the social event
  management and academic sessions will work with the chapter to develop a written action plans for each corresponding
  area of operations that must be approved by the NAO.
- Gumma Iota's Associate Director for Chapter Services will facilitate an officer retreat with all
  nine chapter officer before May 9, 2019. All chapter officers must attend the retreat. Each officer will be
  educated on their specific roles and responsibilities as well as create goals for each of their positions. Annur will
  provide the NAO's expectations for the chapter moving forward.
- All nine chapter officers must attend Province Council in Tempe, Arizona on February 1-2, 2019.
- Gamma lota Chapter must have at least four members attend the Emerging Leaders Academy in Lexington, Virginia on June 6-9, 2019.

### Fallure to complete these sanctions may result in the lengthened suspension of Kappa Alpha.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams. Director of Student Life & Leadership, on January 14, 2019. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed a reported social event that occurred on Saturday, October 27, 2018 where it was alleged that a guest was drugged during the event. This incident led to the Interim Suspension of the chapter on October 30, 2018. The reports resulted in allegations of the Alcohol, Harassment and Abusive Behavior, Health and Safety, Illegal Drugs, and Violation of the Student Organization Conduct Procedures policies.

During the conversation, President

Advisor Ron Smith represented the fraternity. Student
Life Advisor for Fraternity & Sorority Life, Matthew Garcia was present along with staff from the Sigma Phi Epsilon's
headquarters including Ben Weinberg and Erik Rosenkranz. In addition to the reported incidents, the group discussed the
status of the chapter with the Headquarters and the University.

The group discussed a social event that occurred on October 27, 2018, which was identified as an exchange between Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity and Alpha Phi sorority. The group reviewed the risk management plans for the event along with guest lists. The chapter representatives described access to alcohol within the house as limited to a room upstairs. The group also discussed the risk management procedures that reportedly were in place, including limiting alcohol to beer, wine, and wine coolers, escorting individuals with alcohol upstairs to the designated bedroom with alcohol, and wristbanding guests. The group discussed that some of the risk management measures, including the use of wristbands and the type of alcohol that was available, and how alcohol was distributed, differed from accounts that were given during the investigation. While a guest list was produced, it featured individuals who were invited to the social and did not delineate who had been present during the event.

In addition to discussing the social event, the group reviewed the reported incident, which was that a guest was drugged during the event and reported it to the chapter the next day. The group discussed the chapter's response, which was to deny that the incident could have happened at Sigma Phi Epsilon and delay reporting the incident to advisors, Sigma Phi Epsilon headquarters, and the University. The discussion included information on best practices when an individual reports that they had been drugged or experienced any other type of gender-based violence, which included listening, believing, and referring to resources.

Following the discussion of the incident and social event, the group focused on the environment that Sigma Phi Epsilon created—both during the social and after the incident was reported. While the fraternity may not have drugged the individual as a collective, the environment created by the chapter impacted the health and safety of guests.



### Decision

Based on the preponderance of the evidence gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference. I have found Sigma Phi Epsilon to be in violation of the Alcohol, Health and Safety, and the Illegal Drugs policies. The scope of these violations collectively represent serious infringements of the student organization handbook as well as health and safety concerns for members of the SDSU community. Individually these violations would warrant the sauctions provided. Nonetheless, by loosely regulating the availability of alcohol, the fraternity violated Alcohol and Health and Safety policies. There is a preponderance of evidence indicating the chapter did not uphold risk management and safety guidelines. Additionally, based on the information presented during the course of the investigation it is more likely than not that a guest of the fraternity was drugged while in attendance of the social event.

- b(2) Alcohol. Violation of applicable law or University policy regarding the use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of alcoholic beverages while on or off campus.
- (21) Health and Safety. Conduct that threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person within or related to the University community, including physical abuse, threats, intimidation, harassment, sexual misconduct, throwing bottles or objects that could result in personal injuty, or where three or more members of a student organization engage in group violence or taunt others to engage in violence.
- b(22)-1 Illegal Drugs. Use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of (llegal drugs or drug-related paraphernalia, (except as expressly permitted by law and University regulation) or the misuse of legal pharmaceutical drugs at an organization-related event.

As a result of the Alcohol, Health and Safety, and Illegal Drugs policy violations, Sigma Phi Epstlon Fraternity is sanctioned to Suspension in Abeyance through December 31, 2019.

Any further violations of University policy during the term of the sanction may result in an immediate Interim Suspension of the fraternity and could result in the removal of campus recognition. In addition to the Suspension in Abeyance, Sigma Phi Epsilon must complete the following stipulations:

### Chapter Education

Educational Workshops. Sigma Phi Epsilon is expected to host ongoing educational workshops for members of the chapter. Specifically, the following workshops are stipulated for the term of the sanction and must have 80% chapter participation:

- Fall 2019: Sexual Violence Education
  - Fall 2019: Alcohol and Other Drugs
- · Fall 2019: Post-Sanction Risk Management

Fraternity & Sorority Life can advise on presenters and workshop development. The presentations will be facilitated by trained, professional staff/volunteers of the University and/or Fraternity, or another approved

speaker (ex. Lori Bednarchik, who the chapter hosted in Fall 2018). Active members and Executive Board members may not facilitate the trainings.

It is expected that the chapter leadership will schedule a meeting with Matthew Garcia to review and advise on the workshops and identify presenters. Documentation of workshop completion must be sent to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff within 24-hours of the workshops. Documentation should be in Google Slides format and include photos, presenter information, the strengths of the workshops and the opportunities for growth. Additionally, attendance must be tracked using Presence.

### **Events and Activities**

Event Proposals and Risk Management Plans. During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance, Sigma Phi Epsilon must submit a proposal with detailed risk management plans for all events hosted or co-hosted by the chapter to Student Life & Leadership. Despite location, the events must follow the University's approval process and risk management plans must be submitted for all events. For educational workshops, community service participation, and regular meetings, the chapter must submit proposals three weeks in advance. For events with greater risk, such as philanthropics, recruitment events, and (dry) socials, the chapter must submit the events eight weeks in advance.

During the Spring 2019 term, Catyl Montero-Adams, Director of Student Life & Leadership, will review the event proposals and risk management plans. During the Fall 2019 term, this will transition to the Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life.

Events with Alcohol. Following October 1, 2019 and during the term of the Suspension in Abeyance, Sigma Phi Epsilon may request to host one event with alcohol under the following stipulations developed in collaboration with Sigma Phi Epsilon headquarters:

- · The event must be at a third-party vendor and cannot be hosted at the chapter facility or a satellite house
- All risk management and member safety plans must be submitted to chapter advisors, their regional director, and Student Life & Leadership prior to hosting, endorsing, or participating in an event with alcohol

Advisor or third Party Security Presence. During the term of the Suspension in Abeyance, an advisor is expected to be present during the duration of all chapter events/meetings. Each risk management plan must include the name and contact information for the advisor who will be present or the name and phone number of a pre-approved third party security vendor.

### Sigma Phi Epsilon Sanctions

In addition to the sanctions and atipulations outlined above, the University is in support of sanctions assigned by Sigma Phi Epailon Fraternity, including:

Chapter updates Sigma Challenge to include a meeting on member safety presented by a content expert



### Division of Student Affairs

- Chapter achieves a 90% completion rate for the fall 2019 Brotherhood Questionnaire (delivered to chapters in mid-September)
- Chapter creates a written plan and timeline for complete substance-free facility adoption
- Chapter does not utilize the chapter facility for social events. This does not include events that are educational, developmental or service-oriented in nature.

Failure to complete these sanctions may result in the interim suspension of Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity.

While this investigation addressed the student organization violations, individual names may be forwarded to the Center for Student Rights and Responsibilities for further investigation. Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Montero-Adams in the informal conference. We hope that the nutcome of the incidents and the imposed sanctions will contribute to the success of Sigma Phi Epsilon at San Diego State University.

# This is a confidential document. PHI GAMMA DELTA FRATERNITY INVESTIGATION FOLLOW UP

During the week of April 22, 2019 members of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity met with Kevin Araujo-Lipine, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Student Organizations & Activities to discuss allegations of policy violations within Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity at San Diego State University Reportedly, Phi Gamma Delta hosted multiple social events in a satellite house where distribution of alcoholic beverages to underage individuals occurred. The satellite house was left in an unlivable condition for the residents, as well as concern for the safety and well-being to members of the university/community and to property off campus. In addition, there is a report of underage drinking at the Phi Gamma Delta house on March 21, 2019, leading to a medical transport to the hospital.

After several investigative meetings, it was determined that the allegations of multiple social events in a satellite house appear to be the actions of individuals that are no longer active members of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity. Additionally, there is not clear evidence that the underage drinking that resulted in a medical transport occurred as a result of alcohol consumption at the Phi Gamma Delta house on March 21, 2019. No harm to individuals or property was identified to active Phi Gamma Delta members through the investigative process.

Through the investigative process it became clear that there are current students on the Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity roster that are listed as "Graduate" status, but these students have not completed their studies. San Diego State University identifies students that were members of fraternal organizations, but are not currently active and have not graduated yet as "inactive". "Graduate" or "Alumni" status should not be used until the member has completed their academic program. Additionally, it is recommended that there are conversations with students transitioning to "inactive" status to discuss their behavior and actions, as they can be viewed as part of the fraternity. This can have potential negative impact on the image of the fraternity. It should be noted that any undergraduate member who is current with their membership dues and/or is on the active national roster is considered an active member.

Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity will need to review and update their roster using the status guidelines shared. Updated rosters should be shared with the Phi Gamma Delta National Office, San Diego State University Fraternity & Sorority Life, and uploaded to the Registered Student Organization (RSO) application system.

As the initial investigation was concluding, the Office of Student Life & Leadership received a report of lewd and obscene behavior being directed at members of the campus community who were participating in a conference at the neighboring Pride Center on April 27, 2019. Phi Gamma Delta was able to provide documentation that demonstrated the individuals who participated in lewd acts were in the process of being expelled from the fraternity. Documentation from the fraternity demonstrates that the inactive members were at the house to meet with the executive board to discuss their behavior related to the prior incident report that launched the initial investigation. Following conversations with members of the

executive board, the individuals were left briefly so that the board could discuss their membership status. When they were unattended, the individuals went on the roof and loudly made obscene noises toward the Pride Center. The membership of the individuals was terminated by the national fraternity.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports and investigative interviews, I have found that there is not enough evidence at this time to charge the fraternity with violations of the Student Organization Code of Conduct. The interim suspension is lifted immediately. Should additional information be presented, the allegations may be further reviewed and violations could be found.

Additionally, Phi Gamma Delta was previously sanctioned to probation through June 2019. As Phi Gamma Delta has completed the terms of the sanctions, the chapter is in good standing.

Thank you again for your cooperation with Kevin Araujo-Lipine, Dr. Robyn Adams, Matthew Garcia, and me through the investigation. We hope that the updating of your rosters and communication with inactive members, as well as implementing the risk management processes developed during the term of the probation will contribute to the success of Phi Gamma Delta at San Diego State University.

While on Interim Suspension, the chapter is expected to cease all activities. No chapter members may host or participate in any chapter-related function, regardless of location. The chapter may coordinate meetings, with prior permission from the Office of Student Life & Leadership, to communicate information with members. The requests must be made two weeks in advance and have a member of the Theta Chi International Headquarters staff or Student Life & Leadership staff present for the entirety of the convening.

Given the concerns for the fratermity. Theta Chi may host no new member education, new member activities, or initiation events, on or off campus. During the course of the Interim Suspension, the San Diego State University chapter may have no communication with new members. Communication from Theta Chi may only be sent to new members by the Theta Chi International Headquarters staff. Additionally, no other student or organization, including but not limited to the Interfratermity Council and College Panhellenic Association, may communicate with new members on Theta Chi's behalf. No member of Theta Chi who serves on the Interfraternity Council executive board may act on behalf of Theta Chi or use their position to influence the investigation.

- · An overview of the new member process, beginning with recruitment through the time of initiation
- The names and roles of active members who are or were involved in the new member education process during the Fall 2018, Spring 2019, and Fall 2019 terms
- The dates, times, and locations of every meeting/event/convening, both formal and informal, with new members (Fall 2018, Spring 2019, Fall 2019) both before and after initiation
- . The dates, times, and locations of installation and mitiation events for the Fall 2018 and Spring 2019.
- · A roster with two added columns that denotes the big brother and little brother of all members
- Screenshots of all electronic communication in the form of group messages for each of the new member classes (Fall 2018, Spring 2019, and Fall 2019), including, but not limited to, emails, GroupMe messages, group texts/chats, etc.

SIGMA PHI OMEGA SORORITY: NOTICE OF INTERIM SUSPENSION

The University is investigating recent reports of:

Allegations of Alcohol, Dishonesty, Hazing, and Healthy and Safety policy violations of the Student Organization Code of Conduct within Sigma Phi Omega Sorority at San Diego State University.

It has been reported that Sigma Phi Omega has participated in behavior necessitating the University to take immediate action for the safety of members and the campus community. Reportedly, Sigma Phi Omega hosted a social event with an unrecognized fraternity where a new member consumed alcohol and was later transported.

Given the seriousness of the matter, I am placing Sigma Phi Omega on immediate interim suspension pending the outcome of a University investigation. Once information is available from this investigation, the Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership will make a recommendation to me regarding the continued campus recognition status for Sigma Phi Omega. The interim suspension is in effect immediately with an outcome or update of the investigation to be given on or around Friday, December 6, 2019.

While on Interim Suspension, the chapter is expected to cease all intake/new member activities, social activities, and any other activity with alcohol, including events between active members and alumnae where alumnae are consuming alcohol. The chapter may participate in alcohol and other drug-free events that are chapter management, wellness, sisterhood, philanthropic, and leadership in nature. During the term of the Interim Suspension, the chapter must cease communication with potential new members/interests.

During the interim suspension, all chapter-related activities must be completely alcohol and drug free. Any violation will result in more severe sanctions. No chapter members may host or participate in any chapter-related function where alcoholic beverages are present, regardless of location.

All members of Sigma Phi Omega will be expected to fully cooperate with the investigation and review process. Be advised that providing false or misleading information, concealing information, instructing others to provide false information or conceal information, attempting to obstruct the investigation, or attempting to threaten or intimidate



witnesses or others involved in the investigation will result in judicial referral of all students involved and possible sanctions on the organization.

Thank you for meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life on March 6, 2017. In the Informal Conference, allegations of policy violations were discussed. Specifically, the group discussed initial reports of events that occurred in September, October and Docember of 2016, which resulted in alleged violations of the Alcohol at Off-Campus Events, Hazing and Harassment and Abusive Behavior policies. The group also discussed Hazing and Alcohol at Off-Campus Events allegations that were reported during the investigation and allegedly occurred over time and in March 2017 (respectively). The March 2017 Alcohol at Events Off-Campus policy violation would also be an allegation of the Failure to Comply policy, as the action may have been in violation of the Interim Suspension. The group also discussed an overview of the investigation, including interviews, reports and other documentation.

During the conversation, President and Advisor and Advisor represented the fratermty and President for Indicial Affairs for present on behalf of IFC. Below is the account, by allegation, of the informal conference.

#### Hazing Allegations

The group discussed the initial hazing allegations that occurred in September 2016. It was reported that a new member, who had been a potential new member of an expanding fraternity, informed the professional surff consultant that he was required to complete exercises early in the morning at the Phi Gamma Delta chapter facility the week after bid day. This information was later reported to the University and the Phi Gamma Delta international headquarters.

The group also discussed allegations that were reported to the University during the course of the investigation. Specifically, it was reported that there is engoing hazing within Phi Gamma Delta, including an I-Week where new members are expected to live in one room in the chapter house with a chacken, as well as meal plan requirements (deprovation, requirement to use on actives), being compelled to drink alcohol and participation in sensory nimulating activities. It was also reported that the new members were dropped off at an undisclosed location and were required as find their way back to the chapter facility, in the dark, with no cell phones:

When discussing these allegations, President and and denied the hazing behaviors were occurring in the chapter. The group discussed the interviews conducted with members, which also denied the behaviors and described the new member process. The group then discussed an overview of the new member process, which includes an 8-week

enhantional process designed by the International Headquartors, meetings at the house, and the time commitment equivalent of a 1-unit class.

## Alcohol at Events Off-Campus Allegations

The group discussed reports of an event that allegedly occurred at the chapter facility on October 15, 2016. In the reports from the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities, two transports had allegedly occurred as a result of a social event. The group discussed the transports, one related to level of intoxication and one due to injury. Both individuals who were interviewed by the Center for Student Rights & Responsibilities named "FLII" as the organization bosting the event. One outlined that they were underage, that there were no ID cheeks, no wristbands, that mixed drinks were out on a table and that shots were also available. The individual also reported that they were given a yellow pill at the party. The other individual who was interviewed described FIII as a "less sketchy frat" and that they brought their own alcohol because FIII is known for not providing a tet. President and the described that the fratornity did not bost any social event that night or during that weekend.

December 3, 2016 was the reported date of the following Alcohol at Events Off Campus policy violation. During the Informal Conference and investigation. President and and described that the incident as being a result of an informal "Open House Policy," where any member can come back to the house at any time, and that guests are permitted to come with them. During the incident on December 3, 2016, members and their dates returned from sprority formula and came over to the house. It was reported that no alcohol was present at the house. Lastly, on March 6, 2017 it was reported that the fraternity hosted a social event on March 4, 2017. Reportedly, there was a "cuffs" event that occurred that weekend and photo documentation of was sent to Assistant Director Montero-Adams. The photo documentation shows the members listed handcuffed to dates and alcohol in the photos and references to a "cuffs" theme in Instagram captions. When discussed during the informal conference, President and and denied any knowledge of the event, stated that it was not hosted in the chapter house and that they had not seen the posts on social media. The group discussed that organization events are not location-bound and events can be organizationally-related and bound to policy despite location or if they are "chapter sanctioned." During the course of the investigation and during the Informal Conference, President was transparent in that he recognizes the fraternity's policy related to dry housing. However, to engage older members, the fraternity described that they allow those who are 21 years old to have one 6-pack of beer in the ejupter facility. Additionally, the "Open House" policy was reiterated throughout the investigation and during the Informal Conference. Harassment and Abusive Behavior Allegations A sexual assault reportedly occurred during the December 3, 2016 event. During the Informal Conference, Assistant Director Montero-Adams outlined that the report was made to Fraternity & Society Life from a campus partner and was

referred to the Deputy Title LX Coordinator. Lescribed, in a meeting immediately following the incident, during



a later interview and 40 the Informal Conference, that the inculent was reported to but that night, he spoke with survivor at their request the next day and the alleged member was expelled from the Iratemity on December 4, 2016.

The group discussed the Greek Life Reporting Protocol, the responsibility to report incidents and how to report assaults confidentially as chapters do not have a mandatory reporting responsibility. The group also discussed the nature and differences of individual and organizational responsibility.

#### Decision

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports, investigative interviews and discussion during the informal conference. I have found Phi Gamma Delia to be in violation of the Alcohol at Off-Campus Events and Failure to Comply policies.

#### (4-22) Alcohol at Off-Campus Events

- 1. Organizations are expected to be familiar with and comply with State of California laws regulating the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages.
- 2 Unless held at a licensed establishment with professional barrenders, hard liquor (alcoholic beverages other than beer or wine) shall not be consumed at organization events.
  - 3. Open parties, meaning those with unrestricted access by non-members without specific invitation, where alreholic beverages are present are forbidden.
  - 6. No organization shall permit any person who is under the age of 21 or who is obviously intoxicated to consume alcoholic beverages at organization functions.
  - 16 At "BYOB" functions, individuals 2! years of age or older may bring not more than a six-pack of !2 ounce beers two individuals arriving together may bring a twelve-pack) or a four-pack of !2 ounce wine coolers).

### (10-4) 16. Failure to Comply

Failure to comply with directions or interference with any University official or any public safety officer while acting in the performance of his/her duties.

As a result of Alcohol at Off Campus Events and Failure to Comply policy violations, Phi Gamma Delta is sanctioned to Probation effective immediately and ending on June 1, 2018. Any further violations of University policy during the term of the Probation may result in an immediate Interim Suspension of the fraternity. In addition to Probation, Phi Gamma Delta must complete the following stipulations:

#### Chapter Education

Educational Workshops. Phi Gramma Delta is expected to host ongoing educational workshops for members of the chapter. Specifically, the following workshops are stipulated for the term of the Probation and must have 90% chapter participation.

· Semesterly: Alenhol and Other Drugs

- · Fall 2017: Hazing
- Spring 2018, Post-Probation Risk Managament

Fraternity & Sorority Life can advise on presenters and workshop development. It is expected that the chapter leadership will schedule a meeting with Caryl Montero-Adams to review and advise on the workshops and identify presenters. Documentation of workshop completion must be sent to Fraternity & Sorority Life staff within 24 hours of the workshops. Documentation should be in Google Slides format and include photos, presenter information, a list of participants (last name, first name, Red ID), the strengths of the workshops and the opportunities for growth.

Risk Management Plan Development Workshop. Plu Gamma Delta's executive board and at least one alumni advisor will work with Caryl Montern-Adams to facilitate a workshop that helps the executive board forecast risk in events and identifies best practices for risk management. Additionally, the board will develop a risk management plan, with the potential of being modified to meet the needs for future events. The workshop must occur during Stammer 2017 or the Pall 2017 semester with at least two weeks notice and before any events are approved.

Pre-Recruitment Meeting. The chapter must host a pre-recruitment meeting with the executive board, 90% of membership and alumn) advisor(s) prior to any recruitment activities each semester. This meeting will establish the process and expectations around recruiting new members and how new members are engaged during their first semester. Hazing, alcohol and other thugs must be discussed during the meeting to mitigate the risk of those behaviors. A member of the Fraternity & Sorority Life staff team must also be present.

#### Events and Activities

Event Proposals and Risk Management Plans, During the term of the Probation, the German Delta must submit a proposal with detailed risk management plans for all events hosted or co-hosted by the chapter to Fraternity & Scrority Life. Despite location, the events must follow the University's three-week event approval process and risk management plans must be submitted for all events.

Advisor Presence. During the term of the Probation, an advisor is expected to be present during the duration of all chapter events/meetings.

Events with Alcohol. During the term of the Probation, Phi Gamma Delta may host up to two events with nicohol. Specifically, the chapter can host one event with alcohol per semester during the 2017-18 nondemic year, which must be on-earnpus and follow all University and fraternity policies. Outside of the events with alcohol, the chapter may host dry socials that follow the event approval process outlined above.

#### Disclosure

Disclosure. It is expected that all members, new members and potential new members are made aware of the Probation and all stipulations. It is vital to the sustainability of the chapter that the entire membership understands the outcome of the investigation and expectations of members in this process.



To ensure that potential new members are aware of the chapter's states, it is an expectation that an amountement is made at each Phi Gamma Delta recruitment event by alumni advisor(s) during the Fall 2017 and Spring 2018 sumesters

Failure to complete these sauctions may result in the interim suspension of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity.

At this time, there is not a preponderance of the evidence to find the fraternity responsible for the Hazing policy violations. Please he advised that although the fraternity was not found responsible for the University's Hazing policy, we take reports very seriously. We advise that the fraternity assesses all recruitment, new member and initiation practices. Furthermore, if during the chapter's assessment unveils behaviors that could constitute hazing, the fraternity must after those behaviors to align with the safety and welfare of members. University policy, fraternity policy and the law. We encourage the chapter to consult with the Phi Gamuna Delta International Headquarters to support this undeavor:

Lastly, it is recognized that the timeline for the interim suspension, informal conference and decision were delayed. During the course of the interim suspension, there were two additional reports that prolonged the investigation and anticipated length for the interim Suspension. Please be advised that this was unforced and that the University appreciates the Executive Board's compliance.

Thank you again for taking the time to meet with Caryl Moutero-Adams in the informal conference. We hope that the outcome of the incidents and the imposed sunctions will contribute to the success of Phi Gamma Delta at San Diego State University.

I am hopeful that with the new leadership and the time provided in this amended probation this chapter will not only be in strong accordance with university policy but also strive for a new level of excellence.

Thank you again for taking the time to review our appeal process. We hope that the outcome of the appeal and our proposed sanctions will sid in the success of both Phi Gamma Delta and San Diugo State University.

Thank you for meeting with me on Friday. May 26, 2017 regarding the appeal of your fratemity judicial decision. I began the meeting by going over the purpose of our meeting. Specifically, I explained to you that this is an ad hot appeal process, and that my function is to provide an objective review of the decision previously made.

My responsibility is to evaluate whether there are reasonable grounds for the decision/sanction. I can then sustain, modify in some specified way, or revoke the decision. It is not the function of this process to conduct a full heming of all of the evidence.

During this meeting, you did not submit any documents.

#### Summary

In an oral presentation, you and your advisor, \*\*\* summarized the rationale for the appeal.

The most pertinent points provided in your presentation were:

- Concerns regarding judicial meetings and decisions. Specifically:
  - a. Due process not being followed; Pictures were received the day of the informal conference regarding the "cuffs" event
  - There was not sufficient opportunity and therefore information was not received by the University prior to judicial decisions being made; not all parties were met with during the investigation

- Events occurred at an off campus locations; not at the fraternity house
- The organization has engaged in and begun taking steps to better the fratemity including increased community service hours; summer preparation; adapting new member process; having the housing corporation and alumni be more present; and the creation of a development plan. Each of these quasures in turn should shorten the length of the probationary status of the organization.

As part of this process, I have also had the opportunity to review the following documents provided to me:

Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity Decision Letter: April 12, 2017

Phi Gamma Delta Appeal Letter; undated

After reviewing the collective information I conclude the following:

Due process appears to have been granted to the organization in the investigative process. The concern was that a new allegation was introduced, with short notice, prior to the informal conference. Being that collective alcohol and hazing reports were being discussed, and the new reports were in line with the purpose of the informal conference, and the organization accepted the opportunity to discuss the new report as part of the informal conference, I do not believe the fraternity's due process rights were violated.

In regards to sufficient information not being received by Student Life & Leadership staff in order to make an appropriate decision, we discussed during the appeal meeting your concerns regarding members not having the opportunity to share their side of the story however, information received, shows that students had multiple opportunities to meet with the Student Life & Leadership staff and some did not respond to the opportunities/requests.

The event that occurred at an off campus location, has numerous pictures showing Phi Gamma Delta members involved and participating in the "cuffs" event. One member was identified as an Officer of the organization, which was disputed. However, the Registered Student Organization database listed that particular individual as an Officer. During the appeal meeting, we discussed the nature of that individual's role, which was "Member Educator", and though not an official Executive Officer of the organizations, it was noted, by you, that the role was one of the most important and highest positions within the organization. You stated that this role is responsible for new member education and the person who holds the role needs to have the following qualities: strong leadership skills; solid ethics; and be a good communicator. It was noted that this individual is "not chosen lightly, they are responsible for the building of the chapter members."

Taking into account this collective information, I conclude there are reasonable grounds for the original judicial disposition and sanctions. I believe that the aforementioned information shows that organizational policies were violated and that the sanctions and stipulations in the original decision are appropriate.

I am grateful and appreciative for the self initiated steps being taken to increase member and organization accountability, build a stronger brotherhood, provide better education and training, and increase the amount of community service that each member will be participating in as a part of Phi Gamma Delta. I believe that the strength of your organizations will be realized through the ongoing and collaborative relationship between Phi Gamma Delta and the Office of Student Life & Leadership.

As a result of the nearing conducted by the Board of Conduct (BOC) on Wednesday. August 2, 2617, the Sigma Dalte Chapter was found guilty of violating the Fratemin's Risk Management Policy, specifically Subsection Alcohol & Drugs = 1, 3 & 4 and the Fratemity's Bylaws, specifically Section 19,500 - Alachol-Free Housing.

After a review of the presentation during the hearing, and all of the documentation and evidence submitted to the BOC, the BOC decided to impose the following sanctions.

I The Chapter is assessed a First Strike, which includes a one-year probationary period. A subsequent violation of the Risk Management Policy or Fraternity Laws during the probationary period may result in a complaint being filed against the Chapter, leading to a hearing before the Archons with suspension of the Chapter's charter as a possible outcome. The First Strike will expire on August 3, 2018. Abide by San Diego State University's sanctions.

During the week of April 12, 2019 memoers of thi Gamma Delta Fraterity met with Kevin Aratio-Lipine. Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Student Organizations & Activities to discuss allegations of policy violations within this Gamma Delta is attributed in Standard Control of Student Phi Gamma Delta footed multiple social events in a satellite house where distribution of alcoholic beverages to underage individuals occurred. The satellite house was left in an university condition for the residents, as well as concern for the safety and well-being to members of the university community and to property off campus. In addition, there is a report of underage drinking at the Phi Gamma Delta house on March 21, 2019, leading to a medical transport to the biopital.

After several investigative meetings, it was determined that the allegations of multiple social events in a smellite house appear to be the actions of individuals that are no longer active members of Phi Gamma Delta Fratemity. Additionally, there is not clear evidence that the underage drinking that resulted in a medical transport occurred as a result of alcohol consumption at the Phi Gamma Delta house on March 21, 2019. No harm to individuals or property was identified to active Phi Gamma Delta members through the investigative process.

Through the investigative process it became clear that there are content students on the Phi Gamma Delia Fraterinty roater that are listed as "Graduate" status, but these students have not completed their studies. San Diego State University identifies students that were members of fraternal organizations, but are not currently active and have not graduated yet as "mactive" "Graduate" or "Alumni" status should not be used until the member has completed their academic program. Additionally, it is recommended that there are conversations with students transitioning to "inactive" status to discuss their behavior and actions, as they can be viewed as part of the fraternity. This can have potential negative impact on the image of the fraternity. It should be noted that any undergraduate member who is current with their membership dues analog is on the active national roster is considered an active member.

Phi Gamma Delta Fratermy will need to review and update their roster using the status guidelines shared. Updated rosters should be shared with the Phi Gamma Delta National Office. Sap Diego State University Fraternity & Somethy Life, and uploaded to the Registered Student Organization (RSO) application system.

As the initial investigation was concluding, the Office of Student Life & Leadership received a report of lewd and obscene behavior being directed at members of the campus community who were participating in a conference at the mighboring Pride Center on April 27, 2019. Phi Gamma Delta was able to provide documentation that demonstrated the individuals who participated in lewd acts were in the process of being expetted from the fraternity. Documentation from the fraternity demonstrates that the mactive members were at the house to meet with the executive board to discuss their behavior related to the prior incident report that hunched the initial investigation. Following conversations with members of the

executive board, the individuals were left briefly so that the board could discuss their membership status. When they were unattended, the individuals went on the roof and loudly made obsecne noises toward the Pride Conten. The membership of the individuals was terminated by the national fraternity.

Based on the information gathered during the investigation, including reports and investigative interviews. I have found that there is not enough evidence at this time to charge the fraternity with violations of the Student Organization Code of Conduct. The InterIm suspension is lifted immediately. Should additional information be presented, the allegations may be further reviewed and violations could be found.

Additionally. Phi Gamma Delta was previously sanctioned to probation through June 2019. As Phi Gamma Delta has completed the terms of the sanctions, the chapter is in good standing.

Thank you again for your cooperation with Kevin Araujo-Lipine. Dr. Robyn Adams, Matthew Garcia, and me through the investigation. We hope that the updating of your rosters and communication with macrive members, as well as implementing the risk management processes developed during the term of the probation will contribute to the success of Ph. Gamma Delta at San Diego State University.

also be more than willing to assist in having a call or video conference.



I wanted to provide you with a summary of a meeting I had today with a student transported after attending a party at the FLH house on October 15th, 2016.

The student is the student whose commates in Tacuba called the RAx because they were concerned, and the mominales told paramedies she took a yellow pill at PLJT.

Bayleally, went to the party and mixed drinks that were fruity were available on a table. She cannot remember if the table was inside or outside, but does remember that people were inside and outside, and inside was dark with tons of neon strobe lights. She is 19 years old, but nobody from the fraternity checked IDs at any point, there were no wristbands issued, and she does not remember there being anyone stationed at the table with the drinks. She willingly had a few of the mixed drinks, and later she believes she may have taken shots (the police and REO IR included that her friend said also had 4-5 shots) but does not specifically remember taking shots. She also remembers that a female gave her a pill, and she told the nurses at Alvarido that she was given a pill and they did a drug test but did not find anything. She does remember that at some point in the evening a male student, who she believed to be part of PLH, was holding a trashcan in from of her to throw up in. She also stated that several males at the house wanted her to stay at their place overnight, but wanted to go back to her residence hall because the did not feel well.

also shared with me that later in the week she overheard a girl in one of her classes, she is unsure of the name, talking about how she was transported that same evening after being at FLM, and that classmate said that when she was being transported she was fir aking out and trying to right the paramedics. I am currently trying to do some follow-up to determine who that student is and who is meeting with low. However, while trying to track that student down, I did read the IR for a different student who did not show up for her meeting with me that was scheduled for Monday 10/31. The REO IR states that had been drinking at Pall on October 15th, but what is really interesting is that the IR reports that while was walking home to University Towers, she was attacked by a homeless man (this is what the RAs who responded stated). had blood on her and a fractured rib cage that she had previously fractured. The report said she was walking from Tenocha to UT, but at some point had been at FIJI drinking. because I am worried her NTA was sent to apant, but I really need to meet with So I am going to send an email to her, particularly to check in on her.

So at this point, I am wondering if there were three separate transports related to drinking at FLH consume, the student that the mentioned, and possibly who was transported more for her injury than intoxication, but still mentioned FLH I will update you as I learn more about the situation.

The University is investigating recent reports of

Allegations of Alcohol, Illegal Oruga, Harassment and Abusive Behavior and Hazing policy violations within Phi Gamma Delta Fraterolty at San Diego State University.

It has been reported that Phi Gamma Delta has participated in behavior necessiming the University to take immediate action for the safety of members and the campus community. Reportedly, Phi Gamma Delta hosted a social event on October 15/16, 2016 in the enapter facility where mixed drinks with hard liquor were served. Additionally, three students who were transported to the hospital due to their level of intoxication identified that they had consumed alcohol (and one, other drugs) at Phi Gamma Delta's chapter famility that evening. It was also reported the Phi Gamma Delta hosted a social event on December 3/4, 2016, which was the location of a reported sexual assault.

In addition to the open social events occurring on October 15/16, 2016 and December 3/4, 2016 an allegation of having behavior was made to Student Life & Leadership at SDSU and discussed with Phi Games Delta headquarters.

Given the scriousness of the matter, I am placing Phi Gamma Dolta on immediate interim suspension pending the outcome of a University investigation. Once information is available from this investigation, the Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Sorority Life will make a recommendation to me regarding the continued campus recognition status for Phi Gamma Delta. The interim suspension is in effect immediately with an outcome or update of the investigation to be given on or around Friday, January 20, 2017.

While on interm suspension, all University and Imerfraternity Council privileges are suspended, and the chapter is expected to cease all activities, including chapter meetings. All University, IFC or Phi Gamma Delta activities, meetings and events that members would like to host or attend as a fraternity must have an advisor present and be approved 48-hours in advance by Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Soronty Life. These activities include but are not limited to educational, service and social endeavors. The proposal for the activities must be submitted no later than one week prior to the date. For fraternity-planned events, the proposal should tember an Event Approval System application submitted at least three weeks in advance per University policy.



During the interim asspension, all approved, chapter-related activities must be completely alcohol and drug free. Any violation will result in more severe sanctions. No chapter members may host or parterpate in any chapter-related function where alcoholic beverages are present, regardless of location.

All members of Phi Gamma Delta will be expected to fully cooperate with the investigation and review process. Be advised that providing false or misleading information, concealing information, instructing others to provide false information or conceal information, attempting to obstruct the investigation, or attempting to threaten or intimidate witnesses or others involved in the investigation will result in judicial referral of all andents involved and possible sanctions on the organization.





All University, IFC or Phi Gamma Delta activities, meetings and events that members would like to host or attend as a fraternity must have an advisor present and be approved 48-hours in advance by Caryl Montero-Adams, Assistant Director of Student Life & Leadership for Fraternity & Soronty Life. These activities include but are not limited to educational, service and social endeavors. The proposal for the activities must be submitted no later than one week prior to the date. For fraternity-planned events, the proposal should tember an Event Approval System application submitted at least three weeks in advance per University policy.



During the interim asspension, all approved, chapter-related activities must be completely alcohol and drug free. Any violation will result in more severe sanctions. No chapter members may host or parterpate in any chapter-related function where alcoholic beverages are present, regardless of location.

All members of Phi Gamma Delta will be expected to fully cooperate with the investigation and review process. Be advised that providing false or misleading information, concealing information, instructing others to provide false information or conceal information, attempting to obstruct the investigation, or attempting to threaten or intimidate witnesses or others involved in the investigation will result in judicial referral of all andents involved and possible sanctions on the organization.




